

CHAMPIONS

100 % HOME RECORD FOR TAYPORT

We completed a clean sweep of our home league fixtures when winning 6-0 at home to Lochee Harp on Wednesday evening here on the Canniepairt.

The Canniepairt hasn't been a happy hunting ground for our Tayside League opponents this season. In winning our entire 13 game card we've scored 54 goals for the loss of only six.

And our 78 goals total to date assures us of the Craig Stephen Trophy. Lochee United will be Tayport's opponents in the Albert Herschell Trophy. Davie Martin's team clinched the division Two Championship on Wednesday evening with a 1-0 win over Scone Thistle and so return to the top division after only one season downstairs.

Harp came to the Canniepairt looking for safety points but their hopes of stealing a point were dashed as early as the 5th minute when one of their old boys, Hamish Mackay, was on the spot to knock the ball into the net after Grant Miller's cross had been deflected into his path.

Harp were proving stuffy opponents and the crowd were getting little to enthuse over. A fright for the Port in 30 minutes when big Eric Manderson headed just over the Tayport bar then shortly afterwards Anderson's shot slipped just wide with our defence still disputing with Referee Munro that the ball had earlier gone out of play.

It took us nine minutes into the second half to increase the lead. Devine crossed from the left for top scorer Cameron to head past Kenny Macleod. In 61 minutes it was three with a header of astonishing velocity from Andy Sommerville. Paterson slung in a free kick from the left and Andy arrived at the back of the box like an express train to rocket the ball into the goal from 15 yards.

Harp's chances of stemming an increasing flow of attacks wasn't helped when full back Mike Kelly, took a swing at Cameron in full view of the referee and was despatched for first shot of the soap.

The shots were raining in on the overworked Macleod and in 75 minutes a move down the left involving Cameron, Paterson and Gray culminated in Jackie Devine volleying his fifteenth goal of the season for No.4. Ten minutes later it was five. Some one touch play from Miller and Thoms left Cameron the scoring chance. The scoring was complete in the final minute. Dave Reilly's shot came off the post and in the melee that followed Ewan notched his hat-trick.

Our league programme is complete a week today when we travel to meet Downfield who are destined to be league runners-up. The Spiders have recovered from their Scottish Cup exit and only last week annexed the Perthshire Advertiser Cup by defeating St Joseph's by 2-0 at McDiarmid Park.

There could be a repeat of that final on June 4th at North End Park on the occasion of the Zamoyski Challenge Cup. Today Downfield travel north to meet Banks o' Dee in one of the semi finals while , also this afternoon, St Joseph's meet Violet at Glenesk.



THE BAKER'S BIT

Free from the spectre of relegation, Harp can afford to look on today's game as an opportunity to extend their season. They certainly held their own in the first half on Wednesday, indeed, had they taken one of a couple of good chances, then it could have been all square at the break.

Eric Manderson showed his threat around the box and at the back Kenny Macleod was in good form. Mike Kelly's ordering off will not prevent him turning out this afternoon.

SC had something of a regular booking in the Whyte & Mackay Cup Final, having been the losers in each of the last three, but this season they went out to East Craigie in the second round.



'DOWN BY THE HARBOUR'

From the Archives

40 YEARS AGO

THE BIGGEST DAY IN HARP'S HISTORY

Saturday 22nd May 1954 is a day to be remembered by all connected with Lochee Harp. That afternoon at Hampden Park, Glasgow eleven players wearing the Harp colours ran out of the famous tunnel to do battle against Aberdeen Sunnybank in the final of the Scottish Junior Cup in front of a crowd of 25,000.

Alas, Harp's bid to lift the famous old trophy was in vain when they went down 1-2 to the team from the north.

On April 24th Harp had drawn with Clydebank (now, of course a Senior club) in the west and this was reckoned to be a tremendous efoort by the Beechwood Park side. Clydebank were at that time the strongest team in the Central League and one of the best supported. They had attracted 80,000 fans to see the 9 Scottish ties which they had played.

The replay was at Dens Park on 8th May 1954, the same week incidentally, that Roger Bannister broke the four minute mile barrier. 28,000 rolled up to Dens Park for the semi final replay, easily beating the previous best for a Junior match at the Dundee ground, 20,000 which watched Violet play Bo'ness in the 5th round in 1948.

