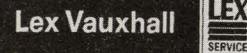

This afternoon's encounter is without doubt the game of the day on Tayside. Our dropped point at Violet a week past Wednesday and St Joseph's win against North End the same evening saw us toppled from the number one spot for the first time since October 1992. One point behind our opponents before today's game we'll be looking to overturn that advantage by 4.15pm.

St Joseph's were disappointed at their haul of trophies last season, winning only the Zamoyiski Cup but they splashed out in the close season to make some notable signings in an attempt to strengthen the side for this season's campaign. Early signs are that they've got things right and, having moved already to the top of the table, will be desperate to stay there.

St Joseph's squad for today is packed with experience, with only two players not having been signed from the Seniors - the two that moved to Fairfield Park from Tayport, Gary Lamont and Grant Cushnie.

We've got a number of injury problems to contend with at present. As well as long term invalid Billy Coventry, new Physio Andy Bell has been kept busy this week treating Paul Reilly, Gary Maher, Jimmy Hunter, Andy Sommerville, Kevin Vannett, Jackie Devine and Steven Stewart. Fraser Mann was down south at a wedding last week and should be back between the sticks today. Those at Beechwood last Saturday saw a new face in the Port goal - Brian Brown, who was with Lochee United last season and who had Senior experience with Aberdeen.

FOOTBALLERS LEAVE ROTARIANS STUMPED

A passer by at the Canniepairt the other Sunday might well have raised an eyebrow on seeing a game of cricket taking place. In a charity event to raise money for the Lewis Forgan Trust, set up to benefit a Tayport youngster, a team from Tayport Football Club took on The Rotary Club of North Fife at cricket.

It turned out to be a comfortable six wicket win for the Football Club, despite being 0 for 2 at one stage in reply to the Rotarians total of 75 all out. Tayport boss Dave Baikie was a star turn for the winners, with a knock of 36 n.o. as well as taking two wickets. Local G.P. Martin Hepworth was the leading light for the losers, hitting an unbeaten 24 and taking one of the four footballers' wickets.

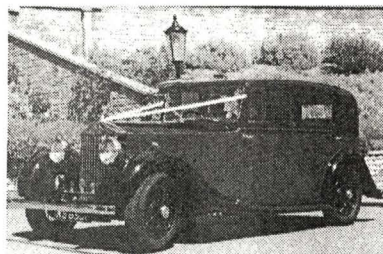

THE BAKER'S BIT

Good afternoon to the Port Support and a warm welcome to the players and officials of our league opponents to the Canniepairt today. Season 1994/95 is well underway. This afternoon's game sees the coming together of the two sides whom most pundits will battle it out for the title and I suppose they're not far off the mark. But I must point out that a lot of things can happen over a season and I don't believe that the outcome of today's game will give the winners any more than the two points on offer.

This being our first Port Prog of the season, I'd like to take this opportunity to thank our supporters for their backing throughout last season and our start this term. I'm on record as saying that last year's success gave me as much, or even more, satisfaction than the previous one. Mainly due to the constant 'Press pressure' to write us off. It seems to be par for the course in this country to try and pull back success. But the reality was one Scottish Cup defeat which provided them with the ammunition they desperately wanted. Fortunately it only left Tayport with a slight hangover and of course the rest is history. Four trophies, one of which gave this club another milestone in Junior football - four Whyte & Mackay Cup wins in a row and a fourth title in succession.

Unfortunately last season's success has left its mark in the form of long term injuries to four of our present staff. We also lost four players, departing for various reasons at the end of the season.

So, in one way or another, we've begun our title defence with half of last season's squad missing. I've no doubts whatsoever that this, and the introduction of three new faces, has had a big bearing on our uneasy start to the season. I know that we're undefeated and retained the Albert Herschell Trophy for a fourth season in a row but our players know, as I do, that we've not quite reached the standards we set at this club. However the signs were encouraging in our 7-0 victory at Beechwood Park last Saturday.

Like most Junior followers I'm looking forward to today's encounter and I'm sure our players are also, as will, I'm sure, those of our opponents. They must now be looking for a return on their enormous investment but it's players who win games not pounds!

I say this to our players "give me and our loyal support 100%. We can ask no more. Do so and I'm confident we can gain a further two Championship points"

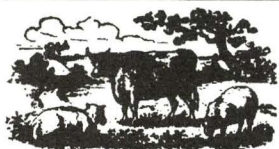

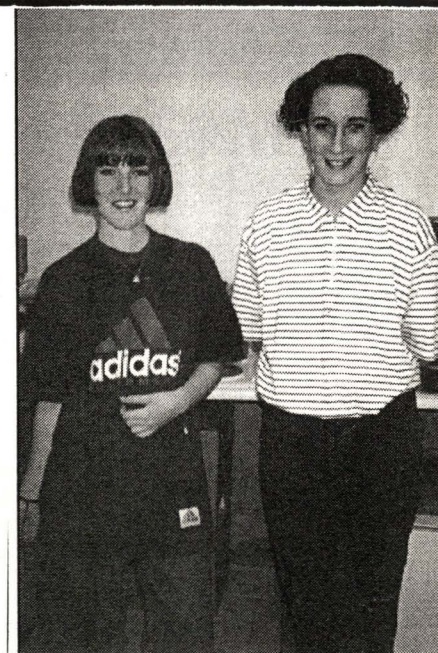
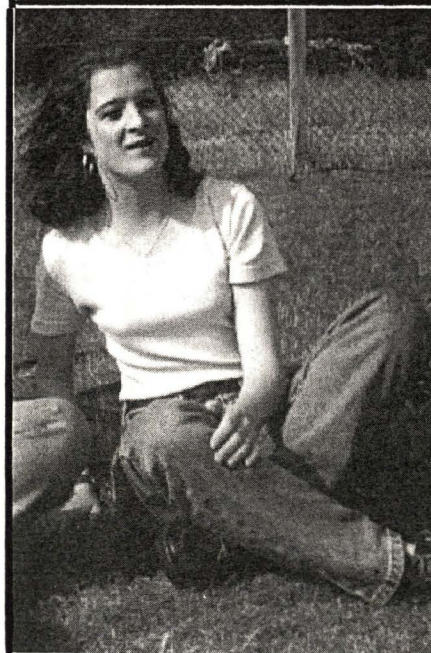
SUPPORTERS' CLUB NEWS

