



Treasure Islands

Duncan MacKay reports on that most prestigious of international competitions that every pro dreams of playing in — that's right, the Inter-Island Games Football Tournament.

Would Shetland be able to gub the Isle of Wight?

Reproduced here by kind permission of 'The Absolute Game', Scotland's premier fanzine, available locally from Groucho's, Marketgait, Dundee

As the world now knows, what was described as the biggest sporting event to be held in Britain since 1966 (no, I don't know what happened then either) passed off successfully in July. I refer of course to the fifth biennial inter-island games staged on the Isle of Wight when 19 islands competed in 16 sports. They came from far (the Falklands whose netball team crashed unluckily 2-99 v Jersey) and wide (Greenland or Kallaallit Nunaat as they now prefer). Sark sent their entire police force - team manager Constable Paul Williams - whilst Scotland's representatives were Orkney and Shetland.

The interest in the games for many was the football tournament, involving 8 teams. Group A featured Isle of Wight, Isle of Man, Aland Islands from Finland and our adopted favourites Shetland. Group B included Greenland, Ynys Mon (Anglesey), Jersey and Gibraltar, whose inclusion related to the fact that Spain had vetoed their application for FIFA membership rather than a sudden geographical separation.

Across the Seven Grounds

Seven grounds were used, attracting some senior groundhoppers who had recently watched football in exotic places like Ecuador, Kuala Lumpar and Coatbridge. The man who also collects bingo halls and laundrettes (that is seriously sad - Ed) was absent as were the holders, the Faeroe Islands following their elevation to higher things. Beaten finalists Ynys Mon were number one seeds following their extra time reverse two years ago whilst Guernsey pulled out after Brentford refused to release their two professional players. The Isle of Wight's semi-professional squad were expected to do well although Barnsley and Portsmouth also refused to free two players. All competitors had to be born on their island or been resident there for two years. The Aland Islands team contained Under-21 Finnish internationals and professionals playing in the Swedish league. Jersey's side consisted largely of exiles from Central Scotland who had inexplicably exchanged the cafe bars and bistros of Motherwell for the sun, sea and shin pads of St Helier. The real

minnows were expected to be Shetland, Gibraltar and Greenland. However, Greenland's mainly eskimo team had trained on grass in Norway for several weeks, forsaking the indoor hangar that constitutes their normal venue. Gibraltar have no grass facilities, using Astroturf pitches when able to supplant hockey, the top sport there. Shetland have a nine team league, all of whom sent at least one player to the squad. The majority came from Lerwick sides - Thistle, Celtic, Royal and Spurs - and had paid their own way. The handful of us who had travelled south naturally devoted our vocal and flag-waving support for the Shetlanders, even replacing the saltire with the islands' flag.

Condomnation

All participants were issued with free contraceptives prompting local councillors to condemn the "bonking games". Spectators were disappointed not to be issued with commemorative inscribed condoms at the opening match, between Isle of Wight and Isle of Man at Newport. There was a unique atmosphere with many of the 1500 alleged "athletes" on the island attending. The Manx team included Rob Wakenshaw who once scored the winning goal for Everton at Old Trafford but they were forced to defend for much of a fiercely competitive match, eventually losing by a single goal. The watching Gibraltar squad, when not distracted by the nearby presence of the Isle of Man netball team, vowed they would try to "play football". Their first opportunity to do so came at Shanklin the following afternoon, where they were gently eased to a 1-2 defeat by Jersey. 437 watched this bizarre "international" a feature of which was the manic interruptions of a deranged announcer perched on top of the clubhouse underneath an umbrella resembling a satellite dish.

