TAYPORT PLAYERS IN SCOTTISH SQUAD

There was a great boost for the club earlier this week when it was revealed that Dave Reilly and Hamish Mackay had been selected for the Scotland Junior International Team to meet the Republic of Ireland at Bo'ness on Saturday week. Both had impressed manager Dick Brock whilst playing for a Scotland X1 against Raith Rovers at Linlithgow recently.

It's deserved recognition for both players who showed that if you consistently produce the goods then your chance will come. Dave has been outstanding for the club since signing from Lawside FP amateurs. In only three seasons Dave has played 155 competitive games for us scoring 124 goals in those games. A class act, Dave's skills are a delight to watch.

For Hamish it's second time around for International honours, having been capped for Scotland as a Lochee Harp player before going Senior with Montrose. Hamish actually played in the Scottish Junior Centenary International versus the Republic of Ireland back in 1986. Hamish only joined up at the Canniepairt in March 1992 but has already notched 55 goals despite playing a large proportion of his 83 games for the club in defence.



THE BAKER'S BIT

Carnoustie Panmure provide our league opposition today and I'd like to give a warm welcome to the Canniepairt to their players and officials and a good afternoon to the Port Support.

The club received a great boost last weekend with the International call-up of Dave Reilly and Hamish Mackay. Brilliant news from my point of view. It's not only a great honour for the players concerned but for everyone connected with Tayport FC. I'm sure all will agree they couldn't have picked two better ambassadors for our cause and join me in wishing them all the best next Saturday. Hopefully, with Arbroath SC's approval to our request for an early kick-off, we'll all be at Bo'ness to give them every support. It would be great if the Port Support was there also (What about it?)

As far as last week's away league encounter at Glenesk Park was concerned, with the conditions being as they were, our away form not having been of the quality required and Violet making a better than normal start to the season, it could have turned out to be one of those difficult games but it wasn't to be the case. Our players adapted well to the conditions and we played more to the standard we've set at the club. The 2-0 scoreline completely flattered Violet. We dominated from start to finish and, from my point of view, the shutout was every bit as important as the numerous chances that we created. We now must build on this and take it into today's game.

Our visitors this afternoon sit 4th in the table and only ourselves have scored more goals. I don't need to remind our players of our two league encounters last season with them but I will! Two goals in the last ten minutes at Carnoustie allowed us to go home with a point and at the Canniepairt they were the only side to score more than two goals against us in our 5-3 victory. It goes without saying - we can't afford to let our standards drop. The quality is here and it's beginning to show itself again. I say to our players- let's take another step forward today with a victory.

A number of newspapers these days seem to have Question & Answer features where one reader poses a question and other readers are invited to send in an answer.

THE LONG HAUL TO FIRHILL GETS UNDERWAY

Although Forfar Albion and Buchanhaven Hearts kicked off the 1993/94 OVD Scottish Junior Cup at Guthrie Park last Saturday (Albion went down 1-2), the competition gets underway in earnest today with the remainder of first round ties down to be played. Holders Glenafton and ourselves sit this one out , however, both clubs having received byes into the second round on 13th November.

Biggest tie in these parts is at Forfar where West End are hosts to Pollok. Now, for some clubs, going out of the Scottish Cup at an early stage is no big deal. For Pollok, though, it is nothing short of disastrous. Pollok went out in the 4th round two seasons ago and in the second round last season. To tumble out in the first would be unthinkable for the Newlandsfield support. Pollok signed Gordon Mills, Auchinleck Talbot's top scorer during the close season and last Saturday swooped to sign Renfrew's Billy McLafferty. After such investments, nothing short of victory will do. Forfar West End's preparation hasn't been ideal, with only 90 minutes competitive football under their belts during the last two weeks. One consolation is that the opposition spies have had only really had last week's draw v Carnoustie to assess their opponents' current form. The previous week's Perthshire Advertiser Cup tie at home to Lochee United was postponed.


Top tie in the town is at Downfield Park where East Region Champions Fauldhouse are the visitors. Downfield are back to something like their more recognisable form after a dismal start to the season and have climbed to second place in the League. The Spiders will take heart from the fact that Fauldhouse were eliminated at this stage last season when North End beat them after a replay.

Harp will fancy their chances at home to Aberdeen East End who made their exit at the Canniepairt last season. Round the corner at Glenesk, Elmwood take on Tranent where a win for the locals is on the cards. Up at Kirrie, Thistle will have to put the hems on prolific Lochee United marksman Darren Taylor to have any chance of going through. East Craigie make the long trip to Saltcoats to meet the local Vics., last season's Ayrshire 2nd Division Champions.

