TODAY'S VISITORS

KINNOULL are the visitors this afternoon in the first round of the PERTHSHIRE CUP, the final of which is played at McDiarmid Park where the sponsors always do the contestants well in terms of hospitality. We of course have twice had the pleasure of sampling that hospitality as winners in 1990/91 and runners up last season. With the final just along the road from Kinnoull 's trim and tidy Tulloch Park, the Perth lads will be anxious to go all the way.

With a run of five games unbeaten, Kinnoull can rightly feel confident over the outcome of today's game, particularly as they have yet to taste defeat on their travels and have yet to fail to find their opponents' net.

As Kinnoull showed in the goalless league game between the sides a fortnight ago they are not the soft touch that they were last season when they achieved notoriety by twice getting themselves in our record books.

Manager at Tulloch Park is ALAN SMART who is in his second spell in charge and also played for the club for a number of seasons. Alan is assisted by ANDY DOTT, the club's longest serving player, having given twenty three years service during which he was twice voted the Region's Player of the Year. Player/coach is DONALD ELSTOB who joined the club this season from Balbeggie.

In goal today will be MIKE WHYTE who will be going for a third shutout in as many weeks. Signed in 1987/88 and actually played in goal against local rivals Jeanfield when aged only 14. Fullback COLIN LEESE played two weeks ago but the player signed last season from Balbeggie is likely to miss today through injury. RICHARD VANNETT is a recent acquisition from Brechin City on a delayed transfer. Has hit two goals this season. WAYNE MORRISON, one of three policemen in the Kinnoull squad, joined from Jeanfield six years ago. A fullback or midfielder, Wayne has representative honours with Tayside. Sweeper IAN PATERSON joined the club this season after six years at Brechin City. Central defender WILLIE ROBSON is the club's current player of the year. Joined up three seasons ago from Scone Thistle. CRAIG MAILER has played in every position for the club including goalkeeper. Has hit five goals this season from midfield. Was Senior for a spell with St Johnstone. GARY MAHER, a midfielder who joined up this season from Auchterarder Primrose but who has had Senior experience with Montrose and St Johnstone, will likely fill the left midfield role.

Striker DAVID HUTTON is another newcomer, having signed up from Scone Thistle. Had Senior experience with Dunfermline Athletic. MICHAEL FULTON arrived this season from the Amateur grade where he was a prolific marksman. Most recently with Murray Royal from where he joined Kinnoull. Two goals to his credit this season. DEREK WALKER. Striker who has seen many years service with the club and is one of the few who can remember playing at 'The Bowl'. Had Senior spells with St Johnstone and Chesterfield where he spent two very successful years. Netted the winner against Forfar West End last week.

GRAEME WILKIE. Midfielder or fullback who signed from Bankfoot two seasons ago. Was substitute against the Port two weeks ago along with BRUCE ROBERTSON, a forward who came from Bankfoot in a recent swap deal which saw Mark Stewart move in the opposite direction. IAN CAMERON. Defender and another ex-Bankfoot man. Has just joined the Strathclyde Police. The team's other keeper is NEIL FERGUSON, a Transport Policeman who formerly played for local rivals Jeanfield. Garry Christie, a claims negotiator with insurance giants G.A., is a forward who signed recently from Lochmuir Boys Club. DEAN LAING had a spell Senior with Arbroath but has been with Kinnoull since 1986/87. Plays fullback. JOHN FOTHERINGHAM joined up from Scone Thistle for a second spell at Tulloch Park. Has had injury problems and the forward has yet to start a competitive match this season.

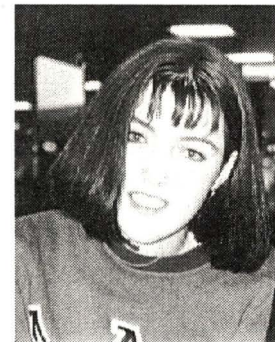

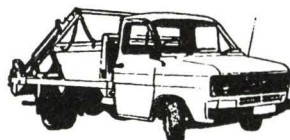

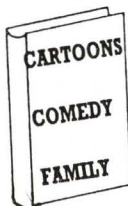

20 YEARS AGO..... ON THE 29th SEPTEMBER 1973

Overall we were found lacking in awareness in every department.

It is disturbing that, after a relatively stable start to the season, we should now be lacking in determination. Commitment and the correct attitude are what's required and I intend to rectify these failings before you read this. Nevertheless, some of the football played by the side in the second half last Saturday was encouraging but we must not forget that it is results that count.