Finn Hopes

The next game kicked off at 5pm at Brading Town's ground, a chance for the mighty Shetland to give the Aland Islands a right good gubbing. Our brave boys picked their way nimbly past some solid Scandinavian defenders to take an early lead. Michael

Williamson stormed down the wing and crossed for Thistle's Ewan Oddie to coolly slot home and set off jubilant touchline celebrations. Williamson's direct running, such an asset when racing for the ferry on his native island of Whalsay, almost made it 2-0 before a shameful decision by the English Football League referee set off a chain of disastrous events. A bad interpretation of the back pass law gave Aland a chance to level and within a minute they had taken the lead. As the game went on Aland played with increasing style to run out 3-1 winners. The Finns carried live radio coverage of the game and clearly expected to do well in the tournament.

No time to rest - the third game of the day was at Cowes between Greenland and Ynys Mon. The latter contained several players from North Wales League football of a reasonable standard whilst their opponents finished last two years earlier. Within 5 minutes a soft penalty award confirmed fears that this would be a one-sided affair. However the Welsh centre half hit the bar and the Greenland goal continued to bear a charmed life for the rest of the scoreless first half. The second half was one of the most exciting you could wish to see. Greenland, backed up by a large support who kept up rhythmic clapping and chanting, came out and played some exhilirating one-touch football. Their sheer athleticism and commitment to total attack paid off with a Jan Nielsen goal. Ynys Mon became visibly rattled and increasingly physical. Their centre half showed an inability to distinguish eskimos from apes and gestured to the stand. To their credit most of the neutral support booed him continuously for the rest of the match and got right behind Greenland. The final whistle saw scenes of great joy and a standing ovation as they hung on to win 1-0. The Radio Greenland commentator, broadcasting live on the 'phone to 42,000 people was jubilant, as were tournament officials (wait till they see the 'phone bill!).

Green (and Pleasant) Land?

The next day saw Greenland play Jersey. By this time supporters wearing "Greenland Supporters Club Surrey Branch" T-shirts were evident. Jersey's superior tactics and finishing saw them win 4- 2 with Adam Grieg, a veteran Scot, scoring all four. Any sense of anti-climax was dispelled by Shetland's magnificent

efforts that evening against the host island. Several of the Isle of Wight players were from the Beazer Homes League whilst the Shetland lads could only claim to know some beazer boozers. When 6'4" keeper Bobby Wiseman hopeless in the air but good on the ground hobbled into goal with a heavily strapped ankle we exchanged ominous glances. When he picked up a back pass in the first minute we hid our eyes but cheered wildly when he tipped the resulting free kick over the bar. True to form he then missed every cross and saved every shot for the rest of the half. The 1500 crowd grew restless as the home team failed to score. Shetland even had a few attacks of their own. Each Shetlander covered every blade of grass as the team defended ferociously. Number 5 Joe Hunter intercepted a barrage of through balls with skill and grace until the fateful 87th minute arrived. With a famous draw within touching distance the Isle of Wight finally scrambled a goal and added a second in injury time.

Isles Be Seeing You

An exhausted Shetland side were then first on the next afternoon, the hottest day of the year, against the Isle of Man at Ventnor. This was an amazing ground, carved into the side of a hill, very like Lesmahagow without the bottles

of Eldorado. Officials warned us not to go into the long grass as it was a major breeding ground for the adder. A dead one by the clubhouse bore witness to this. Despite a penalty by roadrunner Michael Williamson our lads went down 1-5.

There followed the consolation of seeing Greenland demolish Gibraltar 5-0 at West Wight FC. Our familiarity with the Greenland side caused shouts of "Come on Tonnes" to echo round the ground, a reference to the inspiring figure of Tonnes Berthelsen. Believe me these players could turn professional tomorrow. Greenland are trying to join FIFA so let's pray Scotland avoid them in a World Cup qualifier.

The final game saw Jersey v Ynys Mon at East Cowes Victoria. Jersey needed a draw to pip Greenland for a place in the final and only just made it thanks to 2 Adam Grieg goals, the second coming in the last minute. Jersey went on to win the competition, beating Isle of Man 5-1 in the final. In the battle for 7th/8th place Shetland got some reward by beating Gibraltar 1-0

It had been a wonderful week with a carnival atmosphere on the island. In 1995 the games will be hosted by Gibraltar - we'll be supporting Shetland of course.