Violet have a tall task at Shettleston when they take on West of Scotland Cup holders. Shettleston showed last season at the Canniepairt that they are one of the best footballing sides in the competition.

Two of the top ties of the round are in Glasgow where Cambuslang play Central champions Petershill and Yoker meet the in form Arthurlie. In Ayrshire the big two of Auchinleck and Cumnock will be rattling in the goals against northern duo Formartine and Kinloss respectively.

A healthy crowd will be drawn to Gorebridge where second division Arniston Rangers will be hoping to provide a cup upset by knocking out first division neighbours and prospective members of the Scottish League, Newtongrange Star. Also in the Lothians, Livingston United will steeling themselves for their joust with those doughty cup fighters from Fife, Hill of Beath Hawthorn. Other former holders Glenrothes are experiencing lean times these days and cannot be too hopeful of progressing at the expense of Rosyth Recreation, despite having home advantage.

TODAY'S VISITORS

This afternoon we welcome CARNOUSTIE PANMURE to the Canniepairt for the first time this season to contest a McEwan's Lager League Division One match. Since promotion in 1991/92 have established themselves once again in the top flight although their form tailed off a bit towards the end of last season and they finished 9th, a position which would have disappointed their hard working committee.

Any recent visit to their Westfield Park ground would indicate that Panmure are on a sound commercial footing and this season's form suggests that, on the field things are looking up. A 3-5 home reverse at the hands of Downfield the other week, in the day's only league match, deprived the Gowfers of the chance of joining ourselves on equal points at the top of the table. And then a point from last week's home game with Forfar West End would be considered a point dropped.

Goals don't seem to be a problem with Panmure, however, and until that 1-1 draw, they had netted at least two goals in each of their previous 9 league games this season. With 26 goals they have shown that they know the road to goal. Defensively things don't look so rosy with only one clean sheet this season. Indeed their 21 goals conceded is the division's worst apart from bottom markers Arbroath Vics. On paper,therefore, the fans should be treated to plenty goals today, but, as we've seen before, things don't always work out that way.

With regular keeper Brian Murray on holiday and 18 years old Andy Duguid their back up goalie who played at Ibrox for Arbroath in the BP Youth Cup, semi final against Rangers, choosing to play with Harris FP amateurs, Carnoustie are likely to have a trialist in goal this afternoon.

At fullback will be the pony-tailed MARK N. KELLY who is on a delayed transfer from Arbroath FC. PAUL MASSON (pictured right) is similarily attached to Montrose but the youngster could be a doubtful starter after suffering concussion against Forfar WE last week. Local lad DES LOUDEN is back at Westfield after a spell at Arbroath SC. ALAN RICHARD will be a certain starter in defence. Alan was signed last season from Mugiemoss Ams. in Aberdeen and still lives up north, travelling down for matches and training once a week. MARK BENNETT, the experienced player/manager, is one of the few players who has played for all four Angus senior clubs. Out of the side recently he is expected to be on today. ALAN RAMSAY is a wholehearted midfielder who is also expected to return today after injury. Impressed in recent Scottish trial at Perth. Two ex Dundee players STUART FORSYTH and LEX RICHARDSON will be in contention for places. Forsyth's availability depends on his police shifts while Lex, no spring chicken these days is used sparingly. Two players well known to Canniepairt fans are GARY CHRISTIE and DAVIE RAE. Both were members of Tayport's



inaugural squad when the club embarked on the Junior trail back in August 1990 but things didn't work out. Rae went back amateur while Gary has since been Senior with Montrose. Rae has been placed on the transfer list by Carnoustie, unhappy at failing to hold down a regular place. GEORGE BLACK and GRAEME NICOL have returned to Westfield after leaving during Ian Fleming's regime. STEVIE BLACK is a third Panmure player with a Tayport connection having played with the club's successful Alliance side of a couple of years ago. BILLY MEARNS is a fast, nippy midfielder who joined from Arbroath SC. Work could keep striker JOHN HENDRIE out. Missing through holidays is top marksman Alan Cranston so for goals the yisitors will look to the other MARK KELLY, signed from Arbroath and also with 5 goals to his name. GARY HAILSTONES ex Wishaw Juniors completes the pool.

No Roddy McCafferty to pen the 'Amateur Angle' this week. Roddy resigned following the 4-1 defeat at Morgan FP a fortnight ago.


