



# "The Baker's Bit"

It's my pleasure to once again welcome the Port Support and of course the players and officials of our visitors to the Canniepairt this afternoon. Including our five pre-season frieldlies, today's match will be our 58th of the season. It's been a long, hard but enjoyable eleven months. I know that our players are feeling the effects. In fact we go into today's game seven players down. But I also know the great versatility and strength of character of our players. They have proved that over the past week. Last Saturday's 2-0 defeat of Forfar Albion was particularly pleasing considering that we had just completed a game which went to extra time and penalties only 16 hours earlier and was our fifth game in seven days.

The effects of all those games really showed in Monday night's 2-0 Whyte & Mackay semi final meeting at Downfield. Both sides struggled to find any kind of form. The reason, of course, is that the players are mentally and physically tired. We keep hearing the Senior ranks moaning about the amount of games that they are forced to play and that the paying public are the losers. Well our game is no different. We have paying public as well and they are also entitled to see quality football. And remember our players are also expected to work during the day. I'm not complaining about the success, but it is the top sides that are punished as the victims of their own success. The 400 or more fans deserved better on Monday night. The standard in the first 30 minutes was, to put it mildly, terrible. The passing and movement from both teams was shocking. The turning point thankfully, was Patty's goal. That gave us the wee lift that we needed and in the second half we produced a much better performance and deserved our cup final place for the third year in a row against Arbroath S.C. which took place on Wednesday past at North End Park and for the third year in a row (which could be a record) we defeated them, this time by 4-2.

I felt that the scoreline didn't reflect the difference between the sides. After recovering from going down to an early goal there was only one team in it. We o utplayed them for long spells in the game and with a bit of luck we could have doubled our score tally. I'm really happy for the players and our large support there on the night. The move for Davie Reilly's goal started in our own penalty area and finished in the back of their net. Great stuff!

I'm also particularly pleased for our two new signings, Grant Miller and Ewan Cameron. Both have come in, played a quarter, semi and cup final in the space of five days. They are a credit to themselves and I know that the Port Support have also taken to them.

I've always said that there is no one who is irreplaceable and it's a fact that the world keeps turning round. That's been the case this past month with the resignation of one of our coaching staff, Ronnie Robb. Another two RR's have appeared on the scene to boost our ranks in the form of Ryan and Rebecca —Dolan and Sommerville respectively. I'm also pleased to announce that Kevin Lynch has accepted the position of player/coach with the club. I'm sure that he will be a great asset to Tayport FC.

We know that today's Cream of the Barley semi final will once again be a stiff test for our players but we've overcome a lot of hurdles this season and for the most part of that time with a much reduced pool of players and against the odds we've succeeded. Even in our 58th game we're hungry for more. The prize is not only the victory today but a Cup Final place against Downfield at Thomson Park on Monday and the name of Tayport FC on the Cream of the Barley Trophy.

Finally I'd like to thank the Tayside Regional secretary John Myles and all the people in Tayside Junior Football for their support during our Scottish Cup campaign. I'm afraid that I've given John a few headaches over fixtures this season. I hope that you don't take this the wrong way but I sincerely hope that you have a migraine this time next season! Sorry, Jock - no rest for the wicked, eh! All the best.

# TODAY'S GAME

This afternoon's game is the last on the Canniepairt this season and we could have asked for few more attractive visitors than the rejuvenated St Josephs.

If Tayport in our march to the title and the OVD Scottish Cup Final have captured most of the headlines, then the Joeys are the undisputed runnersup in the media attention stakes. Peter Marr and David Young have raised the profile of St Josephs to unpredecented heights.

Pre-season and early season pronoun-cements were no idle boasts with the Fairfield Park chequebook never being allowed to gather dust. Steve O'Hanlon and Gus Malone were bought from Cowdenbeath in a record breaking double signing which had them talking all over the country. Phil Smith arrived from East Fife while Tony McAulay was signed for a substantial fee from Forfar Athletic.

Joeys have achieved their season's objective - promotion, a good run in the Scottish, a couple of Division Two cups and will be looking to add the Cream of the Barley Trophy to the silverware collection.

We, of course, will be doing our utmost to prevent any further Joeys progress in that particular competition and in so doing, reach our fourth final of the season.

St Josephs have had a good run in recent months, their 2-3 defeat by Downfield ending a run of something like 17 games undefeated.

To reach this stage of the Cream of the Barley, St Josephs accounted for Elmwood by 4-2 in the first round and had impressive 2nd and 3rd round wins at Arbroath SC and Carnoustie respectively. Tayport have crammed their Cream of the Barley run into nineteen days, winning 5-1 at Harp, 3-1 at Jeanfield and 2-0 v Forfar Albion down here last Saturday.

Big talking point in the win over Albion was the excellent performances of debutants Ewan Cameron and Grant Miller. Ewan was fixed up from Midlands Amateurs' side Birkhead and Grant from Midlands' Premier side Kingsway Athletic just prior to the game to supplement our injury ravaged squad. Dave Baikie swooped for the two players when it was learned that the quartet of Sommerville, Hunter, Lamont and Coventry were all likely to be out for the remainder of the season

As well as having former Canniepairt favourites Smith and Malone in their squad the Joeys - Tayport connection is extended further with Dave Tosney as coach. Dave was one of a management triumvirate at the start of the season with Mick McManus and Brian Kenyon but only Dave survives. With fellow coach John Weir, Dave looks after the playing side of things at Fairfield Park with Peter Marr.

There's another connection - not with the Tayport club because he's never been involved here - but ex-Tayport Thistle supremo, local milkman and ex-local fireman Cammy McBain is the Joey's physio.






