

CHAMPIONS

THAT strange sound you heard around breakfast time on Monday morning was the spluttering of the Port Support as they choked over their cornflakes. Picture the scene, Holiday Monday, wee lie-in, make the beakfast, settle down with the Courier to read about and savour Saturday's fourth title win in a row. Great anticipation as the paper is turned to the inside back page. What will the headline be? "SUPER PORT CLINCH TITLE" OF "CAMERON WONDER GOAL SEALS TITLE FOR TAYPORT" OF maybe "FOUR TITLES IN A ROW FOR TAYPORT" ? The more cynical amongst us might have expected something along the lines of "ARBROATH CAUGHT IN SPIDERS' WEB" !.

But no, the headline is "TAYPORT TRIUMPH BUT PARTY IS STILL ON HOLD". And the article goes on to say that we need two points from tonight's game with Harp to take the title. But, wait a minute, what was yesterday's hangover all about? What were all the celebrations at Fairfield Park for. Surely the champagne wasn't just to celebrate another win over the Joey's ? Wait a minute. Was it all just a dream and this was really Saturday

Any such thoughts were interupted by the telephone ringing. On the line is Dave Baikie. "Have you seen the paper?" he explodes. Next the doorbell goes. It's the next door neighbour. "What's this latest nonsense in the paper?. What's the story?

Well, we can only assume that 'Junior Correspondent' has looked at the Sporting Post league table which credited us with two points fewer than we should have had (although the games played, won, drawn and lost was correct) and thought that Downfield could catch us. This despite the Saturday column stating that Tayport "....need only a point to retain their crown" and both the Sporting Post and the Sunday Post reporting that Tayport had secured another title win.

We can put the record straight. Tayport have indeed won the championship, having led the table from the moment Ewan Cameron notched the first of our four goals against St Joseph's in the first league game of the season back on 18th August.

If nothing else, Monday's Courier cock-up gives creedence to the adage "Don't believe everything that you read in the newspapers"!

The phones of Tayport officials never stopped ringing on Monday after the article referred to above appeared. The Courier appeared to blame Tayside JFA officials while the Tayside JFA officials were adamant that the Association wasn't at fault.

Anyway, a correction was printed in Tuesday's Courier which stated, among other things the following:

"The Fife club believed they had retained the league title..... however the championship issue was then thrown into confusion when a leading Tayside JFA official informed Courier Sport that there had been a mix-up and Tayport in fact required a further point to be crowned league champions....it was confirmed last night that Tayport's weekend result was enough to give them the championship "

TODAY'S GAME

HARP visit the Canniepairt tonight as one of two teams from four which could accompany Arbroath Vics into division Two. After tonight Harp have only a home game v St Joseph's to play from which to add to their 20 point total.

Broughty Athletic can amass 22 points with a home game against Downfield tomorrow night and away games against Kinnoull and Violet to come.

Forfar Albion can reach the 21 point mark if they win away to Jeanfield on Saturday and take full points from home games against Arbroath Vics and North End.

Violet, already on 21 points, with four games to go and the best goal difference, look safe.

Goal difference could well have a part to play at the death. At the moment, of the three main contenders for the drop, Harp are the worst placed with -18, two goals worse than Albion and three worse than Broughty.

Harp, though, have the crucial advantage of having the points in the bag. Notwithstanding that, however, the Beechwood team will be going all out this evening to get the win which would take the pressure off and relegate Albion and Broughty.

On their travels in the league this season Harp have only conceded 18 goals in their twelve away games and have only twice failed to find their opponents' net.

It must be remembered too, that Harp pulled off one of the results of the season in this season's OVD Scottish Cup when they travelled to Glasgow and knocked out one of the Cup favourites and the defending Central League champions, Petershill. Keeper Kenny Macleod was one of the Harp heroes that afternoon and the Beechwood team will be looking to their last line of defence to have his eye in this evening.

Up front Harp will be looking to the striking duo of Stevie Higgins and Eric Manderson for their goals. Between them the pair have netted two thirds of all the Harp goals this season.

Big Eric was certainly in form last midweek when he notched all four Harp goals in their 4-2 Whyte & Mackay Cup win at Violet. All the goals in that tie came in extra time after the 90 minutes had finished goalless. That tie , incidentally, was described by Harp's Jim Kelly as one of the worst games he had ever had the misfortune to see. Here's hoping that tonight's game doesn't update that view.

Harp are our visitors here again on Saturday when they come calling in the Whyte & Mackay Cup quarter final. Supporters should note that Saturday's game kicks off at 2.00pm to allow for extra time and penalties if required.

This evening's game will be preceded with the presentation of the Tayside first division championship shield by an official of the Tayside JFA.







From the Archives

THIS year being the 50th Anniversary of D-Day, we thought that we'd reminisce with the only member of the Tayport club who took part in those landings, one of our groundsmen, DAVIE HUGHES.

Davie has lived in Tayport all his days and here he tells us of football in the town through the years.

PP- When did you first take an interestin the game?

DH- Around 1925 when I was about six years old. There were two teams in the town at that time, Tayport Thistle who played in the Fife Juvenile League and the Violet who were Juniors. Thistle played down at the Milhouses where Scott & Fyfe's new extension is built. The pitch there was known as 'The Sudan'. The majority of the Thistle team stayed in the Milhouses as did the committee.

We used to get good crowds in these days, there was nothing else to do. The players changed in a hut built by the mill which was also used for dancing and the like.

The Violet played on the Common although the Thistle played there also when the Violet were away from home.

PP- Any games from your younger day that stick in your mind?

- DH- I recall when Thistle reached the 7th round or so of the Scottish Cup and were drawn away to Blairhall in south Fife. It was always pretty rough down there and this day Andrew Ross and Andrew Guthrie were sent off. Guthrie, who was also known as Andrew Westwater refused to leave the park. That was the same day that Davie Phin, Andy Phin of Cobbie's father, was running the line and had his soft hat pulled down over his eyes by an irate local.
- PP- What about the characters we always hear are missing from today's game?

 DH- Dyke Milne was a character. He played outside left and when he had the ball
 he refused to part with it. He used to beat you and come back and beat you

he refused to part with it. He used to beat you and come back and beat you again about four times! Andrew Guthrie was one of those players who claimed for everything, even when it was obvious it was the opposition's ball (a bit like Willie Miller, I suppose).

PP- Did the players train in those days?

DH- The Thistle trained and if you didn't train you didn't get a game. I recall Hughie Ross, a fine inside left, being dropped because he didn't train. We didn't go to the pub the way the players do today. After work there used to be a bounce game on the Common, often around twenty a side, and we played until it got dark. There used to be kick abouts on a Sunday afternoon as well. Footballs weren't as plentiful then and we often had to hang about until the lad with the ball arrived.

PP- Any players who went Senior from Tayport?

- DH- Gordon Kidd , an outside left, went to Clyde and then on to Dunfermline.

 Maurice Milne signed for Dundee United and Wull Reid went to Ipswich. Wull
 played for Tayport Rangers who were an amateur side before the war. We
 called th 1 the 'Petticoat Rangers' because that was the team that the
 women followed!
- PP- The Second World War must have caused disruption in the local game.
- DH- It certainly did. Most of the players were called up. Some didn't return.
- PP- There must have been times when football was pretty far from your mind, D-Day for example.
- DH- When we jumped off the landing craft into chest high water, loaded down with equipment, it was survival of the fittest. Football, I can assure you, was the furthest thing from our minds.
