On behalf of the management I would again like to welcome our support and opponents to the Canniepairt. Today we entertain Blackburn United and like us they have reached this 4th round stage on merit. Their 3rd round success over Ayrshire's First Division League leaders Beith Juniors, was a tremendous achievement. So we are under no illusions as to what's required. Our attitude must match the way we performed against St. Andrews United in the last round.

I was very pleased to see an increased amount of the "Port crowd" at St. Andrews, I hope not only do the people of Tayport turn out and support us but also get behind the team vocally. From the players point, I know they would love to hear their home support cheering them on, so what about it "Let's hear you". In the first issue of the "Port Prog" I emphasised the need for "Discipline and Attitude" playing an important part in the make-up of a successful side. We also must have a healthy pool of players who want to play for and commit themselves to the club. Since the start of the season we have seen four players unable to show that required commitment. Three have now moved on to pastures new, the fourth, due to work commitments — "as Head Waiter in the Hotel Regency, Kuwait City". But with Ronnie and myself still able to pull on a jersey there was no need to rush out and sign players for the sake of it. I think our patience has paid off. With the signing of Ian Christie, Andy Sommerville and Jimmy Hunter, three very experienced Juniors. Also the signing of Gavin Howey who has played most of his football with Dundee F.C. and a spell on loan in Denmark. Given time to settle-in I am sure they will be a great asset to the club. As will a fifth signing, Davie Tosney who has agreed to join our coaching staff, mainly specialising on the goalkeeping side. Davie, like myself and Ronnie, will be keeping himself as fit as possible if the need to play arises. There are very few Junior clubs with this facility, I am sure it can only benefit Tayport F.C.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank and praise our committee for the hard work and support they have given us over the past six months the Juniors have been in existence. I would also like to thank all our sponsors for their moral and financial support. In return I can assure you we, the management, will give 100% commitment and I know the players realise the importance of today's game and will repay everyone involved with Tayport F.C. with a memorable victory this afternoon. If our attitude is on the ball I'm confident Tayport's name will be in the hat.

WITH THE AMATEURS

On the adjacent East Common pitch today the club's amateur side are playing a North of Tay cup replay against one of Perth's top sides, Fair City. The teams drew 4-4 last week and in a season which hasn't had too many highlights to date a win to take the team into the last sixteen would be welcome.

The bad weather has played havoc with the club's three amateur sides' fixtures and a hectic end to the season is guaranteed. During the past five and a half months the three teams have played 23 league games between them but in the next four months will have to squeeze in 53 league games plus cup-ties.

At the end of the season the club will be hosting a mini-tournament in which A. C. Ougree from Belgium will participate. Our Belgian guests will be with us from 31 May to June 4.

TODAY'S VISITORS

Blackburn United rose out of the ashes of Blackburn Juniors who were going under in 1984 when Blackburn Juniors took over to keep Junior football alive in the West Lothian town.

In that first season Blackburn went 19 games without defeat and were promoted to the East Region's 'A' Division as runners-up. Blackburn stayed up the next season but went down the following year, 1986/87.

Blackburn are normally in the promotion hunt but made a bad start this term. Their run in the Scottish however has breathed new life into the club and they have developed into formidable opponents under the shrewd management team of Jim Henderson, Colin Penman and Alex Dunnigan.

Several of the players in the squad have had senior experience. Longest serving player is keeper Paul Kerr, a very safe last line of defence, while the man Blackburn will be looking to for goals is top scorer Roddy MacDonald. MacDonald notched one of the goals which ended Beith's unbeaten run of eleven games, Steve Mahoney getting the other.

Chairman's Comment

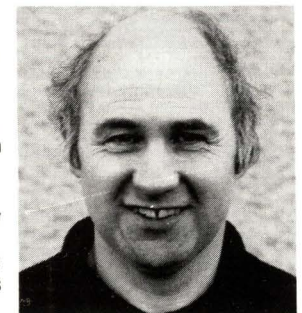

GARY RELEASED Tayport transferred Gary Christie to East Craigie recently. The midfielder or striker hadn't been getting a regular game and had requested a transfer.



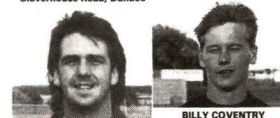

THE NEW SIGNINGS

Andy Sommerville: Still in his twenties, Andy joined the club in early January from Tayside Champions Downfield with whom he had played since moving from Arbroath Vics. During the last four seasons he picked up all the honours open to him, except a Currie Cup medal, including three championship medals. Was voted Man of the Match in last season's Zamoyksi Cup Final.

Jimmy Hunter: A veritable pocket battleship, midfielder Jimmy was signed from Downfield with whom he hadn't been seeing eye to eye for some time. Another who has made a clean sweep of the Tayside Juniors honours. Was previously with North End and Arbroath Vics.

Gavin Howey: Gavin joined the club in December but has had his appearances restricted by injury so far. The 20-year-old defender/midfielder was most recently with Brechin City although Tayport had been after him during the close season. Played in Denmark after a lengthy spell at Dens Park.

Ian Christie: A real character who has been in the Junior game for sixteen years but has not long passed the thirty mark. Has seen service with Blairgowrie, Lochee United, East Craigie and most recently, Violet. A regular in the Tayside Select team, Ian also featured in the Scottish Junior International squad. Has picked up all the honours in the Junior game except a Scottish Cup medal and he came close to that at Dens Park in 1979/80 when he was voted Man of the Match when Lochee lost 0-1 to Benburb in the semi final.

OVD SCOTTISH JUNIOR CUP

It has already been a cup of surprises with only two of the six Regional champions surviving at the 4th round stage. Petershill (Central), St. Andrews Utd. (Fife), Stonehaven (North) and Downfield (Tayside) have already bitten the dust. Whitburn (Lothian) meet Lesmahagow today in a repeat of last season's classic semi-final and Auchinleck Talbot are at home today to Neilston, conquerors of Downfield.

Holders Hill of Beath were surprisingly held at home by Maryhill from the Central Region Second Division and must be on a sticky wicket in today's third round replay.

Hill of Beath are the Fife Region's sole survivors and if they win will play Dundee North End in the fourth round. North End and Tayport are Tayside Region's sole survivors.

Teams from the North Region have perhaps surprised themselves with Hall Russell, Lossiemouth United, Stoneywood, Culter and Inverurie Loco all bidding for a place in the last sixteen.

If Tayport's win at St. Andrews and Blackburn's win over Beith caused a few raised eyebrows so too did Hall Russell's win at Rutherglen Glencairn. Lossiemouth's long trek to Wishaw was rewarded with a win but another trip south today to meet Arthurlie is unlikely to prove as fruitful.

An unusual incident happened during St. Johnstone's 2-1 home defeat against Motherwell in their midweek Premier Reserve game at McDiarmid Park.

After 37 minutes, linesman Alastair Burt (Auchtermuchty) raised his flag to indicate a goal kick — and the flag fell off the stick!

He had to make do until half-time when he was given a replacement flag by the other linesman, Peter Peace (West Calder).
