

#### THREE NEW FACES AT THE CANNIEPAIRT

Since the last edition of the Port Prog' back in June there has been plenty happening on and off the field. Pre-season we travelled to meet Fraserburgh United then the following weekend travelled down to Lancashire where we met Lancaster City, defeating their first team on the Saturday and their Reserves the following Sunday morning. Back home we retained the Herschell Charity Trophy at the expense of St Josephs before embarking on a run of five successive league wins. The run came to a dramatic halt at Jeanfield when we surrendered a 2-0 lead to go down 2-3. Another trip to Perth last Saturday was slightly more fruitful, a scoreless draw at Kinnoull.

There hasn't been much personnel movement in the club. Signings of late last season, Grant Miller and Ewan Cameron were added to the squad along with Andy Dolan who was signed from Montrose three weeks ago. Injury curtailed Andy's activities at Links Park last season when he made only one appearance. In Montrose's promotion season of 1990/91, however, Andy made 41 + 1 sub. appearances scoring 8 goals. Andy has had a couple of friendly matches and a couple of substitute appearances since signing on at the Canniepairt and the Port Support are keenly awaiting him appearing in the starting line-up but the manager won't be rushed.

Leaving the Canniepairt have been Grant Cushnie who joined the colony of ex-Tayport players at St Josephs and Ian 'Bomber'Harris who returned south to get a job in the travel business.

Off the field work has been progressing steadily to complete the extension and here we must pay tribute to the efforts of those club members who have given freely of their time to carry out various works. It's been much appreciated.



#### THE BAKER'S BIT

A warm welcome to our support and the players and officials of our opponents to the Canniepairt this afternoon. Our start to season 1993/94 has surprised a lot of people. Manythought, myself included, that we'd still be suffering a hangover from last season's cup final disappointment.

Unfortunately for our rivals, our first six games has seen us play some of the best football to date at Tayport, defeating most of our nearest challengers in the process. Once again we successfully retained the Herschell Trophy defeating St Josephs 2-0. The opening fixtures of our league campaign looked, on paper, a tall order, with St Josephs, Forfar West End, Lochee Harp, Downfield and North End the first five. I probably would have settled for 7 or 8 points from that lot but, to take full points and to score 20 goals into the bargain, and to play the way that we did, is very pleasing indeed.

After these games people, some in high places, were saying "well, that's the league sewn up for another year". My reply to them was "Nonsense, we only require to have a couple of off days and it's wide open again". I should have kept my mouth shut. Our visits to Perth in the last couple of weeks have proved that

The first at Jeanfield, I couldn't believe how badly we played. To be given a two goal lead, then to proceed to give three bad goals away as we did was, quite frankly, a disgrace. To me it all boils down to attitude. I've always said that to our players. If the attitude is correct on the day, we'll defeat anyone in the country. That still stands.

Last week at Kinnoull there was amarked improvement in our play and the attitude was much better. Also, the players who have not been firing on all cylinders of late worked hard. In fact they were maybe trying just too hard which, as you know, sometimes works against you. But it's the only way to regain that bit of confidence that deserts all players from time to time. As they say, It'll all come out in the wash. However from my point of view there were some plus points. The shutout for one. It's every bit as important not to lose goals and, let's not forget that we've not had the services of our club captain for quite a number of games now. This has not only affected the back line but, having to pull Hamish back has affected the front line also.

It's time to get back on the rails and there's no better time nor place than here today against Arbroath Vics. A victory would see Tayport retain league leadership. Our players must realise that victories are earned not gifted. The word which would have every ingredient required is'professionalism' and in every game until Jeanfield, I thought that we had that.

As you know we have a new addition in the shape of Andy Dolan. I'm delighted that Andy decided to join up. I'm positive that he won't regret his move from Montrose. Andy was sidelined for most of last season due to injury. Given time to settle in and games, he'll be a great asset. Of that I'm sure.

Finally I'd like to thank our fans for their support this season. I know that our players really appreciate it. Keep spreading the gospel. Hopefully we can repay you this afternoon with a victory.



The line-up was (2.3.5) Phil Callander; Walter Kemp, Jim Mathers; Ronnie Laing, Jim Scott, Richard Redpath; Abby Oswald, George Ritchie, Ian White, Doug Henderson and Ray White. Sub. was Andy Fraser. Goals came from I.White(3), Oswald (2) and Ritchie(2).

