# Today's Visitors

1ST, 4TH, 2ND & 7TH. West End's league positions these last four seasons. Current form suggests that this season could see the Strathmore Park side finish even lower. Indeed talk of relegation has appeared in the Forfar Dispatch'. A win over Jeanfield, a second successive win, has given manager Dave Reid some welcome cheer and he will be looking to extend that run.

In goal will be BRUCE GLEN, a fixture for many seasons at Broughty Athletic but persuaded by manager Reid to move to Forfar to wear the jersey discarded by Gordon Dunn. SCOTT PETERS is a versatile defender signed from Forfar Athletic three seasons ago. Has youth on his side and his displays this season have seen him included in Dave Baikie's Tayside Under 23 pool.

KEITH WILSON. Dundee lad signed from Lawside FP this season. Solid, dependable defender. Scored his first goal of the season the other week but unfortunately it was for Downfield!. BRUCE FLEMING. Sweeper recruited from Letham Lads Club a few weeks ago. Settling in well at Strathmore Park. ARTHUR WALKER. Team skipper who has been with the club for many seasons. Mainly plays in the middle of the park but the injury situation this season has necessitated his dropping into the back four from time to time.

GRAEME McAULAY. A new face this season in the West End line-up. Ieft back who joined up from local Midlands Amateur side Lowson United. Knows the road to goal and already has several to his credit this season. PAUL BLAIR. Midfielder who returned to Strathmore Park after a brief and generally unproductive spell at Downfield. Highly experienced Junior who has served West End well.

JOHN CRAIG. Midfielder who has been with the club for a number of years. Played Senior with Montrose and was also formerly with Arbroath S.C. Works offshore and as a result is not always available for selection. WAYNE FERGUSON. Joined up in April last year, previously having been with Arbroath F.C.. Versatile player, although probably preferred as an attacking midfielder.

IAN GUNN. Wholehearted type of player who was at Carnoustie for 5 or 6 seasons. Didn't play much last season but after turning out a couple of times for Arbroath Vics at the start of this season, moved up to Strathmore Park. Central defender.

GLYN SMITH. Teenage midfielder who was attached to St Johnstone at one time. Recent arrival at West End who will be seen as one for the future by manager Reid.

HAMISH SOUTAR. This is the striker's second spell with the club, having seen service at Blairgowrie and more recently with Kirrie Thistle. West End's leading scorer last season with twenty odd goals but has been having a fairly lean time so far this season. Signs though in recent games that the old goal touch hasn't deserted him.

NICK MARKOWSKI. In his first season at Forfar, having signed from Arbroath Vics with whom he was a prolific marksman, including a few against us. Struggling to find that same goalscoring form so far this season. PAUL YULE, forward signed from Downfield, unlikely to play because of injury as is fellow striker LEE STRACHAN. Also likely to be out is another frontman MIKE THOMSON and definitely missing will be the experienced defender I BOBBY ANDERSON who is still on the injured list.

### Past Fincounters

Today will be the sixteenth meeting of Tayport and Forfar West End. Tayport have had the best of these meetings, winning eight, drawing four and losing three. One of these three was a cup tie which had to replay after Tayport had successfully protested and won the subsequent replay.

In the fifteen games played Tayport have netted on 29 occasions, losing 13 goals.

The scorers of twenty of those goals are in line for a game this afternoon. Dave Reilly leads the way with eight followed by Jackie Devine with six. Billy Coventry, still striving to regain fitness, has notched five of the goals. Covy, unfortunately won't feature this afternoon.

# OVD SCOTTISH JUNIOR CUP



It was a day of shocks in the Third Round of the OVD Scottish Junior Cup last Saturday and nowhwere was there a bigger shock than at Newlandsfield where Pollok were knocked out by Turriff United by 1-0. Turriff showed last season when they went to the last sixteen that they were no mugs. On that occasion they were unfortunate to go down by the odd goal in seven to finalists Glenafton. Pollok, though, were odds on favourites and will be devastated to miss out on the money spinning later stages. An early goal put the Aberdeenshire team ahead and thereafter it was backs to the wall stuff with the United keeper performing heroics.

