


ALL CHANGE IN THE PUB BUSINESS



January saw two of the four Tayport public houses change hands. Tayport FC's treasurer took over the license at the Tayport Arms and kenspeckle figure Andy Phin became mine host at Cobbies Inn. Port Prog took the opportunity of having a word with Andy about his new challenge.

- Q. What made you think of taking over a pub at an age when most are thinking about retirement? A. I'm young at heart. I may look a trifle older but I only feel 30!
- Q. Any plans to change the name of the pub. It's always been spelt wrongly anyway?
- A. I may consider something later but not at the moment
- $\underline{Q}.$ Plans for the pub in the short term? $\underline{A}.$ Try to do something with the lounge. Make it a bit more customer friendly.
- Q. What about the long term? $\underline{\lambda}$. I'm supposed to retire next year so I've not given that any thought!
- Q. What sort of clientele are you aiming for? \underline{A} . Mature and sensible.
- Q. What's business been like so far? A. Very good. Delighted with the way things have gone so far, especially at this time of the year.
- Q. Brief resume of your career prior to getting into the pub business? A. Served my time as a cobbler before spending 14 years in the heating business.
- Q. What about your career in the pub business? A. I've worked in all the Tayport pubs. Two years as manager of the Auld Hoose, eight years as manager in the Tayport Arms and three years in the Bellrock from where I moved to Cobbies last month. Before these posts I worked part time in the Scotscraig Bowling Club and the now defunct Royal British Legion Club.
- Q. Who'll be working in the pub apart from yourself? $\underline{\mathtt{A}}.$ Wife Janet, son Crawford and a couple of part-timers.
- Q. What's your policy as far as drink brands are concerned? A. I've got Tennents beer and lager but I've got the opportunity to bring in a cask-conditioned guest beer if I wish. As far as spirits are concerned, It'll be the brand leaders, OVD, Smirnoff, Grouse etc.
- Q. You've always been keen on football, can you map out your career for us?
- A. As a 15 year old I played for a team called Tayside Rangers which played mainly friendlies. I then played for Tayport Amateurs before joining the Army. I played for the Army side, the highlight of which was a game against Borussia Munchen-Gladbach (we lost 3-2). On demob I had a couple of games for Tayport Violet before playing for Newport Amateurs and Wormit Amateurs for lengthy spells. I wound up with a few games back at Tayport Amateurs.
- Q. Have any of your contemporaries from those days called in at the pub since you took over? <u>A</u>. Yes. I've been quite surprised at the number of former teammates who have looked in.
- Q. What's your view on the club's decision to start a Junior side in 1990?
- A. I thought that it was the only way to go and I was pleased that the club showed ambition. I always felt a bit envious of other communities around this size that could boast a Junior team.
- $\underline{\textbf{Q}}.$ You've seen the team in action quite a few times this season any comments?
- A. Well we definitely went through a sticky patch but the talent is there and, barring injuries and suspensions we can go on to win another league title and some cups.
- Q. Choices as favourite player, best goal etc.? Alive always been impressed by Patty and there have been so many cracking goals in the last few seasons that it's difficult to recall a particular one. Mike Gray's the other week was one of the best however.



THE BAKER'S BIT

A warm welcome to the Port Support and our visitors this afternoon. It's been some time since our last Port Prog. That day we got ourselves back on the winning trail, beating Broughty Athletic 2-0 in the League. Since then we've continued with League wins over Violet (5-1), Forfar Albion (3-0) and Arbroath Vics (6-0) and an away draw with North End(1-1). These results have seen our league position improve by nine points from a possible ten. In between we managed a home victory in the Zamoyski Cup over Bankfoot. These two competitions must be our goal for this season and, to achieve that, we must overcome teams of Kinnoull's calibre. The Perth side are, without doubt, a much improved side from last year. Earlier this season we played out a 0-0 draw at Kinnoull followed by a victory at home in the P.A. Cup, albeit on penalties.

Once again it looks as if we must go into today's game with changes from last week's line-up and I'm afraid that's been the story for most of the season to date with the possible exception of the first six games away back in August. I feel that this has contributed to the drop in the accustomed standard. That coupled with the Scottish Cup exit. Let's not forget that we had five consecutive weeks of Scottish Cup duty. 3-3 away to Camelon, the game dubbed 'the best Junior match seen for ten years' followed by refereeing incompetence the next week. Remember our players had been built up once again for a titanic struggle. Week three saw the game called off once more on the Saturday morning. I feel that that was one of the reasons for the fourth week's game being something of an anticlimax.

It also meant that for a fifth week in succession we had to get the players mentally ready. Added to the fact that I was unable to see the opposition for myself (a crime in my book), I was forced to rely on second hand information. Going out of the Scottish and the Wilkie sending off (which I felt was harsh) was apersonal disaster for me and I don't mind telling you, I was absolutely gutted, as, of course were the players.

Unfortunately the next week it wasn't Luncarty away. The League Secretary pitched us away to a side undefeated since August (incidentally by Tayport) and once again we played a major part of the game with ten men. So, for the third time in our history we lost two games in a row.

These, I feel, are some of the reasons for the drop in standards which we've set at Tayport. As you know we've gone undefeated since the Downfield game. O.K., some of the victories weren't of the quality we're used to but they were victories nevertheless. And I'd rather win playing badly than lose playing well. Don't take that as a kop-out - far from it. We are striving to get back to these standards I always go on about. As a player I seem to remember losing form myself. I stopped scoring. In fact I remember it as if it was yesterday. I was 34 years old and,unlike Tayport Football Club, it never came back!

The bottom line is we're top of Divisio One with identical points as at this stage last season but with a better goal difference this time round. Our players know the importance of today's game and the gap that a victory would open up for Tayport. We'll do the business for you. You do the business for us!





-TODAY'S VISITORS -

KINNOULL saw their slender league title hopes become even more tenuous following a 0-1 home defeat by Forfar West End in their most recent league game. However, the Perth side are an outfit far removed from that which we faced last season and their two results against us earlier this season proved that point. A goalless league game at Tulloch Park was followed by further stalemate in the P.A. Cup here on the Canniepairt, although on that occasion we did go through on penalties.

Despite being plagued by injuries this season, Kinnoull boss Alan Smart has welded together a more than useful outfit. Leese will miss today as will Robertson who's away on a Fire Brigade course. Vannett has been called up by Brechin City, Hutton has been placed on the transfer list and both Robson and Maher are very doubtful for today through injury. So it will be something of a patched up squad for Kinnoull today. Bobby Glennie, the ex Dundee, Aberdeen and Forfar Athletic stalwart, recently released by Violet appeared as a trialist in the team's last match and may be on the 'Noull's team list again today.

Among those to watch in the visitors' side today will be ex-Brechin City player Ian Paterson who notched five goals in two games just after the turn of the year ssince moving into midfield, midfielder Craig Mailer, the team's top scorer and Michael Fulton who scored the Tayside Under 23's goal v the Scottish Junior X1 the other week.

Tayport don't have their problems to seek either on the injury front with both Billy Coventry and Paul Reilly still a bit away from fitness. What, with suspensions and other niggles picked up from game to game, the pool has been depleted somewhat. Against Forfar Albion the other week we were down to the basic eleven, an unfit Andy Sommerville and coach George Malone having to pull on the subs. jerseys.

Dave Reilly (suspended) missed the win at Arbroath Vics and will be an absentee again today. A couple of training injuries sustained during the week could mean the inclusion of a trialist in this afternoon's squad.



The following extract from a recent press article gives an interesting insight into his thinking and the influence a spell in the U S.A. had on him.


