One goal ahead at halftime, Tayport netted through Sommerville & Devine. The records noted that 80% of the crowd of 50 were Tayport fans.

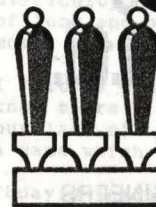

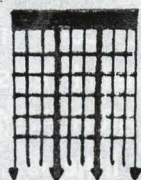

the following season's
membership card is printed
right).

Moray Firth witnessed nine -
fortunately five were for
Violet who won their OVD
Scottish Cuptie against
Bishopmill United by 5-4.

Although Bishopmill are from
Elgin, the tie was played a

the picturesque Forest Park,
ground of Burghead Thistle.

Violet must have had too
heavy a lunch because they
started badly to trail 0-3
at half time but got into
their stride in the 2nd. half
and goals from Brian Scrim-
geour(2), Ronnie Mitchell(2)
and an own goal put them
through to round 2.

lacked Feherty's eye for allegory, but was no less acerbic for all that. "What was it Mr McCulloch actually said to you?" a beak asked the referee who had shown the manager a red card for abuse.

"He said to me: 'You are a shiter and a shite-bag,'" replied the ref.

On other occasions, McCulloch has let his feet do the talking. In 1987, for instance, he kicked the Ayrshire Cup and caused £300 worth of damage just before it was due to be presented to Auchinleck, who had beaten Cumnock. For good measure, McCulloch had been sent off in the last minute.

WE remain in Ayrshire, if only to seek confirmation that there is a strange sub-species of humanity at work there. I quote one Stephen Wilkie, a player with Irvine Vics and, believe this or not, possessor of both a BA and a CA certificate, who says there is "an incredible number of thugs in the junior game".

Belligerence seems to permeate every level. The Auchinleck programme editor recently wrote that Cumnock's Rusty Harkness "must have asbestos lips to be able to kiss his jersey after scoring", a remark which brought a demand for an apology from Cumnock.

In their programme, Glenafton then quoted one of their own club officials, who sought to deny con-

stant rumours that they wanted to buy Cumnock's Fraser Campbell.

"There are hundreds of Campbells in New Cumnock, all better players than Fraser — even the women," said the official. Order please, gentlemen.

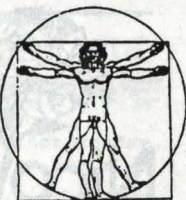

OVD SCOTTISH CUP REVIEW

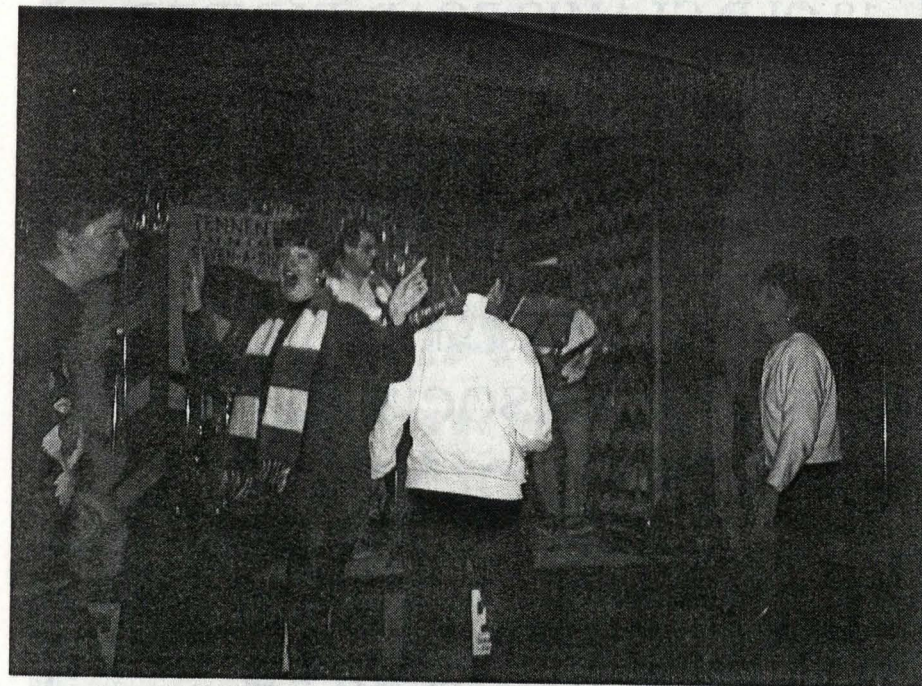

Kevin Lynch(right) has become the latest casualty and could be out for some time with a groin injury.

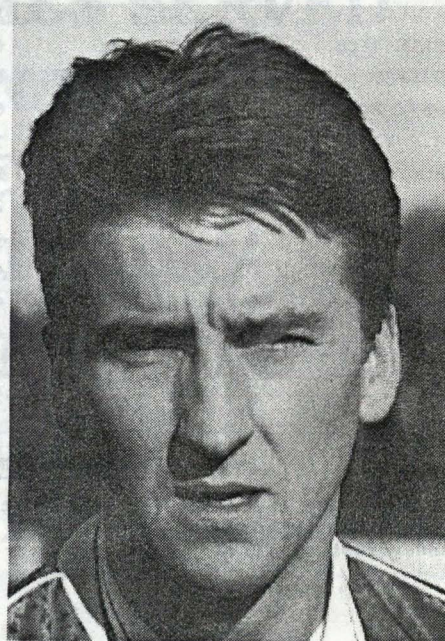
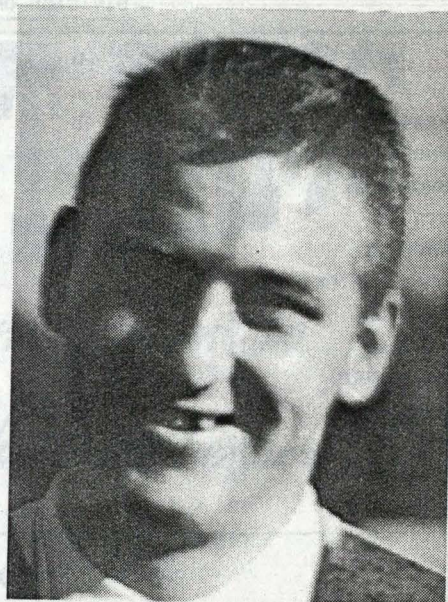
F.I.F.A. CALLED IN

The matter has dragged on now for some time and, with negotiations between the clubs seemingly getting nowhere, Tayport asked the S.F.A. to look into things on their behalf.

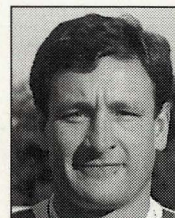

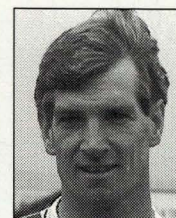

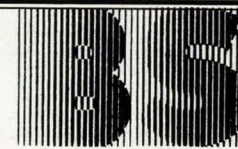
