

I remember the morning before Tayport's Scottish Cup semi final. I was in the bathroom cutting myself shaving when the phone rang. It was Lou -"just phoning to wish you and the boys all the best - go for it". Then the morning after the night before when I eventually surfaced, the first voice which I heard on the answering machine was Lou's. "Well done, Davie, magic". We may or may not physically see him again, but he'll always be with us.

Tonight our players have an opportunity to help ease Downfield's fixture problems and in so doing reach another semi final. But we all know, that to achieve that, our attitude must be correct. I've every confidence in our ability to achieve just that.



### TODAY'S GAME

THIS evening Downfield pay their eighth visit to the Canniepairt for a third round (quarter final) tie in the Intersport Shield. The sides have met on one occasion previously in this competition, a 1-0 win for the Port here on the Canniepairt in 1991. It was a match missed by Dave Baikie who was abroad on holiday.

GAMES between the sides always tend to be close affairs with more than one goal separating the teams on only three occasions. Two of those occasion were this season with the Spiders winning the December Perthshire Advertiser Cuptie by 2-0 and Tayport winning the league game in August on the Canniepairt by 3-0. Downfield went on to lift the P.A.Cup and we, of course went on to lift the League Championship.

THE most recent meeting was only ten days ago when an entertaining contest at Downfield finished all square. Both teams have had their problems with injuries, Wilkie, Hunter, Paterson and Devine giving Tayport most cause for concern for tonight.

Since we last met on the 14th of this month Downfield have recorded cup victories at Scone and Bankfoot and on Monday of this week defeated St Joseph's by 2-0 to give the Fairfield side a tenth league zero.

TAYPORT lost by that shock scoreline at home to Carnoustie a week past Monday but returned to winning form at home to Lochee Harp last Friday evening. It was far from a vintage performance from th Port but, on a cold and windy night, the Port Support were warmed up by two cracking goals from Ewan Cameron, both scored in the second half. Tonight's tie is our reward for beating Harp.

ALTHOUGH the pitches tend to be hard and bumpy after a tough season (not to mention car boot sales as far as the Canniepairt is concerned), both sides possess enough skill and craft in their respective lineups to give the spectators an enjoyable evening.

#### Matches to Remember Nos 10 and 11

Coupar Angus Juniors v Lochee Harp 27th March 1993 Coupar Angus Amateurs v Blairgowrie Amateurs 27th March 1993

In the overall grand scheme of things in the Scottish game Coupar Angus FC occupy a desperately unenviable position. Forget yer Cowdenbeaths and Albion Rovers - at least they can get a few patronising articles written about them in the press if things get tough - when it comes to Strathmore's finest we're talking about a ride in a rusty mini-bus from hell down desolation alley Not only do they inhabit that crabbit compassion-free zone known as Junior football; they also happen to belong to the Tayside Regional League which has for a long time now been virtually synonymous with mournful recitals of heavy casualty lists in The Dundee Courier following clashes with teams of smug'n'ugly psychopaths from the West of Scotland in the Scottish Cup. Even worse, Coupar find themselves anchored in the Second Division of said league, mixing it with such soccer down and outs as Luncarty (possibly the worst team in Scotland - see TAG 34) and Balbeggie (possibly the only team in Scotland to have been beaten by Luncarty in living memory). If there is any consolation for them in all of this it is that many of their ferociously despised local rivals are just as diabolically awful as they are at the moment. A quick glance at the final standings for the Tayside Second Division last season reveals the nearest example to a perfect natural order since that master tactician Charlie Darwin published his best seller on team selection a few years back all bottom 6 places were occupied by Perthshire village clubs

Aye, it's not been easy for the teuchter outfits to make much of an impression since the Juniors scene was regionalised in 1969. This major earthquake in footballing terms measuring 4-3-3 on the Richter scale brought about the destruction of the cosy paternalistic concensus that had hitherto existed in Perthshire football. Amongst other endearing features this included periodic gestures of benevolence on the part of PJFA officials whereby new cup competitions would suddenly be created so as to ensure that even the most hopelessly inept of their member clubs ended up with a piece of silverware every now and again even if it didn't amount to much more than a used milk bottle top. It was not without good reason that one tournament was called the Consolation Cup. Suddenly however these-humble country teams found themselves thrown in with such Super League pretenders as Downfield, Lochee United and, er, Carnoustie Panmure. Not so much a case of men against boys; more like a school of killer whales against a batch of badly undernourished plankton. Hell, even the likes of Brechin Vics and Montrose Roselea took on the status of big bastard clubs in this context.

