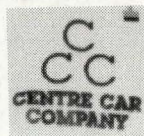

TODAY'S GAME

George Malone is back in full training and Paul Reilly should be ready to resume soon after being laid low with a chest infection.

Downfield have great incentive to defeat Hill o' Beath in this afternoon's replay - a home tie with Lochee United. Violet will not be unhappy to have drawn Bellshill who are currently in the bottom half of the Central Association's third division.

Broughty Athletic, on a good run at present and having disposed of East Division One side Livingston United in the last round, will be confident of progressing at the expense of Blackburn United or Haddington, both of which play in the East Division Two.

Rosyth Recreation, managed by Alex Totten's assistant when both were at St Johnstone, Bert Paton, will be looking for a last sixteen place having been drawn at home to either Bathgate or Lugar Boswell Thistle

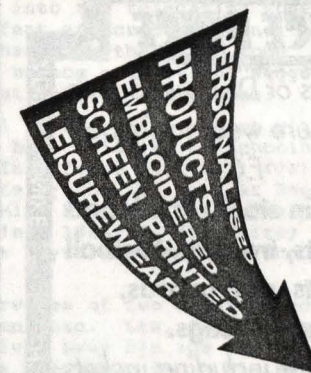

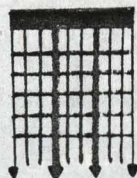

We welcome Harp today in only their second ever visit to the Canniepairt. Their other visit was two seasons ago when a Billy Coventry goal was all that separated the sides as we marched to the Second Division title.

We won the return 3-0 at Beechwood and since then we've faced each other twice in cupties in Dundee, Tayport coming out top on both occasions. The more recent of the two was in last season's Whyte & Mackay semi final when a Hamish Mackay hattrick was the highlight of our 5-0 win. Hamish, a favourite at Beechwood during Harp's halcyon days in the eighties, further punished his old club in the league meeting of the sides earlier this season when he grabbed all four Tayport goals in our 4-1 win.

After missing out on promotion two seasons ago, Harp got their step up last year, finishing runners up to champions Carnoustie. It might have been the title for Harp. The Gowfers finished a point ahead which included two points awarded to them for a home game against Coupar Angus which wasn't in fact played.

Manager Jim Kelly has seen his side have an indifferent start to their 92/93 campaign. A run of five successive league defeats earlier in the season saw them slip into the relegation zone but a point from Downfield, a narrow defeat at North End and, most recently, a 3-0 win over Carnoustie has seen them keep some daylight between themselves and the bottom quartet and suggests that Tayport will have their work cut out this afternoon.

Regular goalkeeper Kenny McLeod will likely still be out with a broken finger and in his place will be a trialist, ex Schoolboy Internationalist Bruce Alexander. In defence Harp will field their longest serving player, Mike Kelly who has been at Beechwood since 1978. At 33 fellow defender Mike Black is three years older than Kelly and has been with Harp since 1981/82. Jim Murray joined up from Wellbank Amateurs while Mark Blyth has seen service with Lochee United and Blairgowrie.

In midfield Harp can call on the services of two experienced campaigners in Mark Law and John Clenaghan. Law, formerly with Forfar Athletic and Osborne (that gives away his age !) is in his fifteenth season while the resolute Clenaghan is in his second spell with the club having given service to North End, Jeanfield and Downfield.

For goals Harp will be looking to thirty two years old George Sinclair. A man of many clubs, amateur and junior, George has just returned to Harp from a short spell in the Seniors with Deveronvale in the Highland League. A transfer never went through because of a collapse of the financial agreement between the clubs'. George, who lists Tayport as his favourite ground, can often be seen peering out of the pages of the Courier in his capacity as an Area Manager with Post Office Counters, presenting long service awards or whatever. Also in line for a game today is big Eric Manderson who has also appeared for Carnoustie and Forfar WE inside the last twelve months.

Lochee Harp provide our league opposition today. I'd like to take this opportunity to welcome their players and officials to the Canniepairt and a good afternoon to our supporters.

Today's game gives us another opportunity to gain two valuable points and pull further ahead in the race for the title as our main rivals have been blessed with cupties. Our visitors' manager, Jim Kelly, would probably agree that Harp are not the side of a few years back when they won three titles in a row. A repeat of that score would do us fine.

