ANGUS CHARITY (19) goalkeeper, joined the club in 1981. Formerly with Brechin City F.C. Current Midlands A.F.A. Select 'keeper.

BRIAN SMITH (18) goalkeeper. In first season with club whom he joined from Celtic Boys Club. Regular in Fife XI this season. Plays centre forward in Sunday League football!

JOHN SQUIRE (25) full back, signed during the season from Invergowrie F.C. Previously played in Angus A.F.A.

MARK RITCHIE (29) central defender or full back. Took over as club's player manager at Christmas. Won North of Tay Cup Medal with Hillside B.C. in 1971.

NEIL DOWNIE (20) full back. Youngest of three Downie brothers with the club. Established himself in 1st XI this season. Won an Alliance Cup Winners Medal with Tayport in 1979 when only 15.

GRAHAM McPHERSON (23) consistent central defender who was cornerstone of Duncraig F.C.'s Famous Grouse Scottish Sunday Cup triumph last season. Joined Tayport in 1981.

ALAN HART (27) "Auld Harty" to his team-mates, plays in defence or midfield. A consistent performer since he joined Tayport in 1978 from Osborne J.F.C.

COLIN GRAY (21) full back. Joined in 1979, steady player whose "man mountain" nickname belies his slight frame.

DAVIE BLAIR (25) central defender who has figured prominently in all three Tayport teams this season. Having a fine season.

ROBERT DOWNIE (28) All the years of hellraising taking their toll. Can only manage three games per week now! Fife XI skipper. Made his debut in 1979 but has yet to score.

RONNIE STEWART (27) full back with the all-year-round suntan. On the P.E. staff at Harris Academy. Lives in Wormit but we don't hold that against him!

COLIN ROBERTSON (21) full back or midfield. Signed at the start of the season from Osborne J.F.C. Never happy unless he's complaining.

OUR VISITORS

A.C. OUGREE (Belgium) — This will be A.C. Ougree's second visit to Tayport, having also taken part in last year's competition. Ougree is an industrial suburb of Liege and the Club's ground is situated overlooking giant steel mills, only a few kilometres from the stadium of Standard Liege.

A.C. Ougree's fortunes have been mixed in recent seasons but they will be hoping to improve on last year's fourth position.

Sponsorship is very much the name of the game in Belgian football, even at amateur level and Ougree's strips and their ground provide the evidence that their club has no shortage of sponsors.

Club Colours — red and black.

ROANA VICENZA (Italy) — Very much an unknown quantity, Roana are making their first trip to the United Kingdom and their party of 20 is staying in Scotland for some three weeks.

The town of Roana is a picturesque tourist centre situated near Vicenza, north west of Venice in the foothills of the Alps. Tayport were invited to play in Roana this August but the timing was unfortunate and they had to decline.

Tayport have played against Roana in Belgium twice and have yet to lose.

Club Colours — green and white.

AUCHTERMUCHTY BELLVUE — Muchty need no introduction. They have just completed their best season in the East Fife Amateurs and will have their sights set on the T.S.B. Trophy.

Muchty received their first taste of football abroad when they took part in Ougree's tournament in April, finishing a creditable fourth.

Bellvue are sure to bring a good support to Tayport as their travelling support throughout the season has been the best of any amateur club in Fife.

Tayport and Muchty met in a local cup tie at Auchtermuchty a few weeks ago and Tayport's 4-1 win was the home side's biggest reverse of the season at that time.

"CRÈME DE LA CRÈME!"

For many years two amateur football associations have been to the fore in Fife, the East Fife Amateur F.A. and the Kirkcaldy & District F.A. but, from next season, a third association is set to dominate the county game at amateur level.

The new association, the Kingdom Caledonian League, will be composed of the top sides from this season's East Fife and Kirkcaldy A.F.A.'s. Although the playing record of the twelve clubs was taken into consideration when the invitations were issued, so too was the club's organisation and facilities.

The new league will get underway with a cup competition in August, played, probably, on a sectional basis.

The twelve clubs are:—Aberdour Amateurs, Auchtermuchty Bellvue, Balingry Rovers, Burntisland United, Cowdenbeath Amateurs, Norton House (Leven), Star Hearts, Woodside Athletic (Glenrothes) or Lomond Vics (Falkland), Strathmiglo United, Tayport Amateurs, Victoria Rovers (Kirkcaldy), Windygates.

Eight of these clubs played this season in the Kirkcaldy A.F.A. (Strathmiglo United—Champions) while the remainder were in the East Fife A.F.A. (Norton House—Champions). Tayport, of course, also have two sides playing in the Midlands A.F.A.

The Kingdom Caledonian League which has been sponsored by Tennent Caledonian Brewers kicks off on Saturday, 18th August.