A great result too for Glenrothes who eliminated Maryhill by 3-2 at the Warout Stadium. The Glasgow side are riding high in the Reebok Central Division and the previous week had just hit four past Arthurlie in a League match. A good result also for Kelty Hearts, winning 3-2 away to Bonnyrigg Rose, the side which had ended the hopes of holders Largs Thistle in the previous round. Fellow Fifers Dundonald did not fare as well. They went down by 1-3 to a Camelon side which is reputed to be playing very well at present and is well fancied for the Cup itself.

However it was the Aberdeen teams that continued to provide the shocks. Hall Russell United, who took Largs to a replay in last season's fifth round, ended the hopes of Ayrshire big guns Beith in some style, winning by 4-l at Beith. Inverurie Locos returned north from Greenock with a 1-0 win to their credit while Lewis United will fancy their chances against Kinnoull in the Chris Anderson Stadium, Aberdeen after holding the Perth team to a 2-2 draw at Tulloch Park.

The well fancied Shettleston team saw their hopes end at the wide open spaces of Hannah Park, Shotts, beaten by the only goal of the game. The occasion of the day, though, was at Auchinleck where over 2,500 watched the derby tie against second division Cumnock (mind, you, probably most of them were policemen!). A tremendous crowd which bettered 13 of the 19 Scottish Senior matches the same afternoon. No shock here, with Auchinleck winning 3-1.

Almost a shock at Bellshill where St Joseph's, despite racing into a 2-0 lead, had to hang on desperately in the end to secure a replay in Dundee this week. The locals came storming back to equalise and proceed to put their opposition through the mill. North End's rich vein of form continues after hitting Benburb for four without reply. In the Tayside derby Lochee United, despite losing what was probably the quickest goal of the season, recovered to go nap against Broughty Athletic.

Carnoustie live to fight another day after sharing four goals with the locals at Lochore but our nearest Fife neighbours, St Andrews United, failed to pack their shooting boots and went down by the only goal of the game to Kirkintilloch Rob Roy who play in the same division as Port Glasgow.

Five games were postponed and go ahead this week.



(This is the Editorial which appeared in the December issue of "Team Talk', the non-league football magazine. The editor joined the board of Yeovil Town who play in the G.M. Vauxhall Conference, effectively the English 5th Division, where they currently lie second bottom of 22 clubs. As well as highlighting the finances involved in a non-league set up, it just shows how fickle fans can be. Less than twelve months after a great FA Cup run, halted only by Arsenal, the poor committee get stick from the fans. Interesting to see that other committee meetings are the same as ours - featuring everything other than the game of football!)

WHAT a month October turned out to be!

Having enjoyed thirty years of playing and coaching I had great fun helping develop a number of football publications before being invited to sample life as a director of Yeovil Town as a hobby.

I have thoroughly enjoyed the experience but having joined the club following a quite amazingly badly managed move from The Huish to Huish Park, I was horrified to find out that football club board meetings often featured everything other than the game of football.

football.

An £800,000 deficit after the move left the club fighting for its life. The towns-people were magnificent and their strength inspired manager Steve Rutter and his squad to four FA Cup victories over League clubs and a much publised tie against Arsenal. Television fees and the transfers of Mark Shail to Bristol City and Malcolm McPherson to West Ham United, plus a best ever fourth place in the Conference helped the club knock £300,000 off the debt. A wonderful effort by all concerned!

But bank interest on the huge deficit limited squad development and although our experienced manager Brian Hall performed a miracle by keeping us up last season, his ageing team needs help now and the bank is not allowing the club to spend more on new players.

A defeat in the FA Cup brought matters to a head and some of the saddest sights I have seen in football made us all wonder whether this was really the game with which we all loved to be involved.

