A warm welcome to the players, officials & supporters of Cumbernauld United. The New Town side were relegated last season and, in a bid to take an immediate step back upstairs, have brought in a number of new faces. Ex.E.Stirling keeper Stephen Connelly is one of the most recent arrivals, having been signed from Bellshill Athletic to replace regular Keeper Hinchcliffe who has just been transferred to Elgin City in the Highland League. A certain starter in defence will be ex Partick Rod Wyllie while the responsibility for keeping things tight at the back will fall to skipper Jim McGarrigle, signed back in 1984. The other long serving player in the squad is midfielder Martin Doogan, presently the team's top scorer. A key player in midfield will be Alan Gordon who was bought recently from Kilsyth Rangers. Other midfielders Ian Gilliespie and Billy Reid have had Senior experience with Albion and Dumbarton while strikers Colin Gray (Clydebank, St'muir & E.Stirling) and Mark Murphy (Blackpool) have also plied their trade at a higher grade. But for two recent surprise defeats, v.StAnthonys & v.Wishaw, Cumbernauld would have been riding high at the top of the division. A solitary win at home to St Rochs is all United could muster in October and Jim Moore will be asking his players to reproduce the kind of form displayed at Cumnock at the start of the month when the Ayrshire cracks scored a narrow 4 - 2 win in a West of Scotland cup tie.

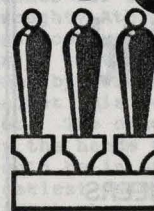

## TAYSIDE JUNIORS

The major talking point so far this season in the Tayside Juniors has been the disappointing start made by Downfield. Already the Spiders are ten points adrift of the league leaders and out of the Zamoyski Trophy. Downfield are too good a side to allow this situation to continue and a run in the OVD Cup could be just the thing to put a smile back on the faces of the Balgowan Avenue faithful.

The Zamoyski last Saturday gave St Joseph's their first opportunity to test themselves against Division One opponents. The new look Joeys passed that test but, with Craigie having their perennial battle against relegation, a stiffer test will be required before the strength of the Midmill side can be properly evaluated.

There is no doubt that the Joeys have ambition with the intention of supremos Peter Marr and Davie Young being to bring the OVD Cup to Dundee for the first time in 63 years.

Broughty Athletic ran Zamoyski finalists last season, Forfar WE, close and look well suited to be in the promotion frame come June. One surprise in the Zamoyski was the defeat of Arbroath SC, beaten 3-1 at home by Carnoustie. The Gowfers have been something of a surprise packet this season in Division One and look set to cause more upsets yet. The other surprise was at Bankfoot where Violet's hopes ended at the hands of the second division side. Further disappointments could be in store for the Pansies unless they can shore up one of the leakiest defences in the top division.

Harp took two vital points at Kirrie, winning 2-1, to move a couple of places up the table and leave their hosts entrenched at the bottom.

## TODAY'S FIRST ROUND OVD SCOTTISH CUPTIES

Fourteen Tayside League clubs are in OVD action this afternoon and for two of those clubs there is a certain 1st round exit, Lochee United and Scone Thistle and Broughty Athletic v Elmwood having been drawn together. Scone will fancy their chances at Thomson Park and in the all second division clash, Broughty should win through. Most illustrious visitors to the region are Fauldhouse who visit North End. Fauldhouse took 3 games to dispose of Harp in last season's 1st round before finally going out after a replay in round 4 to eventual winners Auchinleck.

Harp meet Dalkeith Thistle who were just pipped for a promotion place in the John Walker League by goal difference last season. Montrose meet Haddington from the same division and a third Lothians side travel north when Musselburgh visit Balbeggie.

St Joseph's should account for Troon from Ayreshire's Division 2 but East Craigie will have to find some of last season's Scottish Cup form if they are to do anything at Craigmark. Luncarty will have to look to defence in depth at Larkhall to avoid a rout while Downfield should win with a few goals to spare at home to Wishaw who play in the same division as Cumbernauld.

Only North Region side in these parts is Dyce who will do well to get a replay from their tie at Bankfoot.

## GROUND IMPROVEMENTS

Canniepairt regulars will have noticed the lack of action in the construction of the new refreshment / toilet block. It is hoped to re-commence work here soon.

Construction of a terracing on the south side of the ground has begun. This is the first phase in the programme to redevelop the spectator accommodation at that side of the ground.