The same afternoon at Arbroath the Reserve side were winning an Alliance Division 2 match by 3-0 against Condor. Their line-up was Dick Pearce; Ian Mathers, Stan Cowe; Ronnie Redpath, Freddie Janssen, Derek McRobbie; Andy Horan, George Bryson, Jimmy Foulis, Andy Johnstone and Ian Brown. Sub. was Murray Anderson. Horan, Johnstone and Bryson were the marksmen

Many of the above 24 players now reside elsewhere but ten still stay in the town. The current treasurer and secretary (positions they held then) are listed as are George Ritchie and Fred Janssen who are assisting with the pavilion extension at present. Murray Anderson is a committee member, Ian Mathers is with Wimpey, our main sponsors, while Doug Henderson and Derek McRobbie are season ticket holders here at the Canniepairt.



#### TODAY'S VISITORS

ARBROATH VICTORIA are the only Tayside club that we've played on the Canniepairt and failed to defeat. Vics and Tayport have crossed swords on three occasions previously and the Ogilvy Park team have had the better of these exchanges, drawing with us at Arbroath and winning the return game at the Canniepairt by 2-1 back in our second division days. Most recent meeting was last season at Ogilvy Park in the Perthshire Advertiser Cup when Tayport eventually squeezed through by 5-3 after the sides had been level after 90 minutes.

Although Vics did virtually nothing in the cups last season they had a magnificent league campaign, being pipped for the second division championship on goal difference by St Josephs. This season hasn't started well for today's visitors, with only a solitary draw from seven games to date. Goals haven't been a problem though with Vics only failing to score in one of those seven games and never yet failing to score on their trips away from home.

After missing the last few games Vics will be hoping that regular keeper BOB DUNCAN can return today. Big Bob has been with the Vics for six seasons, joining up from amateur side Portcullis. Such was his form last season that he turned out for Arbroath Reserves on several occasions.

Team skipper is KENNY FOX who signed from Carnoustie Panmure two seasons ago. A full back who likes to join the attack as his goal at Forfar West End last Saturday would suggest. RAY McWALTER is Vics longest serving player and comanager with JIM HODSON. Equally at home in defence or midfield, Ray was Senior with Brechin City and Arbroath.

Also in defence will be MICHAEL MARTIN, a youngster with a promising future in the game who is in his first season at Vics. Mike is on the books of Arbroath and has recently been involved with the Scottish Under 18 side. BRIAN EATON who normally fills the central defensive role is in his second season with the club having joined up from Portcullis. One goal to his credit this season.

BILLY HAMILTON signed this season from Brechin Vics and can play equally effectively in defence or midfield. Another signing from Portcullis is midfielder BILLY HARDIE although he was previously at Arbroath SC where he was club captain.

ROSS JAMES was reinstated to Vics from Forfar Athletic midway through 1991/92 and settled in quickly to gain a regular place in the Vics line-up. JOHN BOW crossed town to join Vics from rivals Arbroath SC last season. Also had a spell with Forfar West End. Scored a number of vital goals from midfield in vics promotion push last season. CHARLIE COULL is another ex Seaton Park man who joined Vics a year past January. Can be relied upon to snatch a few goals from midfield and has already opened his account for the season with one of his side's four against Broughty the other week.

NICKY MARKOWSKI was top scorer in the Tayside Second Division last season with 37 to his credit. Caused no end of bother to Tayport when the teams met last season and already has five notches on his boots for this season. In his third season with the club after signing from the now defunct Forfar Central amateurs. BRIAN DUFF is another of the large colony of former SC players, signing a year ago and hitting 21 goals in Vics charge to the first division. JOHN BEATT, an attacking fullback missed virtually all last season after sustaining a bad leg injury. ALEX CALLON is in his second spell at Vics with a stint at Forfar West End in between. Made the left back position his own last season. BRIAN CATHRO, one of the younger members of Vics' squad is a consistent performer in midfield. Yet another of the pool who has been with Arbroath and SC.Versatile defender or midfielder NEIL STEWART is unlikely to play, recent reports indicating that he could be out of action for some time. New to Vics squad this season is PADDY NEILSON but the midfielder who has hit three goals this season and who was with Heart of Midlothian for three seasons is out through suspension.