The most loyal and hard working chairman Bryan Moore, who with his wife Pauline have dedicated much of their lives to Yeovil Town, were abused and insulted. The manager was shocked at the fierceness of the feelings against him and many directors and supporters wives were badly affected by the anger shown against the board at the next home match, when Yeovil supporters won the game for Merthyr by demoralising their own players and lifting the visitors with their encouragement.

we have all felt the despair of bad results and I can understand some of the anager and frustration, but much of the reaction was quite disgraceful. However, quite strangely it brought an encouraging backlash from the more understanding supporters who showed their true support at the next game and inspired a fine 3-0 victory.

When a £90,000 profit last year was eaten up by the bank the Yeovil board realised the overdraft must be eliminated immediately if the club was to go forward. So all offers of financial help are being considered and maybe you will see a new board at Yeovil - it's certainly exciting and we all have the club at heart.

# **Comic turns** with Terry

THE evening of football comedy began inauspiciously. The video screens on the walls of Terry Neill's Sports Bar in central London flickered, and there was Gazza at his mugging, gobbing, gagging, giggling worst. Heavens, we thought, if this is as good as it gets, we'd better get ourselves sent off pronto. But that was the low point. Terry and his crew behind the bar swung into high gear, dispensing Carling by the firkin, and Nick Hancock took the stage to introduce the evening's acts.

Terry's bar was the ideal venue: hung with his international shirts and photographs of the proprietor with the great, the good and George Graham, it exuded an atmosphere of football as powerfully as any boot room. The crowd were cognoscenti, sharp-suited and leatherjacketed, players, ex-players, commentators, hacks, hangers-on.

First up, after Hancock's cheerful but predictable introduction (a Merson gag after 87 seconds) was Tim Clark. Julian Dicks's weightier brother, 16 stone of lard in a leather jacket, with cropped hair, wicked grin, every other word an obscene adjective (you'll have to imagine them). "Fat? I'll tell you why West Ham is fat. You'd eat a pie if you was 3-0 down to Bolton, wouldn't ya? You think I'm fat? There's this bloke at Upton Park, 'e's pies akimbo, 'is face a blur of pastry. ## Jim Baxter the magician YES, THE HAMPDEN WIZARDS

OVER 100,000 joy-crazy fans REFUSED to leave Hampden Park after the final whistle had blown . . . refused although the teams had vanished from the field and the flags were being taken away. They wanted to see these eleven great Scots again. The eleven who had bested England at Hampden for the first time in 25 long, long years.

The eleven who had recorded our first victory over England anyhere for eleven years.

The eleven, glory be, who had won us the Triple Crown and the undisputed Championship of these British Isles and won with a flourish and an artistry that made the World Cup-seeking Sassen-achs look like mére apprentices.

### HEROES

And that huge crowd had its way. As the cheers mounted and rolled until the heavens shook, Scotland's bedraggled heroes came trooping back from the dressing rooms-clearly ordered back by some official with common sense.

Out they came, these men who will be as immortal as the Wembley Wizards. The little Ranger, Davie Wilson, was in bare feet. So, too, was the ghost of Tottenham, John White and on his back was the white England jersey of Johnny

It was the same with the others. This was a motley crew, indeed . . . but they were loved as no Scotland team has ever been loved before. They ran round the pitch and waved to the fans and all of them wore grins that will not, I swear, wear off for many a day to come.

### TRIBUTE

For 10 amazing minutes this fantastic reception lasted, the never-to-he-forgotten tribute of a crowd delighted to learn again that we CAN play top-class football.

True the wonderful enthusiasm of the crowd was at least partly the Hampden hoodoo had been broken; that at last the grin of superiority had been wiped from the faces of the English.

With the score 1-0 and 22 minutes left, Greaves passed to Haynes. The England skipper shot, the ball thudded against the underside of the bar, rocketted down, bounced again and was headed over the bar by pivot McNeill.

It appeared that referee Leo Horn had given a goal. But then we saw a linesman point and the decision was changed to a free kick for Scotland. I must say Hayres' shot looked over to me.