## City of Discovery

So you thought there was only one team in Dundee? In a shock revelation, Gordon Smith provides evidence of there being more to football in the Jute City than Lochee Harp and casts a mournful eye over the state of Tayside Junior Football

*"Bent double like beggars under sacks, knock-kneed, coughing like hags we cursed through sludge". No, as Willfrid Owen so acutely observed a journey to a junior football match in mid-winter cannot be described as fun. Two dismal hours standing in a damp field in Dundee watching the efforts of 22 graceless hulks do battle on a pitch which must surely double as a venue for stock car racing is not nirvana for the average football fan. Still, every down has its up.*

The up on this occasion was the glamour that is the Scottish Junior Cup which offered an opportunity for a bit of good old-fashioned east-west coast rivalry to be stirred up and, conversely a chance to see if the junior game is in the same decline as the seniors. Whatever the reason, Dundee Elmwood v St Anthony's 2nd round 2nd replay at Midmill Park was the place to be. Midmill, home of another great city side, St Josephs can be found...but only with great difficulty. Stuck between two run-down housing estates and beside a steep quarry that has seen many a Dundee fan contemplate suicide over the past 2 years, a compass and a mud diviner are handy accessories when in search of the ground. If Simon Inglis ever gets around to "Football Grounds of Junior Football" he may be forced to brush up on terms more agricultural than architectural. The park boasts one of those not uncommon sites for junior patrons, ie the rutted surface protected by a decaying iron barrier for the purpose of keeping the punters in comfort and

protection. Unfortunately due to an expanse of undergrowth along one side of the park one is forced to stand pitch-side of the partition. On the other side, an equally ferocious expanse of away supporters complete with cases of Tennents Lager and bottles of Thunderbird wine. F.A.B.

### Fare Pay Award?

Such is the paucity of the current junior game that the two bus fares to and from Midmill (£1.20) cost more than the admission (£1) although to be fair to Tayside Transport, the view from their no 17 omnibus was better by far than the zero elevation to be found at the ground. The small stone hut behind one of the goals excepted, there were no toilets, no tea stall and not as much as a square foot of paving to stand atop. While the amateur botanists in the crowd could delight in the neo-darwinist efforts of the groundsmen, the rest of us were forced to watch the game.

The match was a see-saw affair with the home side recovering from an early goal loss to lead 2-1 at the interval. As expected, most of the fun came from the lack of linesmen with the hapless ref forced to call offside from some 40 yards behind play. This produced the healthy response of both sides playing no offside tactics and often five men up front. Entertaining as this is, rigor mortis was beginning to set in and with no more goals with seconds to spare and a hot coffee beckoning, the inevitable bastard St Anthony sub scored sending us into an unwanted extra half hour.

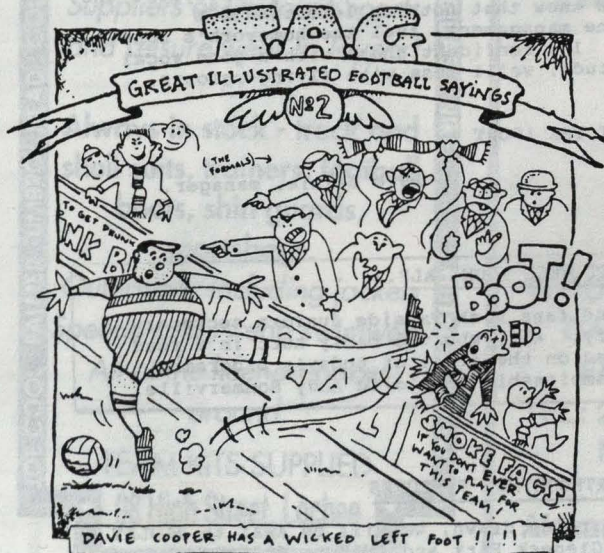
Elmwood eventually triumphed 3-2 and were rewarded with a home tie v Arthurlie and almost certain defeat. The Tayside clubs generally struggle in the Junior Cup and each year the "Junicus" column in the Dundee Courier bemoans the lack of success with a "What's gone wrong" article in much the same way that the Sunday Mail penned a few years back when the Rangers trophy room was bare. Junicus will then re-live the two most recent glory runs. Few will forget the semi-final appearances in the last decade of Downfield (0-1 v Pollok) and Lochee Utd v Benburb both played at Dens Park much to the disgust of the opponents. It was however a great boost for the local clubs with 13,000 for the Benburb match and around 8,000 for Pollok.

### Tay It Ain't So

Needless to say, all the teams in the region were eliminated with ease this time around with the exception of Fife's (?) Tayport Juniors who made the quarters before dropping to Alan Rough's Glenafon. Of the rest, Elmwood lost 0-1 to Arthurlie while Dundee North End were so excited with the prospect of facing giants Auchinleck Talbot that 4 of their men went for an early bath in a 1-5 drubbing. Another hefty reverse came in round one when that most historically put upon teams, Bon Accord gained some belated revenge on the Tayside region by stuffing Perthshire's Luncarty 13-0, a mere 107 years after the infamous 36-0 drubbing by Arbroath (who says we don't do research?).

All in all then not too much to cheer about in Tayside which may suit the average manic depressive which attends the games. The teams with the social clubs behind them get the pick of the players, the cream of the local cups and occasionally to the 4th round of the Scottish Junior Cup. The others, Elmwood included, struggle along on raffle ticket income and desperately try to avoid the fate of the likes of Perth Celtic, Crieff Eamgrove, Dundee Osborne and the Hydro Dynamoes, all defunct (although judging by the moniker, the latter may have absconded to the North American "Soccer" League). Ironically the best hope for increased interest and income may lie with the senior clubs policy of pricing away match trips into the luxury bracket forcing the hard-up fan to scour his/her own back yard in search of the rough and ready game that is Junior football.
