TODAY'S GAME

This afternoon's game completes the first half of our league programme in that we'll now have played every team at least once. Our visitors opened their first division campaign in splendid fashion, going six games undefeated and moving into third top spot. A 0-4 defeat from Forfar WE was then followed by a win by the same margin over Lochee Harp. Since then the Gowfers haven't tasted success in five league games. Two were drawn and the other three were lost, on each occasion by the odd goal. Carnoustie have not travelled well, yet to record a win away from home while recording only one loss in seven home games. A suspension incurred by the influential Lex Richardson did help, breaking up for a couple of games his partnership with Mark Bennett who had an outstanding game for the Tayside Select in their win over the Central Region last Sunday. For goals today's visitors will be looking to top scorer Alan Cranston who added to his tally with a brace against Blairgowrie in the P A Cup last week.

Our injury problems were compounded by illness which caused Andy Sommerville to miss last week's game at Forfar WE and restricted Jackie Devine to a place on the bench. A non football injury laid Kevin Lynch low and the shortage of players meant that coach Mel Irons had to pull on a jersey. Hopefully matters will have improved for this afternoon's game. Nothing short of a victory will do with Forfar WE and Arbroath SC waiting to take advantage of any slip.

We've played Carnoustie three times since joining the Junior ranks, the most recent being the Herschell Trophy match at Tayport at the end of last season which we won by 4-2. The two previous meetings were in the second division, Tayport winning 6-1 at Westfield and 4-0 on the Canniepairt.

TAYSIDE JUNIORS

Although there are some big names missing from the quarter final draw of the Perthshire Advertiser Cup, the 2nd round ties last Saturday went to form with no team eliminating a team placed above them in the league.

Covv produced the goods at West End to put us into the last eight while our opponents today cracked in six against a Blairgowrie side seemingly going from bad to worse.

St Josephs failed their first real test of the season at Kinnoull albeit by penalty kicks and North End finished strongly to subject Kirrie to further misery.

Arbroath SC ran in four goals for about the sixth time at home this season although the Cup holders Jeanfield pushed them all the way by notching three goals of their own. Downfield, beaten finalists last season coasted past Elmwood by 3-0 while Arbroath Vics.' superb start to the season was maintained when they secured a place in the last eight at the expense of north east rivals Montrose Roselea.

A favoured draw in the quarter finals will be the winner of the Balbeggie v East Craigie tie which was postponed last week.

Carnoustie Panmure this season took their place back in the first division of the Tayside Juniors following a number of seasons in the wilderness. Their slide followed a halcyon period in the late 1970's when the Westfield Park side won five first division championships in six years.

The team which had swept all before them aged together and the club hadn't made provision for the future. A disastrous dabble with a Social Club at Westfield Park didn't help matters as the team stumbled into the nether regions of the second division. The Fairy Godfather was around the corner, however, in the shape of successful Carnoustie businessman D.J. Laing (yes, it's the same D.J. whose lorries rumble up and down Albert Street etc.!). Always with an interest in football anyway, David Laing could see matters slip no further and, two seasons ago, became Club President, sorted out the finances and used his business acumen to help reorganise the club.

By having some much needed finance ploughed into the club the gowfers were able to attract seasoned ex Seniors, Ian Fleming (ex Kilmarnock, Aberdeen, Sheffield Wednesday and Dundee) as manager, Lex Richardson (ex St Mirren, Dundee and Arbroath) and Mark Bennett (Forfar, Montrose, Brechin and Arbroath) to join up, just pipping Tayport for the latter.


Without setting the heather on fire Carnoustie picked up the Division Two Championship last season, the first season under the new regime.



In preparing for the challenge of the first division Panmure brought in Grant McLean as assistant to Ian Fleming. McLean, previously with Tayport's Amateurs in the same capacity, brought with him from St James Amateurs strikers Alan Cranston and Willie Cooper, adding some younger blood to a pool most of which were on the wrong side of 30.

Other additions were Davie Rae, who was briefly with Tayport in their inaugural season, Stevie Black, who was Tayport Amateurs' reserve side's top scorer last season, Eric Manderson, that man of many clubs and subject of Tayport's successful protest against Forfar West End last season, as well as more recent acquisitions, Joe Reilly (pictured left), the ex Broughty Ath. & Harp striker and Gary Hailstones a midfielder formerly with Wishaw Junrs.

Charles GRANT McLEAN , assistant to Ian Fleming at Panmure, turned out for Tayport Amateurs in the twilight of his amateur career and helped out Peter Wilson who was team manager at the time.

Among others who wore the colours of both clubs was RONNIE LAING . Ronnie was at school with our committee men Iain Cougan and Ronnie Redpath and played the occasional friendly. Finally STEVIE BLACK who is likely to wear the No. 3 shirt for Carnoustie today was the Tayport Amateurs reserve team top scorer last season as the team picked up the Midlands Alliance Div. 2 title. TAYPORT - PANMURE CONNECTIONS

There have been a fair number of players who have turned out for both clubs over the past dozen or so years.

DOUG PATERSON had a four year spell with Carnoustie sandwiched between two successful periods at Tayport Amateurs. Doug missed out on a Midlands Amateurs title win at Tayport but more than compensated during his time at Westfield Park. JIM BISSETT, in Panmure's pool for today's game, was a vital cog in the Tayport squad during the eighties and, along with three players who were subsequently to turn senior, Gus Malone, Phil Smith & Bobby Wilson, was a member of the title winning team of 81/82 coached by Eric Sinclair. Both Jim and Doug were also members of the Tayport Amateurs side which played in the 1986 Scottish Cup Semi at Dens Park.

One of the fondest memories for Tayport players of that era was the regular excursions into Europe playing in an International Tourney in Belgium.

Both Jim (pictured left) and Doug could be described as 'good tourists' but another with connections at both clubs was a born tourist.



We're back on league business today with Carnoustie Panmure providing the opposition. I'd like to extend a warm welcome to their players and officials and of course to our own support. On today's game with Panmure. I'm not surprised that they've done so well this season. They were last season's Division Two champs and have added a few new faces to their pool. They come to Tayport with a 6-1 victory behind them and have the extra incentive of playing the first division champs and current league leaders. I'm sure that their manager will have little problem motivating them. Our players must continue to adopt a professional approach and match our opponents' commitment. Finally, as I said before the Violet game, it is an added incentive for our players to pull clear at the top as our nearest rivals have another difficult encounter this afternoon.
