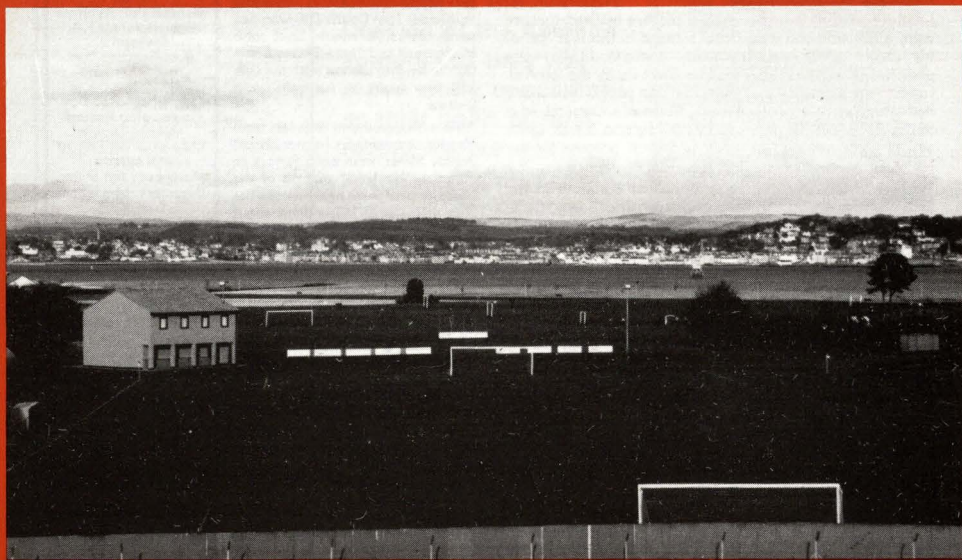

## "The Baker's Bit"

I would like to begin by welcoming our support and the players and officials of Muirkirk to the Canniepairt this afternoon. The past month has seen us play five games giving us two wins and three draws. The first two games were the Cup-ties v Larkhall. In the tie at home I felt that we played quite well considering that we had no match practice for three weeks prior to the tie and Larkhall were probably more than happy to take us back to their air midden to complete the job.

I had the feeling that the Larkhall players realised that we were a fair side and it certainly showed in the first half of the replay which we completely dominated. We were unlucky not to have had the game sawn up by the interval. I said to the players at that stage that one goal in the second half would do the trick and seal Larkhall's exit and so it transpired when 'Thomser' slotted his second. It was, as far as I'm concerned part of the 'growing up' process for our team. A tremendous result.

The good away form was continued at Bankfoot in the Zamoyiski. A very good team display with Christie and Reilly coming in. Both showed the attitude we're looking for as did every player that day.

Our next game was a friendly against Stenhousemuir at Ochview. We lost a bad goal with a minute to go to give then an unimpressive 2-2 draw. A couple of minutes prior to that a 'young trialist' substitute should have made it 3-1 to Tayport but hit the post. The management decided to give the lad another run and put him on for the last ten minutes at Arbroath Vics. in the league last Saturday. His headed goal one minute from time certainly impressed me!

I've yet to discuss the matter with Peter and Ronnie but if they know anything about the game they must agree with me that the lad has a great future with the club as long as they keep him and his zimmer well oiled!

The game against Vics. saw us give a very ordinary side two gift goals in a game which we totally dominated from start to finish. I know it's a well worn cliché in the game but if it was a boxing match it would have been stopped but I'm afraid that football doesn't work that way. The silky boxers in our game win very little, only the boxers with the 'killer punch' succeed in football. As far as I'm concerned in football the penalty box is the ring. That's the area where the damage is done. You've got to have players capable of finishing the job — the boxer with the killer punch. Let's hope that we see an early knockout today!

## TODAY'S VISITORS

Muirkirk have listed an 18 strong player pool whose ages range from right-winger Jim Stillie, signed from the local amateurs, at 17, to experienced midfielder Martin Craig at 38. Three players have senior experience. Defender John Hamilton (35), ex-Partick Thistle, striker Alan Henderson (21), a former Glasgow Rangers and Hamilton Accies player and midfielder Tom Coutts (28) who had seven years at senior level with Motherwell and Clyde. Bobby Stillie (32), in his first season with the club had two years in Australia with Crotica.

