



HAMISH Mackay will be an absentee from the Tayport team this afternoon. If he has recovered from injury, he'll be in Dublin with the Scottish Junior International team for the four team contest for the Guinness Cup. As well as Scotland and hosts Eire, Northern Ireland and Wales are taking part. Because of Hamish's selection for his country, Dave Baikie had the opportunity to seek a free date for this afternoon but chose to go ahead with the game.

PUMPHERSTON Juniors are the latest club to jump on the car boot sale bandwagon. 200 cars every week is their aim.

CAMELON, who made their Scottish Cup exit here on the Canniepairt earlier this season following a penalty shoot-out, are still unbeaten this season in open play. They recently picked up their first piece of silverware since 1977 with a 2-0 win over Linlithgow Rose in the final of the East Region's Skol Cup at Brockville. The final attracted the healthy attendance of 1,800 necessitating Falkirk FC to open extra turnstiles.

IN losing to Armadale in the OVD Cup and missing out on a trip to Pollok, Tayport also missed out on a healthy pay day. The crowd at Mewlandsfield for the first game was 1,230.

WALKING down Sauchiehall Street last Tuesday at lunchtime Snout spotted an Evening Times billboard proclaiming-' Junior Squad Named '. On buying a copy he discovered a big article on the squad which included two Tayside players in the team and two on standby. Bound to be something in the Tele , thinks our man. Not as much as a snifter ! As far as we can make out there's still been nothing in the local press.

DEREK Balfour, the Arbroath SC goalkeeper who was in action against us last Saturday, signed earlier this week for Brechin City. He is the second SC player to go Senior inside a week. Winger PETER FEENEY left the club to join Arbroath FC and marked his debut against Forfar with two goals. But the signing which raised the eyebrows in recent weeks was that of veteran defender BOBBY GLENNIE. Freed by Violet, he was signed up until the end of the season by Jocky Scott in an effort to help keep Arbroath out of the new 3rd Division.

-TODAY'S VISITORS

BANKS O' DEE

GROUND: Spain Park, Abbotswell Road, Aberdeen. CLUB FORMED: 1902

<u>COLOURS</u>: Sky with Navy Hoops. <u>MEMBERS OF</u>: Evening Express Bon Accord League Premier Division.

BANKS o'Dee began life in 1902 rejoicing in the name of 'The Rechabites', after a Rechabite Group of the time. During their early days, the story goes that their goalkeeper, caught quaffing a half pint by a committeeman, was severely admonished. Anyway the club's name gave way to 'Banks o' Dee' and the club had a fairly nomadic life before settling in at Seaton-Park Aberdeen just after World War 2. Seaton Park was a state of the art ground for its time, boasting of the unheard luxury of showers.

It was during this time at Seaton Park that Banks o' Dee had their most successful period culminating in a Scottish Cup win over Kilsyth Rangers at Hampden in 1957. The Dee produced many fine players for the Seniors including Graham Leggat (18

caps for Scotland) and Martin Buchan (34 caps).

The lease on Seaton Park expired and the club was forced to move again in the late sixties to their present ground, Spain Park. The ground was named after Richard Spain, managing director of engineering firm, J.M.Anderson, from whom the club bought the ground.

BANKS o' Dee visit the Canniepairt looking to take a further step in securing the only honour which has so far eluded them in their 92 year history - the Zamoyski Challenge Trophy. The Dee made it to the Zamoyski Final in the tournament's second season in 1990 but lost out to Downfield. They were knocking at the door again last season but went down to eventual finalists Islavale in the semi final.

THIS season's domestic formhas perhaps been affected by their OVD Scottish Cup exploits which saw them win three away ties before falling 3-0 at Kilwinning Rangers last Saturday.

TO add to the disappointment of their defeat, Dee suffered a further blow at Kilvinning when goalkeeper NICKY CHRISTIE sustained a fractured hand. With no other keeper on the books, the committee were left with the task of signing a replacement for today's game. Right back DAVID CRAIG is only 16½ and the stocky youngster is one of two players in the line-up farmed out to Banks o' Dee by Aberdeen. Craig's full back partner is likely to be 19 yrs old ANDREW BUCHAN, a product of the club's under 18 side. Buchan returned to the side recently but could find competition for his place from another 19 year old BRIAN McBEATH.

McBeath, who is on a delayed transfer to Highland League Keith, has just returned after injury. At centre half today will be the experienced DAVID PATTERSON, signed from Huntly, and playing behind him as sweeper will be 38 year old ALEX WALKER.

The ex-Montrose defender is vastly experienced with a turn of pace that belies his veteran tag.

BARRY IRVINE(29), son of the club secretary, is in his second spell with the club, the midfielder having had a time at non-league English outfit, Lowestoft Town. STEWART McINDOE(32) will captain the side. Stewart formerly turned out in central defence but has been the midfield anchorman in recent games. One of the foreign' accents in the team will be that of SCOTT SHIELDS, a student in Aberdeen who hails from East Kilbride. Small in stature but wasn't at the end of the queue when 'bottle' was being handed out!

WILLIE TOWLER (22) has been with the club for four years and, although a midfielder, has been playing in the front line alongside another 22 year old, NEIL MCPHERSON.
'Zico', as he's known, is the gem in the Banks o'Dee crown. Top scorer, he has turned down offers to move elsewhere. STEWART WILSON(17) is the other player in the squad farmed out from Pittodrie. A left sided striker, Stewart hails from Girvan in Ayrshire. ALAN REID(23) has been out of action for 18 months after major knee surgery but the midfielder is close to a return to action. A place

could also be found for GRANT RENNIE, a versatile all-action type of player who stepped up from the club's under 18 side.

