

A warm welcome to the players, officials & supporters of Cumbernauld United. The New Town side were relegated last season and, in a bid to take an immediate step back upstairs, have brought in a number of new faces. Ex.E. Stirling keeper Stephen Connelly is one of the most recent arrivals, having been signed from Bellshill Athletic to replace regular Keeper Hinchcliffe who has just been transferred to Elgin City in the Highland League. A certain starter in defence will be ex Partick Rod Wyllie while the responsibility for keeping things tight at the back will fall to skipper Jim McGarrigle, signed back in 1984. The other long serving player in the squad is midfielder Martin Doogan, presently the team's top scorer. A key player in midfield will be Alan Gordon who was bought recently from Kilsyth Rangers. Other midfielders Ian Gillespie and Billy Reid have had Senior experience with Albion and Dumbarton while strikers Colin Gray(Clydebank, St'muir & E. Stirling) and Mark Murphy (Blackpool) have also plied their trade at a higher grade. But for two recent surprise defeats, v. StAnthonys & v. Wishaw, Cumbernauld would have been riding high at the top of the division. A solitary win at home to St Rochs is all United could muster in October and Jim Moore will be asking his players to reproduce the kind of form displayed at Cumnock at the start of the month when the Ayrshire cracks scored a narrow 4 - 2 win in a West of Scotland cup tie.

Cumbernauld's record home attendance is 2,200 versus Pollok in a Scottish Junior Cuptie in 1983.

TAYSIDE JUNIORS

The major talking point so far this season in the Tayside Juniors has been the disappointing start made by Downfield. Already the Spiders are ten points adrift of the league leaders and out of the Zamoyski Trophy. Downfield are too good a side to allow this situation to continue and a run in the OVD Cup could be just the thing to put a smile back on the faces of the Balgowan Avenue faithful. The Zamoyski last Saturday gave St Joseph's their first opportunity to test themselves against Division One opponents. The new look Joeys passed that test but, with Craigie having their perennial battle against relegation, a stiffer test will be required before the strength of the Midmill side can be properly evaluated. There is no doubt that the Joeys have ambition with the intention of supremos Peter Marr and Davie Young being to bring the OVD Cup to Dundee for the first time in 63 years. Broughty Athletic ran Zamoyski finalists last season, Forfar WE, close and look well suited to be in the promotion frame come June. One surprise in the Zamoyski was the defeat of Arbroath SC, beaten 3-1 at home by Carnoustie. The Gowfers have been something of a surprise packet this season in Division One and look set to cause more upsets yet. The other surprise was at Bankfoot where Violet's hopes ended at the hands of the second division side. Further disappointments could be in store for the Pansies unless they can shore up one of the leakiest defences in the top division. Harp took two vital points at Kirrie, winning 2-1, to move a couple of places up the table and leave their hosts entrenched at the bottom.

TODAY'S FIRST ROUND OVD SCOTTISH CUPTIES

Fourteen Tayside League clubs are in OVD action this afternoon and for two of those clubs there is a certain 1st round exit, Lochee United and Scone Thistle and Broughty Athletic v Elmwood having been drawn together. Scone will fancy their chances at Thomson Park and in the all second division clash, Broughty should win through. Most illustrious visitors to the region are Fauldhouse who visit North End. Fauldhouse took 3 games to dispose of Harp in last season's 1st round before finally going out after a replay in round 4 to eventual winners Auchinleck.

Harp meet Dalkeith Thistle who were just pipped for a promotion place in the John Walker League by goal difference last season. Montrose meet Haddington from the same division and a third Lothians side travel north when Musselburh visit Balbeqqie.

St Joseph's should account for Troon from Ayreshire's Division 2 but East Craigie will have to find some of last season's Scottish Cup form if they are to do anything at Craigmark. Luncarty will have to look to defence in depth at Larkhall to avoid a rout while Downfield should win with a few goals to spare at home to Wishaw who play in the same division as Cumbernauld.

Only North Region side in these parts is Dyce who will do well to get a replay from their tie at Bankfoot.

GROUND IMPROVEMENTS

Canniepairt regulars will have noticed the lack of action in the construction of the new refreshment / toilet block. It is hoped to re-commence work here soon.

Construction of a terracing on the south side of the ground has begun. This is the first phase in the programme to redevelop the spectator accommodation at that side of the ground.





Firstly I would like to extend a warm welcome to our supporters and the players and officials of our Scottish Cup Ist round opponents today. Before I comment on today's game, I would like to mention our matches over the past month or so.

The Lochee United result was important not only for the two points gained. The five goals we scored gave our forwards a much needed confidence booster, something which had deserted them in the previous two games. On the minus side the two goals we lost late on, I'd put down to a lack of professionalism on our part, pushing too many players forward in the search for more goals, but I would settle for a 5-2 result in every game.

The Lochee Harp game I felt we played for thirty minutes which was enough to give us a 4-1 victory. Our next two league games were very important, against possible championship contenders. The first at home to Kinnoull. Before the kick off the players were warned that thirty minutes would not be enough. Their response was to produce our best performance for a long while, winning 11-1.

The Downfield encounter was never going to go the way the Kinnoull game went. I'd pointed out to the players beforehand that they had an opportunity to close the door on Downfield's championship hopes. They did it with a 1-0 victory. I had mixed feelings at the end of this game. I was happy about the two pointsgained but I also felt cheated and was disappointed with our performance on the day. We definately gave them too much respect which is a major factor in our displays against them. Last week saw us start our defence of the Zamoyski Cup versus Luncarty. 9-0. We're in the next round. So all in all it has been a good month for the club.

Today Cumbernauld United come to the Canniepairt and, make no mistake about it they've not just come for the bus trip. Like us they want to see themselves making the second round draw and will give Tayport the utmost respect. Our players know that nothing less than100% committment will do. We, the management, feel the homework's done. It's now time for the exam. I'm confident that, with a good vocal support and the proper attitude, we'll pass with flying colours.

"Bent double like beggars under sacks, brock-ineed, coughing like hags we cursed through sludge." No, as Wilfrid Owen so acutely observed a journey to a junior football match in mid-winter cannot be described as fun. Two dismal hours standing in a damp field in Dundee watching the efforts of 22 graceless hulks do battle on a pitch which must surely double as a venue for stock car racing is not nirvana for the average football fan. Still, every down has its up.

The up on this occasion was the glamour that is the Scottish Junior Cup which offered an opportunity for a bit of good oldfashioned east-west coast rivalry to be stirred up and, conversely a chance to see if the junior game is in the same decline as the seniors. Whatever the reason, Dundee Elmwood v St Anthony's 2nd round 2nd replay at Midmill Park was the place to be. Midmill, home of another great city side.
