


One goal ahead at halftime, Tayport netted through Sommerville & Devine. The records noted that 80% of the crowd of 50 were Tayport fans.





In 1987, for instance, he kicked the Ayrshire Cup and caused £300 worth of damage just before it was due to be presented to Auchinleck, who had beaten Cumnock. For good

measure, McCulloch had been sent

off in the last minute.

E remain in Ayrshire, if only to seek confirmation that there is a strange sub-species of humanity at work there. "There are hundreds of Campbells in New Cumnock, all better players than Fraser — even the women," said the official. Order please, gentlemen.