The Sporting Post summed the match up thus: "It has been a great game and an amazing one in many respects. Most amazing of all has been the display of McMahon (the Harp 'keeper). Several of his saves bordered on the miraculous although Dame Fortune smiled on him once or twice. Amazing too, were Harp's surprise goals and the fact that the team which had about 80% of the play lost. Final Score - Lochee Harp 2 Clydebank 0. Scorers - Cord and Craig."

There was a debate as to where the final would be played. It had been scheduled for Hampden but there was a lobby of support for an east coast venue (where have we heard this before!). However the officials stuck to their original decision stating that "the crowd would still turn out to see the two shock teams of the tourney"

Harp were in action the week before the final, playing Arbroath at Glenesk in the final of the Forfarshire Cup on 15th May 1954. A crowd of 5,000 was in attendance to see if the Scottish Cup finalists could win the cup for a record 10 times. They lost 1-2 and the papers weren't very charitable reporting "an exhibition like this will not cut much ice at Hampden. Harp never settled against an Arbroath team that provided most of the good football"

And so to Hampden. Supporters buses left the North Tay Street stances at 9am returning at 7pm. Fare 12/6d. The team travelled to Glasgow by train.

Incredible as it may seem now, it wasn't a free day for the local Juniors. The same afternoon Stobswell played St Joseph's in the lst round of the Loftus Cup at East End Park.

Harp were described in the Courier as the more experienced team, with six ex-Seniors in their side.

The Harp colours were worn by the following - McMAHON, JACK and PACIONE; FOX, LOGAN and McCANN; CORD, DUNCAN, CRAIG, BLYTH and COCHRANE. (no subs. in those days).

Aberdeen Sunnybank lined up : J.STEPHEN; HARPER and MURRAY; SIMPSON, SCOTT and GARDEN; CHALMERS, YEOMAN, CRUICKSHANKS, INGRAM and W.STEPHEN.

Duncan put Harp ahead in 14 minutes but Stephen equalised in 22 minutes and Chalmers scored what proved to be the winning goal in 42 minutes.

The Sporting Post carried a photograph of Duncan's goal and summed the match up thus -

"Harp cannot quibble at the result. Sunnybank were well worthy of their victory, especially as they had to play with ten men for a time. They had a fast moving forward line and a very solid defence and were the better team.

Harp kept trying and in the last 15 minutes might have forced the replay if the ball had broken kindly for them. That last minute miss must have been the toughest break seen at Hampden for many a year."

The 'miss' referred to was reported as follows: "..Then, with thirty seconds left comes an astonishing thing. Duncan gets possession and weaves in from the left. He dribbles past the goalkeeper. It looks the equaliser without doubt. But Duncan loses his balance and falls to the ground, and with Craig and Cochrane standing almost on the line waiting to snap the ball home, a defender boots it away. What a tough break for Harp " I should say so!

WHAT ELSE WAS HAPPENING FORTY YEARS AGO IN THE MONTH THAT HARP WERE WRITING THEIR OWN WEE PIECE OF HISTORY ?

The same afternoon the Scottish Juvenile Final was taking place at Denny between Cowie and St Johnstone YM. It almost didn't go ahead however. The previous day at Stirling Sheriff Court Kilsyth St Patrick's had tried to take out an interdict to stop the final taking place!

Tayport Amateurs finished bottom of the Midlands Division 1 (40 years on nothing's changed!).

The Courier ran a story about Tam Lorimer who resided at 43 Castle Street, Tayport. Photographed with his pet Leicester ram, the caption read 'Shepher on the Common looking after his 58 sheep'. It went on to say that Tom was born at White's Buildings in 1871 and had been the first pupil at Tayport School.

A bus tour to Glen Clova cost 5/6d and a 16 day Holiday Tour with Dickson's Tours of 76 Nethergate, Dundee to Paris, Nice, Lugano and Lucerne was £66.

At the Picture House, Tayport at 2pm Jeanne Crain and Jean Peters were starring in "Vicki" while at 7.14pm Dan Dailey was the star of "The Girl Next Door".