TODAY'S VISITORS

Today's visitors, KIRRIE THISTLE, are making their second appearance at the Canniepairt in six months. Their last visit, on 8th May was, incidentally, also in the Zamoyski Cup when we ran out 6-0 winners with goals from Mackay(2), D.Reilly, Coventry, Devine and Harris.

Since then Kirrie have been relegated but eight of their squad that afternoon are still wearing the Kirrie colours. With the side going nowhere fast (except division two) at the turn of the year, the Thistle committee decided to part company with their Dundee-based management team and players. Manager Wilson Coupar was appointed following a four month period during which the committee looked after the team selection etc., and it would appear that Wilson is rebuilding his side relying on Angus-based players.

Tipped as promotion candidates, Kirrie had an indifferent start to the season but hit the headlines by losing twice by 1-0 to Luncarty in the League Cup. Their first test against division one opposition was the other week when they played Arbroath Vics in a Perthshire Advertiser Cup Tie. Kirrie failed that test, going down by 2-3 to give Vics their first (and only) victory of the season to date.

Kirrie's fortunes took a turn for the better two weeks ago when they upset the form book to knock Lochee United out of the OVD Scottish Cup. However their roller coaster season continued last week when they dropped a league point to lowly Coupar Angus.

This will be the tenth meeting of the sides. Tayport have won the last five, scoring 19 goals for the loss of only 1.

Manager WILSON COUPAR has as his coach BILL McHUISH who has had experience at several Senior clubs. Bill is in his first season with Kirrie. Also in his first season is ex Harp, Brechin Vics and Montrose Roselea goalkeeper JIM MENMUIR. In defence Kirrie can select from two long serving players who previously played with the now defunct Kirrie Und. amateur side, ALLAN WATSON and JAMES GAULD. IAIN GRAY is in his second spell with the club with a spell at Blairgowrie sandwiched in between. PETER McNICOL played against us last season and lists Forfar Albion and Blairgowrie as his former clubs. DAVID CATTENACH is in his first season having been transferred from Forfar West End. JOHN McLEVY is a local lad, having joined up from Kirrie Boys Club. Also listed in the Kirrie pool is JOHN MACKIE. The unlucky defender, signed from the now defunct Forfar Central amateurs side in the close season, has yet to pull on a jersey because

Another player who has been out through injury is another close season signing from the amateurs, former Strathmore Albion midfielder DANNY GALL. SANDY SHEPHERD is back at Westfield Park after a spell at Forfar Albion. Two regulars in the Kirrie line up are , like teammate McLevy, products of the Kirrie Boys Club nursery - STEVEN NICOLL and CRISS KETTLES. Two other players who were with Forfar Central amateurs are GORDON WILSON and IAN FERGUSON. Ferguson has been attracting the Senior scouts.

SCOTT KILCOYNE signed during last season from Arbroath Vics and another ex Forfar Junior in the ranks is ex West End man KENNY MOSS, another of those in the Kirrie squad who is in his second spell at Westfield. 


From the Archives

What else was happening with a football connection? We unearthed this other wee gem from the columns of the Fife News "....Boys Brigade Officer Alastair Doctor married Ena Williamson. A horseshoe was presented to the bride by the youngest recruit MASTER DAVID AYRE " Aye, the same Davie Ayre who is now Match Secretary. The above pic shows Davie some years later, can of Foster's in his hand, giving 'Grannie's Hieland Hame' laldy as he entertains the camels whilst working in the Middle East. The paper also reported that "Tayport BB were unlucky on Saturday when they were beaten 12-0 by St Andrews BB on the Common " UNLUCKY!? What, with the likes of Davie, Cougs, Ronnie Redpath, Big Chic & Bunter in the team, I don't believe it!

That same month, away from the football, a Record Hop run by the Tayport Publicity Committee raised £8. Vince Newman & The Veltones were on stage at the Cupar Jazz & Rock Club.






