

TODAY'S GAME LOCHER HARD INTERSPORT Pulling on the Harp Strings

Let's face it, the Scottish Cup is generally a bit of a flop. The same teams win it all the time and true shocks are rare. Even when exceptional results occur, like Stranraer's defeat of Falkirk this season, no one notices if the Old Firm are not involved. Every year a couple of strong Highland League teams knock out Albion Rovers and East Stirling much to Chick Young's perennial amazement.

The little publicised Qualifying Cup is more interesting, featuring teams like Golspie Sutherland and Wick Academy (a crude device to get them mentioned in two consecutive editions of TAG). Glasgow University are also allowed in, famous for their 0-15 reverse at St Mirren in 1960, as are Burntisland Shipyard, pride of the Kirkcaldy and District League. The SFA have a hostile attitude to clubs who have not held consecutive membership of the Association. Clubs like Coldstream can play on a park pitch but Peebles Rovers (who have a seated stand) are not because their membership lapsed briefly when they once turned Junior. Needless to say the 170 or so clubs affiliated to the Scottish lunior FA are also barred.

Throw of the Dyce?

Whilst this excludes dozens of good quality teams, several of whom can attract four-figure gates, it does result in that wondrous national beer festival, the Scottish Junior Cup. Although three teams from the weakest North Region made the last 16 this year, there were still the usual hideous mismatches. Newcomers Portgordon made a 500 mile round trip to Ardrossan only to lose 13-0 at Winton Rovers. On the same day "North Aces" (copyright Aberdeen Green Final) Burghead Thistle lost 12-0 to Ormiston Primrose. Surely the modern day equivalent of the Bon Accord / Dundee Harp scenario? Elsewhere Bonnyrigg Rose knocked spots off Dyce to the tune of 9-0. Allegations that Dyce threw the game were fuelled by the fact that 2 were own goals and 2 rebounded in from goalkeeper clearances

Newcomers Portgordon made a 500 mile round trip to Ardrossan only to lose 13-0 at Winton Royers.

A personal highlight came during the 5th round tie between Downfield and Lesmahagow. Nothing happened for 40 minutes then Downfield scored to subdue the mass of Buckfast soaked visiting fans. Seconds later 'Gow had their best player, international midfielder Duncan Sinclair. sent off for his 8th assault of the game. At this point one of their subs, warming up in his tracksuit behind the goal, took offence at comments from a home supporter. He vaulted the perimeter fence and started to batter hell out of an unfortunate Dundonian. for which he too was shown the red card. Downfield eventually won 2-1 with a 40 yard free kick in the last minute.

However all this is but a prelude to my favourite subject, the life and times of Lochee Harp FC. Alert and sober readers may recall an account of last season's cup-tie with Dalkeith Thistle when a Harp player also went in pursuit of an opposition supporter. At least he had the common decency to wait until the final whistle. What

Beastie Boy

Enter Gordon "The Beast" Sinclair whose "aggressive nature was to degenerate into a horrendous reign of terror as the season progressed" to quote the club programme. At first it looked like an inspired signing as The Beast notched goal after goal, brushing aside suspiciously feeble attempts to challenge him from visiting defenders. Things started to go wrong when he resorted to threatening his own team mates when they strayed into goalscoring positions that were rightfully his. The club's management team became concerned, that is to say: Manager - Jim Kelly; Physio -Albert Kelly: Treasurer - Jack Kelly: Committee Member - Harry Kelly; Team Captain - Mike Kelly; Catering - Jacqueline Kelly and Diane Kelly; Public Relations -Michael Kelly (OK the last one's not true but the rest are I swear). Matters came to a head when Harp drew Islavale away in the Zamovski Cup. The game was played in Buckie and The Beast became irritable during the long bus journey. On arrival he announced that he was hungry, causing several committee men to flee fearing cannibalism. Making do with a handful of pies The Beast belched his way onto the park and was recognised by some local fans from his time with Deveronvale

