



Today we welcome Kirrie Thistle to the Canniepairt for our second league game against the Jags this season. At Westfield Park in August, Thistle gave us one of our hardest games of the season to date, before going down 2-1 to goals from Dave Reilly and Kevin Lynch.

At that time Kirrie looked to have a reasonable season ahead of them but things haven't quite worked out that way. They occupy second bottom spot in the league with only a solitary victory over bottom club East Craigie to their credit. Of their defeats, however, five have been by the odd goal and they have failed to score only once in their last seven league games.

If manager Alex Brash, the ex-Forfar Athletic and Raith Rovers stalwart, has his troops psyched up as he did in the opening game of the season, then Kirrie will be looking for some return from their visit.

Several faces in the Kirrie camp will be well known to the home crowd. As well as Bruce Burnett, last year's manager of Tayport's amateur team, Jimmy Anderson, is on the Kirrie backroom staff. Ex Forfar and East Fife midfielder Billy Gallacher was out with both Tayport Juniors and Amateurs prior to joining his ex teammate, Brasher at Kirrie. Also at Tayport previously was Mark Alexander who made his debut for the Amateurs in 1980 as a 15 year old before turning Senior with Forfar Athletic. Mark won't want to remember his last visit to the Canniepairt. He was sent off here last season while wearing the colours of Blairgowrie

Probably being used as a substitute today will be Stevie Graham. The veteran former Forfir and Brechin City striker was Tayport Amateurs top scorerlast season. Both Graham and Gallacher successfully applied to S.F.A. for reinstatement to the amateur grade following knee surgery.

Kirrie lost their interest in this year's OVD Scottish Cup last Saturday at home to Maybole, a 0-4 scoreline flattering the Ayrshire side by all accounts, and will looking to bounce back today. This will be Thistle's first away game in two months.





THE BAKER'S BIT

We are back on league duty this week with Kirrie Thistle providing the opposition. I'd like to extend a welcome to their players and officials and a good afternoon to our supporters.

I don't think that I have to remind our fans and the players of our last encounter. It was the first game of the season and we came home from Kirrie with two points, a result which rather flattered us on the day. I'm sure that if I had been their manager, I'd have been more than disappointed to have taken nothing from the game.

Since that close encounter the fate of both clubs seems to have gone in opposite directions. We've since gained a further 23 points to Kirrie's 4 . As Greavsie would say "It's a funny old game, Saint!"

The last couple of weeks has seen us gain a 3-0 victory in the Scottish Cup v Benburb and then last week have no game. After a morning inspection the referee decided that the pitch was unplayable (at 9.30am) As fate would have it, the sun shone and, by all accounts, the surface was perfect by kick off time. We'll have to push for referees to be issued with crystal balls!

Getting back to the Benburb game, like the Kirrie game I've got to be honest and say that the scoreline flattered Tayport. Our game never got off the ground. We seemed to start nervously and never managed to get out of third gear.

I said to the players at half time an early goal would see Benburb throw in the towel but as the minutes ticked on, the more they began to believe in themselves until Dave Reilly's free kick relieved the tension. After that what I said at half time bore fruit and their heads dropped. We scored again and I stopped asking Robbo the time and we made it into the next round

After the game some of our supporters commented that the players looked as if they had lost instead of just notching up a 3-0 victory. I can explain that. The players have a pride in their performance, as I do, and we all felt that we'd let ourselves down and our standards drop. Personally, I see nothing wrong with that.

Last Saturday I spent a very frustrating morning trying to find opposition to come to the Canniepairt for a rearranged game but I'm afraid no one seemed keen. As a last resort we tried numerous teams from Fife and Tayside, Junior and Amateur to play a friendly, but to no avail.

However the day wasn't wasted as we arranged a good competitive training match, Blues v Reds or Men v Boys!. The good thing to come out of it was that we now know that the man in black, Mr Thoms (Dundee), will referee another game at Tayport over my dead body! Six of the Boys' eight goals were definately offside and we had three blatant penalties turned down. On the serious side, it gave players like Sean Wilkie and Grant Cushnie much needed match practice.

I feel today's game can go one of two ways. I know that we have quality players but that in itself is not enough. We must match or better our opponents' determination. If we do this then I've no doubt of the outcome of today's game. The other way is to be unprofessional, then we'll struggle.