After a disappointing time last term Muirkirk appointed a former player, Jimmy Miller, from Kello Rovers as manager. No fewer than 13 of the Muirkirk pool were new faces to the club this year as Miller went about rebuilding the side.

Between the sticks today will be Peter McFarlane (24) signed last season and formerly with Blantyre Celtic and Hurlford. Paul Smith (23) a right back was signed last season from Maybole. Leftback Darren Robison (21) and Ian Murray (26) who plays in left-midfield were both recruited from the Amateur ranks.

Centre-half Matt Shirkie (25) is fancied by Stranraer for whom he has played several trials. Manager Miller brought with him from Kello Rovers, Charlie McKenzie a 19 year old midfielder and experienced sweeper David Wyllie (32) who was previously with Muirkirk when they had their best 'Scottish' run in 1981/82. Other recruits this season were Paul Slowey (21) left-winger or defender from Blantyre Vics., Joe Hay (20) a striker from Renfrew, other front men, Kenny McLeod (24) from Baillieston, Phil Connor (22) from Dalry Thistle and John McGuire (20) a right winger from Armadale.

### MUIRKIRK

Canniepairt regulars may well be wondering where exactly is Muirkirk. It's a village which lies high up the valley of the River Ayr at the foot of the Lowther Hills, some 26 miles east of Ayr and 13 miles west of the A74 — just a mile or so from Glenbuck of Cherry pickers and Bill Shankly fame! Muirkirk came to prominence during the Industrial Revolution with the discovery of coal and ironstone deposits in the area but these industries are now only a memory for the Muirkirk folk.

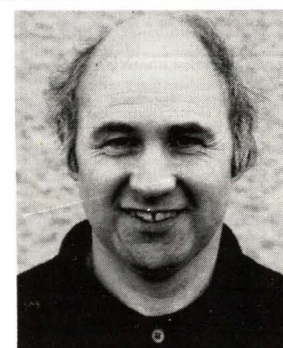
## Chairman's Comment

## O.V.D. SCOTTISH JUNIOR CUP 2nd ROUND

A keen tussle is anticipated when Muirkirk Juniors from the Ayrshire Juniors make their first visit to these parts. The Scottish Cup record of Ayrshire sides is second to none and the visitors will be hoping to enhance that reputation this afternoon.

Cup football, particularly that of the O.V.D. Scottish Junior variety, always captures the imagination as was evident in the last round when Tayport filled a supporters bus for the Larkhall replay and, hopefully the weather will allow for a healthy turnout today. Speaking of the weather the club are aware that the Canniepairt affords little in the way of protection from the elements and have their sights set on improving that situation.

Pick of the second round ties today is undoubtedly the clash of the Glasgow giants, Pollock and Petershill which should draw a crowd of well into four figures to Newlandsfield.

Local clubs have fared reasonably well in the draw and a good representation is anticipated in the third round draw. Holders, Hill O' Beath Hawthorn, have tricky opponents in their first game in defence of their title in the shape of the Central League's Benburb away from home.

## OVERSTEPPING THEIR AUTHORITY

During his interview, Mr Peterkin Chimbi, Chairman of the North Region Football Committee (Malawi), said: "We have banned Police Inspector F.W.D. Mainjeui from watching any game organised by us for 25 years, while his sub-ordinates, Constables Dzoole and Chimvula, have each been given a seven year ban.

"During the third round of the Kamuzu Cup, the Police found themselves 8-3 down while playing the Limbe Leaf Wanderers. Suddenly the Inspector and his Constables invaded the pitch and tried to arrest referee Stain Chilombo. Bur referee Chilombo was too quick for them. He vanished among the fans.

Not to be outdone, the Inspector had the Wanderers' striker, Emmanuel Kamanga, arrested for giving an obscene sign. The striker was taken away and tortured for six hours."

A spokesman for the North Region police denied that Emmanuel Kamanga had been tortured. "He was made to sing the Police Federation marching song and to serve tea to Chief Inspector Lilonge," he said.