in the Highland League. Regrettably he misinterpreted the friendly North East greeting "fit like loon?" (how are you lad for English readers) as 'do you wanna fight va lunatic?" Complete communication breakdown followed when the fan took The Beast's offer of a "Beeche Kiss" as a sexual advance and proceeded to loudly question his gender preferences from the terracing. No self-respecting Beast could take that lying down so naturally he left the field of play to chase his antagonist around the ground. Play was uninterrupted and the referee seemed strangely reluctant to speak to Sinclair. When the final whistle blew players and supporters fled in all directions. The Beast defected to Dundee Violet in the close season and returned to face Harp at Beechwood Park this year. Alas my contact's bananas were unsuccessful diversions and he only escaped when The Beast tripped over his psychotic dog.

Lochec Harp's season, never uneventful, had already featured a stupendous Junior Cup tie at Central League giants Petershill. The players who boarded the 1977 Glenisla Coach Hire Special could scarcely have sensed the glories to come as they were enveloped in a cloud of black exhaust furnes. The driver's attrie of several thick woollen jumpers, waterproofs and dufflecoat suggested all was not well with the heating system. A fan heater dangling from the side by a wire near his head confirmed this

The journey passed earnestly discussing tactics using empty packets of Woodbines and cans of Special Brew as props. It was agreed - pack the defence and boot the ball to all parts of Springburn to avoid a total gubbing. On arrival the Harp supporters courteously mingled with their hosts in the social club, politely taking bets of 8/1 on an away win. The whisky raffle was entered, won and swallowed in quick succession. The first 20 minutes of the match saw the policy of utter desperation work well and the defence stood firm. Not for nothing is only one of Harp's registered players listed as a forward, 37 year old Eric Mandelson.

Then the impossible - a huge punt upfield bounced off Big Rico's head for Steve Higgins to toe poke a goal. Two minutes later, with the Harp support still prostrate on the vast terracing. Tony Lacey made it 2-0. Half time arrived and the fans steadied their nerves with a well-carned bucket of beer. Goalie Kenny McLeod played a blinder, the Peasies pulled a goal back but Harp held on for a famous victory. Players, supporters and dog kissed the turf. Kenny McLeod's dad, who had previously disowned him on numerous occasions, proclaimed his son to be the new Messiah.

Jim "my team selection was an inspiration" Kelly led the jubilant team into the Social Club for the usual buffer, only to the find the Harp support had devoured the lot. The bus home required 5 "relief" stops. Its highlight was when treasurer Kelly, still distressed by the uncharacteristic generosity of manager Kelly, in handing out free club ties, tried to retrieve one from the neck of a semi-conscious player. Other Kelly's broke

up the ensuing fight and mercifully the bus arrived back in Dundee to disgorge its drunken load.

It was Harp's greatest day since the 1992 Consolation League Cup victory, later chalked off for fielding ineligible players. Watch out - next year the Beeche Barmy Army could be in a town near you!

THE BAKER'S BIT

Tonight we entertain Lochee Harp for the third time this month. I'd like to take this opportunity to welcome their players and officials back to the Canniepairt.

Firstly, I'd like to address Monday's performance versus Carnoustie Panmure. Over the past four seasons we've seen records tumble in our wake, all of course excellent achievements, of which I am very proud. Well, on Monday night we managed to reach another milestone. Tayport F.C.'s heaviest defeat in our short history, 2-5. This game had so many similarities to a defeat earlier this season, 2-3 at Jeanfield. I remember for 25-30 minutes we totally dominated the game, playing some excellent football, going 2-0 ahead and then we stopped.

On Monday we did exactly the same. At half time we concentrated on just keeping things going - pushing for a third goal which in turn could lead to five or six. 'There are more goals in this game' were my words. And for all the wrong reasons my prediction was correct.

