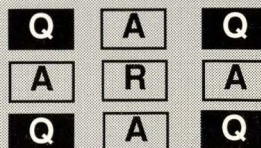

THE BAKER'S BIT

Jeanfield Swifts provide today's opposition and I'd like to take this opportunity of welcoming their players and officials to the Canniepairt this afternoon and a warm welcome also to the Port Support.

It's been a fairly topsy turvy 5 weeks since the last port Prog when Banks o' Dee were our visitors. A fairly average side but they managed to end our interest in the Zamoyiski Cup. I know that we were without umpteen regulars but, make no mistake, we should have been capable of handling the standard of opposition.

A week later we recorded a 2-0 victory at Forfar Albion. Certainly not the most gracious of performances but two points just the same. For the second successive week we were forced to field a member of the coaching staff.

It was back to Forfar the following week, this time at West End. Always a difficult place to go but the nil nil scoreline didn't give us our just reward. The performance on the day was much improved and really, had the score been 3-0 to Tayport, I doubt that many at Forfar could have much to complain about. But it wasn't to be.

Yet another away game, at Carnoustie, followed. At the end of this 2-2 draw I didn't know whether to laugh or cry. We took a gamble with Devine who was far from fit. I didn't pay off. Of the game itself, we dominated the first half against a gale force wind. After the interval the traffic was going in the same direction and we were eventually rewarded with a goal. I could see the relief on the players' faces. Then we lose another player through injury, forcing another change and for a ten minute spell we lost all shape and composure and find ourselves 1-2 down only to grab what turned out to be a very valuable point.

Fortunately our main rivals were losing both points at home to our opponents today. So really, my day went from one of happiness to despair then back to happiness again.

As last week's cup tie with North End approached, it became much more apparent that something had to be done. I know that we're going through a disastrous spell as far as luck with injuries is concerned but I also know that there's no other club in this Region that could do without the numbers and calibre of player we've had to do without over a long period.

So it's roll up the sleeves time. I'd like to think that the 6-1 win proves to our players and support that it's there and that it must stay there from here on in to the end of the season and that rewards are earned. There's no point looking elsewhere for help. As I said, the ability is there, but we must have the hunger to accompany this undoubted ability.

I mentioned earlier that our main rivals dropped two points at home to Jeanfield Swifts and they are one of the few teams to have defeated Tayport this season. Today, therefore, there can be no room for complacency. If our players can repeat last week's efforts then I'm sure that we'll all be smiling at around ten past four.

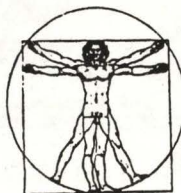

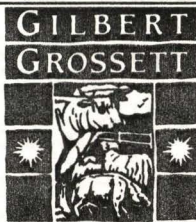

TODAY'S VISITORS

After last Saturday's programme, Jeanfield's current form was on a par with our own with only St Joseph's showing slightly better form than today's combatants.

The recent arrival of new manager Drew Hay has seen an upsurge in the Perth club's fortunes. In terms of points dropped Swifts are in third spot behind ourselves and Downfield.

Hay, a former Jeanfield player, arrived at Simpson Park from amateur outfit Fair City. While in Hay's charge Fair City had established themselves as one of the top amateur clubs in the area, with teams in both the Perthshire Amateurs and the Kingdom Caledonian League.

Hay replaced Davie Reid as manager. Reid parted company with the club following Swifts heaviest defeat in 30 years - 7-0 at the hands of St Joseph's - and is now in charge at Forfar West End.

Sometimes a heavy defeat is what a club needs to shake things up and pave the way for a fresh new beginning. There can be no better illustration than OVD Scottish Junior Cup semi finalists Largs Thistle who earlier this season were stuffed 10-0 by Beith. The Ayrshire Division Two side subsequently got their house in order to such an extent that they are but one game away from the Ibrox final on May 15th.

Anyway, back to Jeanfield who field several faces familiar to Tayport fans. Goalkeeper ALAN MORRIS previously played with Newport Amateurs from which side he joined Deveronvale in the Highland League last season prior to moving to Simpson Park. Injured last week against Forfar West End, but, with only one keeper on his books, manager Hay will be hoping that 'Dancer' makes it. Alan is a familiar face to our players also. He deputised for Fraser during the pre-season.

Central defender CHRIS MARTIN, like Dancer, is a Newport lad who moved from his local side to Riverside Athletic from whom he joined Swifts. Has come on a bundle under the team's new manger

KENNY CAMERON needs no introduction. Kenny was a youthful member of the Tayport Amateurs team which went to the semi final of the Scottish Amateur Cup in 1986 and guested for us in this season's pre season tour to England in August prior to signing up at Simpson Park. Has proved to be a more than useful signing. Is the team's top scorer who notched a double against us in our early season defeat in Perth.

STUART CASSIDY. The left back was signed this season from Forfar Albion but was a member of the Downfield side which took us to three games in last year's Scottish Cup 1/4 final. Another of this season's signings is right back SCOTT MCINTYRE. Scott joined up at Forfar Athletic from Newburgh. However the boo boys at Station Park made things difficult for the player, probably because he is manager Tommy Campbell's son-in-law so he moved to Inverness Clach. from which club he joined Swifts only a few weeks ago.

So, it will be a confident Swifts outfit which takes the field today having inflicted on us our only league defeat to date - 3-2 in Perth after we had led 2-0. More recently Jeanfield returned from Downfield with the home side's scalp in a 2-1 win, Downfield's first domestic defeat since we beat them on the Canniepairt back in August.

We displayed sparkling finishing at North End last week and will be looking for more of the same today. Injuries continue to plague our squad, however. Billy Coventry is out for six months with a cruciate ligament problem. Andy Dolan isn't back in full training after a cartilage operation and Junior Reilly is yet to return after being injured at Camelon at the beginning of November.

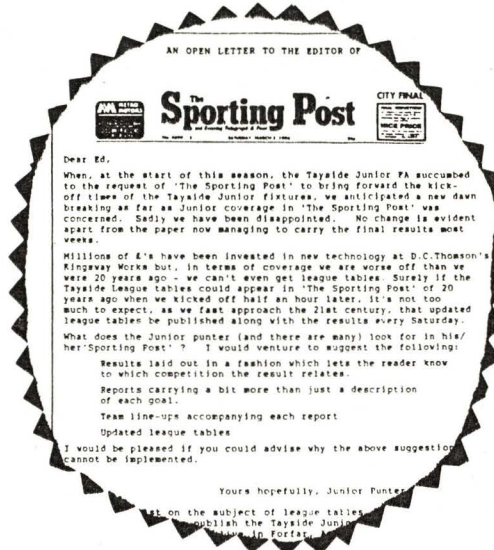
CREDIT WHEN CREDIT'S DUE!

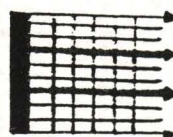

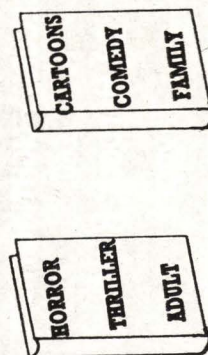