OUT of contention today through injury will be Steven'Snappy' Wilson, a forward, and ex-Lossiemouth midfielder Neil Cowie.

ALTHOUGH Banks o' Dee do not have a manager as such, COLIN WALKER is player/coach and he's the man who directs operations. Colin, signed from Huntly, captained the Highland League side in their Scottish Cup tie v Heart of Midlothian last season. Has made only fleeting appearances this season. Walker is helped in his task by coach Raymond o'Hara and Alex Walker.

THE BAKER'S BIT

BANKS o'Dee provide today's opposition. I'd like to take this opportunity to welcome their players and officials to the Canniepairt and a warm hello to our fans.

WELL, I suppose this competition is the next best thing to the Scottish. Our record in the Zamoyski over the past couple of seasons hasn't been bad. Two years ago we defeated Forfar West End 2-0 to bring the Cup to Tayport for the first time and, of course last season, they also provided the opposition. This time in the semis where we lost out in extra time but, as you may recall, that game happened to be the week prior to the Scottish Cup final. For me the thought of not making it to Firhill played a large part in the outcome. Fortunately, or otherwise, that isn't the case this season.

It's taken us quite a while to get over our exit from the Scottish but, without tempting fate, I feel that we've turned the corner. The last four games or so would suggest that, scoring 15 goals in the process and conceding only one.

The standard in the last two league games has been very pleasing. Firstly, the 4-0 victory over Kinnoull was very much like our early season form and last week's win in Arbroath was, for me, an excellent result. Where the Dundee Courier got their

report I'll never know. Saying "..a late Dave Reilly goal saved Tayport's blushes". Do they take a look at the score and take a guess at what went on? They must! Because even the Arbroath manager had to admit that we totally dominated from start to finish. The pleasing thing from my point of view was, apart from the two valuable points that we gained, the commitment from our players, even against a near galeforce wind in the first half. It was excellent. We pinned them in their own half for 90 % of the first half and 95 % of the second half.

It must be remembered that we started the match without Mann, Paul Reilly, Sommerville, Coventry and Mackay. I pose the question - could any other club in the Region handle that? I doubt it.

Today's Zamoyski Trophy 3rd round tie gives our players another chance to play a team from outwith the Region. This time last week Banks o'Dee were in the 5th round of the Scottish Cup. Our players must realise that you don't reach that stage without defeating competent sides and recording good victories. However, if we can continue in the vein of the last couple of weeks, I'm confident that we can reach the last eight.

WHAT a relief it is to see Tayport back on the rails, playing the kind of football we know they are capable of. The 4-0 victory over Kinnoull signalled a return to the form which made the side Scotland's top team last season and hopefully brings to an end the string of poor performances which has made it a long, hard winter for the fans.

IN the last programme Dave Baikie stated that he would rather the side played badly and won than lose while performing well. While this is understandable, from the point of view of the supporters, it is not enough. In Scottish Junior Cup tiesand in vital league matches, the fans will always want a victory no matter the standard of performance. But the regular supporter who turns up week after week does not think purely in terms of winning and losing. They go along expecting to be entertained and to spend an enjoyable couple of hours watching good, attractive football. This is what makes them come back again and again instead of finding some more comfortable way of passing a Saturday afternoon.

WHILE defeat is always disappointing, satisfaction can be gained from watching a close exciting match knowing that the team have played well and given their all only to be thwarted by a great display from the opposing goalie or a brilliant winning goal. We are football supporters as well as Tayport fans and we are realistic and knowledgable enough to know that every team has an occasional lapse in form. Knowing it however does not make it any easier to bear. Fans will become frustrated with poor performances especially when they know the abilities and potential of the team. In such circumstances criticism of the team and individual players, provided it is not malicious or foul mouthed, should not be ignored or suppressed. On many occasions the team have enjoyed the congratulations and adulation of the fans after good performances; rarely have they shared, face to face, the disappointment of the supporters after a poor display.

MANY of the established, experienced players have been the target for some uncomplimentary remarks from the terracing and I am sure that they are all man enough to accept that there are times when the criticism of their performance has been justified. No one expects every player to perform well in every game but there is a standard below which fans can lose patience especially if the loss of form is prolonged or is perceived to result from lack of effort.

I am sure that the players realise that, in the eyes of the supporters, especially the younger ones, that they are larger than life characters. They carry the hopes, dreams, aspirations and expectations of the fans. They can generate tremendous excitement and pleasure(the Auchinleck game for example) and they can induce great dismay and disappointment (Downfield in the PA this season) and even a hint of anger (Bankfoot and Lochee Utd. just a few weeks ago). They have a responsibility to the people who regularly watch them and all those who have an interest in the team.

HAVING said that, however, it must be stated that the players have gained the respect and affection of most of the people of Tayport, not just for their tremendous achievements on the park, but also for their exemplary behaviour on visiting the local hostelries after training and games.

ALL the new faces in the squad this season have proved to be real assets to the team and credit must go to Dave Baikie for his ability to spot potential and bring out the best in these players. It appears to have taken a little time for them to be completely integrated but there are signs that this is now happening. They are tomorrow's heroes and I am convinced that it won't be long before the Scottish Junior Cup is added to the team's impressive collection of trophies won. Another championship is within our grasp. The combination of the best supporters in the country and the best team will surely then go on to fulfil all our dreams. We are proud to be Tayport supporters and we will continue to support a team which is proud to pull on the red and white.