A Turnip For the Books
Sadly the Perthshire clubs had litle option
but to accept the new world order. Faced

with stiff competition from live televised Rugby League (ah, the seductive allure of Eddie Waring, Wakefield Trinity and Featherstone Rovers) and tattie- picking it was always a struggle to attract crowds and make ends meet. Quite a few went the way of Comrie Rovers to that great communal bath tub in the sky in the post-war years. For those who did survive it was a case of getting by on a shoe-string, with, for instance, transfer fees often involving a couple of well-worn florins along with a bag of neeps, a few fence posts and some binder twine thrown in as sweeteners. The haemorrhaging has continued up until recent times with the disappearance of such famous (ahem) names as Alyth United and Crieff Earngrove. Only the foolhardy recklessness of Balbeggie and Scone Thistle, who elected to step up from the amateur/juvenile ranks, went against the

There have admittedly been some successes to report. Blairgowrie, with 4 championship wins in 6 seasons in the early- mid 70s were a formidable side. But then again Blairgowrie's always been something of a formidable place. Of all the many colourful and poetic descriptions that have been applied to the town over the years - eg "picturesque", "thriving", "gateway to the Highlands", etc - it's always seemed to me that "tough as fuck" is the one that comes closest to the mark. I still have vivid memories of a torrid Cup game there some years back being marred by persistent outbreaks of crowd trouble which culminated in a brick being lobbed through the window of the visitors' team bus. When you consider that the match in question was a Perthshire Schools Under-14 Shield tie, it perhaps gives you a flavour of the, em, fevered passions football summons amongst the natives up there.

The last few seasons have been particularly grim for the teuchters collective. Just how, for instance, Luncarry have managed to survive whilst undergoing their great winless sequence must rank up there with the origins of the universe and the identity of the person who started the "Mo Johnston-for-Scotland-again" debate as one of the great unsolved mysteries of our times.

Country Life
If anything the situation is probably even
more desperate at Balbeggie, coming as
they do from a village whose entire
population could just about be housed in
half a dozen telephone boxes. Give them
their due though, the club has always shown

a commendable aptitude for experimentation to keep the grim reaper (or local bank manager as he's better known) at bay. They remain, for example, the only club in Tayside to play in a purpose-built out-of-village stadium. Sited in the middle of a farm on the verdant plains of Strathmore, the thinking behind Redford Park was clearly to alleviate the potentially crippling match-day congestion caused by supporters mingling with combine harvesters, tractors, and stray sheep on Balbeggie Main St. Who cares if they got a bit carried away and that the ground's so far away from the village that it's roughly equivalent to Aberdeen playing their home matches somewhere just south of

Balbeggie have also been at the forefront of moves to bring in foreign imports to add a touch of class to the Tayside Division 2 dogfight. Alas this bold initiative, involving the payment of petrol expenses for a car load of likely lads to make the weekly drive up from Edinburgh did not appear to reap the expected dividends - language and cultural differences being cited as the prime factors Not to be deterred. Scone Thistle went one stage further a few seasons back and signed a Dutchman by the name of and no, unlike the rest of this article this isn't made up - Peter Van Der Ham. A first hand introduction to the rarified concepts of total football you ask? No not really - it's been a long-standing tradition in the region that any player in any position should be versatile enough to rake his studs down an

opponents' shins. And as far as Coupar Angus are concerned, well they've just boldly carried on being Coupar Angus: ie bumping along the basement zone of Division 2. Today, however, all this was forgotten as yet another knockout competition - the Whyte and Mackay Cup - got underway with a match against Lochee Harp. In other words Teuchters v Smart-arsed Toonies. Coupar's ground, Foxhall Park, with its mini stand and enclosed setting was probably a neat wee place in times gone by, but has clearly suffered from the patented decades of neglect syndrome. Where did all the money go in those glory years when they were winning the Consolation Cup? No sooner had I paid the £1 admission price than I came across a couple of Harp supporters sneering a bit snootily at the backward ways of these Perthshire peasants on the basis that there wasn't a match programme on offer. All very well for them, of course, living it up off their giros in their opulent multi-storey council tower blocks .... Coupar Angus emerged to a warm welcome from a home support of about 8 strong in number. Resplendent in their red and black striped tops I tried hard to think of what else they might have in common with AC Milan, but having been only able to come up with

A Walk On The Wild Side

One of the disconcerting things about dropping into such sparsely attended fixtures is that you tend to stand out a mile, like some kind of gate-crasher at a masonic gathering. Eventually I was accosted by a bunneted old gent who, with little by way of an introduction, launched into the anticipated cross-examination of my reasons for being there. I immediately reeled off the opening sentences of the my 10,000 word treatise on the rank awfulness of St Johnstone, and the Premier League in general, but I could see he was rapidly losing interest. In an attempt to revive the conversation I sought his opinion on Coupar's chances:

"Ach ah wouldnae ken, ah'm only here for a walk" came the grumpy response. Teach me for being nosey I suppose.