It was pointed out to the players that we must stop particular Carnoustie players from dropping balls over our back four. It didn't happen. Our second half performance was the worst I have ever seen from this team. 'Disgraceful' is the only word I can think of to describe it and I don't mind telling you that I was ashamed to be associated with it. I absolutely hate to lose but would accept defeat if the players had given 100% for the club and fans but that wasn't the case. I saw for the first time in my days at the club, Tayport players' heads drop. In my mind that's totally unacceptable.

On a positive note, after that league defeat at Jeanfield, we went on to win the first division title.

Tonight we play Lochee Harp in the Intersport Shield 2nd round. Our players have an opportunity to repay our support with an improved performance and better attitude. I'll accept no less and our players willbe left in no doubt where they stand.

'DOWN BY THE HARBOUR'

TODAY'S GAME

Lochee Harp visit the Canniepairt this evening for the third time in as many weeks. On this occasion it is a second round tie in the Intersport Shield and the Beechwood side will be anxious to avoid a third successive defeat this season on the Canniepairt. In fact they've yet to beat us in any of the previous eleven meetings of the sides. Mind you, neither had Carnoustie before Monday night!

Monday evening's results involving today's participants have put a slightly different slant on tonight's proceedings. Harp secured first division safety with a 2-1 win over St Josephs and, as a result, will be in relaxed mood for the game.

We crashed to our heaviest ever defeat - 5v2 at home to Carnoustie Panmure - equalling the losing margin of three goals against Pollok in the 190/91 season. The Carnoustie result was astonishing. CUP FINAL HIGH JINKS SURE TO HAVE REPERCUSSIONS

The OVD Scottish Cup Final certainly caught the attention of the media - after the game! There's no doubt that the Largs win was overshadowed by the four sendings-off which put the final firmly in the public eye with the national press and television seizing on the opportunity of a good story.

The Duncan Ferguson saga has made headbutting issues big news and how the press have loved it! We read about the SJFA withholding the sponsors' cash pending an enquiry, indignation when Glasgow's Procurator Fiscal decided to take no action and about Largs' disgraced captain Jimmy Murray having the audacity to appear on the rostrum to receive the cup in front of a live television audience. My goodness, Gerry and Gordon couldn't believe it! The SJFA say it won't happen again and are to investigate the circumstances which allowed it to happen.

What'll the outcome be? Well, OVD whilst not condoning the players' behaviour, say that they are happy to continue with the sponsorship — I'll bet they are. This song and dance has given OVD more exposure than they could ever have expected.

The SJFA will sit down and fine both clubs heavily and suspend the four players involved. They will also lay down directives about ordered off players not being presented with their medals.

Headbutting is always a contentious issue in football. Amateur clubs' players must get a minimum one year ban from all football if ordered off for the merest suggestion of a headbutt. Duncan Ferguson got 12 games yet the referee didn't even send him off and it's only a couple of years ago that Clydebank's Ken Eadie nutted an opponent in a match shown on TV, yet only missed his side's next match and collected some penalty points. Some consistency is called for in Scottish football.

What about the Cup Final itself? It was a much better spectacle than last season, it must be said, but Glenafton weren't much better. They seemed to be biding their time, hoping for the inevitable breakthrough, but things ran away from them after the break.

Largs weren't overawed by the occasion and stuck to their task. Barnstaple in the goal was coolness personified. Davie Elliot was an inspiration in midfield with his tireless running while up front McCurdy and Quigg gave Glens' defence no time to settle

With the SFA refusing to allow the final to be played at Hampden, Rangers stepped in with Ibrox and a fine setting for the final it proved to be. The attraction of Ibrox certainly helped swell the crowd to 8,668, some 2,000 odd more than attended at Firhill last season.

Dave Baikie was a guest at the final in his capacity as the manager of the Tayside Select XI and Tayport were further represented by a busload who took up their places at the Largs end no doubt wistfully thinking back to last year and what might have been. Ah well, there's always next year.




