





TONIGHT'S GAME

North End visit Tayport for only the second occasion since we joined the Junior ranks. That visit, back in November 1991, ended in a share of the league spoils in a 1-1 draw, a repeat of the earlier league encounter between the sides in August of that year at North End Park.

When we met North End earlier this season, we fared somewhat better, winning convincingly by 3-0 thanks to goals from Andy Sommerville, Jackie Devine and Kevin Lynch. It was to be one of only two defeats for the Dokens in their opening eight league fixtures of the season.

Illness and injuries have hampered North End's season and, although their title challenge evaporated some weeks ago, they will be looking to finish in third top spot, a not unrealistic target. Local cups will be their target and they will be looking at tonight's game as a probable scene setter for the Perthshire Advertiser Cup Final in a fortnight's time. There is , of course, the small matter of beating Downfield in the semi-final to win that date with ourselves at McDiarmid Park.

North End are unbeaten in the league so far this year away from home and will be going all out to preserve that record against us here tonight. Forfar West End, our only realistic challengers, are at Violet this evening and will, I'm sure, be one of the first telephone callers to the Canniepairt anxious to hear if North End have done them a favour.

OVD SCOTTISH JUNIOR CUP

Two of the quarter-final ties were decided at the first time of asking with holders AUCHINLECK and last season's finalists, GLENAFTON going through at the expense of PETERSHILL and ST JOSEPHS respectively.

PETERSHILL's tie was covered by STV and the viewers saw the Springburn side shoot themselves in the foot by having a player sent off. Once again the spectator appeal of the holders was evident with the tie attracting a crowd of 2,640. A first half double from Lyden put AUCHINLECK in easy street with Mills adding athird before Maher scored a late consolation for the home side.

Two early goals from GLENAFTON's Miller and Halley put the skids under ST JOSEPHS and although the Dundee side threw caution to the wind in an effort to get back into things, the Ayrshire outfit cruised into the semis with late strikes from Archer and prolific marksman Norman Montgomery (2).

Most thought that LESMAHAGOW had lost their chance when they were held at home to KILBIRNIE LADESIDE but in last week's replay the Central League champions, after an indifferent start to the game, and the loss of defender Anderson, sent off for a double caution, took command after Rocky Crichton's goal ten minutes from the break. The ex-Pollok striker, who had played with a heavy strapping during the first period, didn't come out for the second half but 'Gow were firmly in the driving seat. Wilson made it 2-0, McKenzie got one back from the spot but Wilson tied things up with a third goal.

Ears were glued to the radios on Saturday afternoon for the semi-final draw. Radio Tay, we were told, would come up with the goods, but no such luck and it was Radio Scotland at ten to six who broadcast the draw which paired Tayport or Downfield with Auchinleck and Glenafton with Lesmahagow.

SJFA Secretary Joe Black has wasted no time in fixing up the first of the OVD semis. Glenafton will meet Lesmahagow on SAT. 24th APRIL at FIRHILL. With many of the top Senior games off that day, the tie should attract a healthy crowd. Maybe even a slot on Scotsport, too. Shrewd move, Joe! Details of the other semi will be decided after the outcome of our tie is known.

North End provide our league opposition tonight and I'd like to take this opportunity to welcome their players and officials to the Canniepairt and a good evening to our supporters.







There was disappointment for Tayport fans with the news last night that the Perthshire Advertiser Cup Final at McDiarmid Park has been postponed. Originally scheduled for 27th April, it has had to be put back because the semi between Downfield and North End is still outstanding. St Johnstone's last home game is on 15th May, so we're all hoping that the final can be fitted in before then while, at the same time, avoiding any televised glamour games. Remember the last time we were there clashed with a televised Scotland match which reflected in the disappointing crowd.