I'm keeping my fingers crossed that the worst of the winter is now behind us. I certainly hope so. As I said in the last Port Prog, the weather had severely hindered our work in midweek. I firmly believe that our form over the festive season and the two weeks after the new year declined with the weather.

It certainly 'poured' the day we played Aberdeen East End. Our first half performance especially was, to say the least, diabolical and I suppose it wouldn't be too far off the mark to describe the half time team talk as 'stormy'. The weather improved slightly as did our attitude in the second half. At least, enough to give us an uninspiring 2-0 win.

The following week we managed to rearrange a league fixture against Jeanfield Swifts. In fact it turned out to be the only game played in the Tayside Juniors that day, so dreadful was the weather. Before the kickoff I asked the players to reward our committee and groundstaff for their tireless efforts to get the surface playable with a victory. They did this with a 2-0 win. I can assess our performance as "better, but a long way to go".

Last week's Zamoyski tie away to Kinnoull was played in the most atrocious conditions I've seen in a long time. But the players' attitude was excellent and every aspect of our play was really pleasing. And, of course, the small matter of eleven goals scored for the second time in one season against a side which most teams in the Region would describe as difficult opposition.

Our players have got to realise that the difference between 'good' and 'great' sides is not just reaching this standard. Good side will do that from time to time. It's consistently playing at, and maintaining this standard - great sides do that.

So, I throw down a gauntlet now to our players - what's it to be? 'good' or 'great' - It's in your hands.

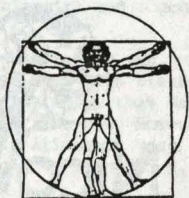

CUMNOCK TIE IS PICK OF THE DRAW

The Scottish Junior FA press release wasn't understating things when it described the Cumnock v Tayport 4th Round OVD Scottish Junior Cup Tie as 'probably the top match of the round'.

Whilst the attentions of the Tayport players today will understandably be on the matter in hand, attempting to collect two points, the attentions of the support will also be on next Saturday's trip to Ayrshire.

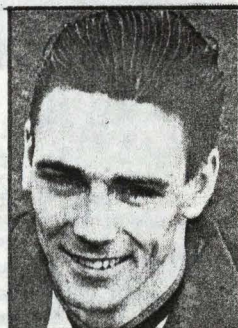
Adding spice to the occasion will be the fact that Cumnock went out of last season's competition to ourselves, losing 2-0 at the Canniepairt.

Management duo Mark Shanks and Bobby McCulloch hadn't long taken over at that stage and needed time to get their house back in order. Signs are that they have done just that. Among the new signings since we met them last season are strikers Sam Frew who scored in the OVD Final at Firhill last season for Auchinleck, another ex-Talbot man Paul Mains and ex-Kilmarnock striker Colin 'Rusty' Harkness who joined up from Stranraer. Harkness is currently the top scorer in Ayrshire Junior football and netted both goals in Cumnock's 2-0 win at Ardrossan Winton Rovers in the last round.

In the first round Cumnock accounted for Lossiemouth by 6-0 away from home and in round two acquired the scalp of Rutherglen Glencairn in a 3-2 win on a pitch at Cumnock described by Glens' manager as 'like a quicksand in places'. The Glens boss added, though, "Cumnock were much better than I had been led to believe and I wouldn't be surprised if they went a long way in the Scottish Cup. Their application was unbelievable".

The Cumnock management could see room for improvement, however, and have just plunged into the transfer market again to sign defender Neil Armour (pictured) from Albion Rovers. The player was the centre of a transfer wrangle with his former club, Kilbirnie thinking that they had first refusal on his services. This wasn't the case, though, and out came the Cumnock chequebook to secure the player for Townhead Park.

Despite Ayrshire hosting a number of 4th Round ties next week, Townhead Park is expected to attract a four figure crowd. The Tayport Supporters' Club will be running supporters' buses. 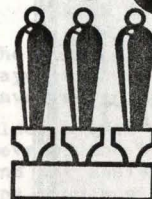

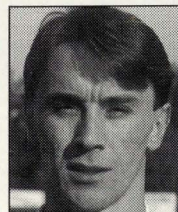

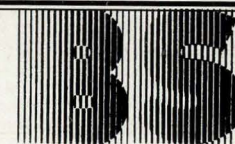