FROM THE ARCHIVES

IAN MATHERS, who was our sponsor Wimpey's liaison with the club these past three seasons, made his own wee bit of history last Saturday when he scored a goal on his Midlands Amateurs Premier League debut - 26 years after first turning out in the Midlands Association. The veteran defender had intended taking in our game at Beechwood against Harp but was asked to go on standby in case Tayport Amateurs needed a player for their crucial league playoff. They didn't need to call on Ian but an SOS from a former teammate, Rab Downie, now manager at Newport Amateurs, saw Ian turn out at centre half for Newport against Barnhill. Not only that but he scored into the bargain, helping his team to a 1-1 draw. Not bad considering he's managed a goal on average of something like once in every five years!

Looking back 26 years to September 1968 - when Dunfermline were Scottish Cup holders, Johnstone Burgh were Junior Cup holders and the Beatles were at No. 1 with 'Hey Jude' - Tayport Amateurs' reserve team drew 3-3 with YMCA on the East Common in a Midlands Alliance Division 2 match.

The team that day was - Dick Pearce, Ian Mathers, Stan Cove, George Bryson, Fred Janssen, Ian Pattie, Alan Brown, Andy Johnstone, Jim Foulis, Iain Bell, Dougie Ross and sub. was Murray Anderson. Foulis notched both Tayport goals with Brown getting the other.

TODAY'S VISITORS

St Joseph's will be hoping to still have STEVE O'HANLON between the sticks this afternoon. Signed from Cowdenbeath at the same time as Gus Malone, the Joey's regular last line of defence is set to move to Canada with his work. Full back BOBBY DOW is a former Brechin City player, having joined up from the Glebe Park club in 1992/93. No shortage of experience either in the other members of the visitors' back four. GARY OGILVIE cost Airdrie a sizeable fee when he moved to Broomfield from Dundee. JIMMY BYRNE, a former Scottish Youth Internationalist - the first Forfar Athletic player to represent his country - joined up last season after a long spell in self imposed exile from Station Park. GORDON WINTER also cost a lot of money when he joined up from Forfar in the close season. Like Byrne, Winter wasn't seeing eye to eye with Tommy Campbell. Also able to slot into the back four is PAUL BRUCE. Paul, who actually stays in Tayport, was with Dundee as a YTS trainee and played twenty odd games for the Reserves before being released.

In midfield neither GRANT CUSHNIE nor GUS MALONE need any introduction to Canniepairt regulars. Cush won a host of honours in his three seasons at Tayport while Gus was a key player in Tayport's Amateur side of 13 or so years ago before moving to Brechin for the princely sum of £100. Since then Gus has been at Arbroath Vics, Downfield and had a very successful spell at Cowdenbeath before helping the ailing Cowden bank balance and joining up at Fairfield. Was capped by Junior Scotland in his first spell in the Juniors. In his excellent book "BLACK DIAMONDS and the BLUE BRAZIL", author Ronald Ferguson has this to say on the move that took Malone and O'Hanlon to Joey's. "Fans' Favourite, midfielder Gus Malone and goalkeeper Steve O'Hanlon decide to go Junior with Dundee St Joseph's. Cowden get £3,000 for Malone who gets a similar sum as a signing-on fee. Why is it that players would rather play Junior football than continue in the First Division with Cowdenbeath?"

Also in the Joey's midfield will be CHARLIE ADAM. Charlie was a surprise buy by Dundee United from Brechin City before moving to Partick Thistle. Latterly he was at Arbroath before leaving for St Joseph's in the close season. Another dead ball expert in the visitors' ranks is the well known face of WILLIE BROWN. Willie spent an eventful couple of seasons with Tayport Amateurs, including a successful tour of Belgium, before embarking on a chequered Senior career, eventually signing on at St Joseph's from East Fife.



BARRY GRAY, another midfielder signed this season from Brechin City having also seen service at Arbroath and Forfar Athletic. Up front Saints will be looking to RAB McLAREN for goals. Signed in 1992 from Lochee United. Had a spell at Montrose. ANDY HEGGIE and GARY LAMONT make up the quintet of today's visitors who have strong Tayport connections. Gary moved last season leaving many happy memories of his all action style. Andy was with the Amateurs as a 15 year old when he was a regular scorer, first with the Reserves and then with the firsts before moving to pastures new. Joined St Joseph's from Brechin City.

St Josephs most recent big name signing is KENNY McDONALD who came from Cowdenbeath. Kenny's last game in Tayport was probably with the Timex reserve team in the Midlands Alliance but since then a series of moves has seen him have a successful Senior career with St Johnstone, Arbroath, Raith Rovers and Airdrie among others.