And the game itself? Well let's just say I'm conscious of the fact that that venerable institution, the National Library of Scotland, takes copies of this fanzine and it would be a criminal waste of scarce resources if I were to take up more than the bare minimum of their precious microfiche trying to describe its genuinely memorable moments. Let's just say it was a war of attrition as games often are at this level. Basically things tend to be fairly even until last night's cocktail of Tennents Extra Strong and deep fried sludge burgers catches up with the inferior side, resulting in a deluge of goals in the last 20 minutes. Construct a bar chart of the time distribution of goals scored in Junior football and you're likely to end up with a profile which bears a quite uncanny resemblance to that which you might see walking along a beach and suddenly coming face to face with a 200ft cliff. Needless to say the score at the interval was 1-0 to Haro.

I was just beginning to wonder what form the half-time entertainment might take when I became aware of sporadic yelps and cries of anguish in the distance. Unless I was mistaken it sounded remarkably like.....a game of football! (ie something in complete contrast to what I'd been watching these past 45 minutes) I had to investigate. Meandering out of the garden gate, or Foxhall's emergency exit to give it its formal designation. I hiked about 100 yards

along the road and entered Victory Park well, at least with a name like that you could never be lulled into thinking it was the home of Coupar Angus juniors.....

Amateur Dramatics

Swerving round hordes of marauding toddlers playing on swings, chutes, and their parents' better natures, my eyes set upon a veritable feast of unbridled welly and clatter. At times all twenty outfield players seemed to coalesce into a heaving mass, steam billowing from their grotesque acrylic tops which more often than not were straining beyond the reasonable bounds of elasticity at the midriff. Just to add to the fun the game was being played on a pitch of such extraordinary gradient it would have been quite in order to query as to whether the nearby Highland Boundary Fault had, after a few million years of inactivity, decided to give itself a shoogle about again. There was a perceptibly bigger crowd hereat least 10 more - so a rap on the knuckles for the Tayside Junior FA for not getting its computerised fixture programming right. It has to be said that the amateur game was a pleasingly even affair (the pitch excepted of course) with both sides demonstrating an apparently infinite capacity to blaze the ball over from a variety of shooting positions. Perhaps this is a reflection of the more egalitarian nature of the Perthshire Amateur leagues. Even places like Kettins, Newtyle and Burrelton - unlikely to rival the Great Wall of China as the first thing to come into view if you were an alien from outer space having a keek through a telescope - can stand proud and fight their corner.

After a while of watching the clash of the derby day neanderthals I was beginning to enjoy myself, which rightly set the alarm bells ringing. What the hell was I doing here? Hadn't I paid good money to watch the Coupar-Harp game. Damn it I had to go hack

Harping On

On my return to Foxhall Park I discovered Harp had established their superiority in a decisive fashion. Indeed they were now indulging in what must be regarded as the ultimate in piss-taking in Junior football playing a passing game. When their fourth went in a couple of apparently long-suffering local upped sticks from the rickety old enclosure and announced to all in hearing range that they "were no fuckin coming back again". While one may dismiss this as a familiar routine at almost any ground around 4.30 on a Saturday afternoon, when 25% of your support decides en masse to quit for good you've got the kind of crisis that has the club treasurer asking for a direct line to the Samaritans on your hands. By the final whistle Harp had ran in five. It

had been a momentous afternoon. After all it's not every Saturday that you witness a genuinely pioneering concept being introduced to the beautiful game. Coupar Angus's unveiling of football's equivalent of the multi-screen cinema had been a winner - two starkly contrasting programmes to appeal to the most divergent tastes of all discerning punters (even if it was strictly 18 certificate stuff). And for all you heel-dragging Luddites out there disdainful of the relentless march of progress through the heart of sleepy teuchterland, just remember there are a few things which are still sacrosanct, immutable and beyond the means of man to change - ie the age-old juxtaposition of the words "Coupar Angus" and "crap".




