Today's Game

With both Tayport and Kilsyth having a reputation for playing attractive football, what should be the Canniepairt's best gate of the season to date should be well entertained.

Kilsyth plunged out of the Central Premier Division in 1993 when they finished in bottom place with only 13 goals to show for their 22 games but Manager DAVIE CONNELL, formerly at the helm at East Stirlingshire, got things together last season and Rangers were but a solitary point off promotion. This season they are one of the pacemakers and, unless there is a slump somewhere along the line a return upstairs looks a certainty.

Goals have come easily to Kilsyth this season and in the OVD Cup alone have 16 to their credit in only three ties. Greig, who has notched in every round, has done most damage with five. It's not been a one man show however, six players have shared the rest including defender Jackson who has hit three.

Tayport, of course, are well acquainted with the road to goal themselves. The OVD Cup may have only produced ten goals in four games but last Saturday we chalked up the half century of league goals in 16 games. Amazingly 17 different players have been on the mark for the Port this season. Only keeper Fraser Mann and our most recent recruit Keith Nicolson have yet to find the back of an opponents' net.

With all this talk of goals then the crowd should have something to shout about. With their rich history in the national trophy Kilsyth are usually well supported in their away ties and we expect several coachloads of fans visiting the Canniepairt for the first time.

Kilsyth will miss the influence of their signing from neighbours Cumbernauld United, Colin Gray, who is cup-tied but Tayport too will have an absentee in the form of Andy Sommerville who is on holiday.

Martin Doogan and Ernie Collumbine will likely both be absent. Doogan is injured and Collumbine suspended. Gary Buchanan will still likely be out of action thus further reducing manager Connell's selection choice. Faced with these problems Kilsyth delved into the Duncansfield biscuit box and took steps to secure the transfer of Colin Wilson, a midfield player from Linlithgow Rose. Wilson, a former Camelon player had spells in the Seniors with Stenhousemuir and East Stirlingshire. Unless there were any last minute hitches, the transfer was set to go through earlier this week.

Kilsyth full backs Jackson and Campbell carry an attacking threat and with Gilbertson snapping away at their heels, the Tayport defence, which conceded its first goal on the Canniepairt for three months last Saturday, will be kept on the alert.

Gilbertson was on the mark against Port Glasgow last week and might have doubled his tally but for a penalty miss. It was left to Gary Burns to come off the bench to take his tally for the season to double figures with the last kick of the game and thus secure a vital point.

The attacking threat of the home side will not be underestimated by Kilsyth. The eleven goals scored by Hamish Mackay in his last four games will have not gone unnoticed by the Kilsyth backroom staff. Tayside's top goalscorer is the man the Rangers' defenders will have to put the shackles on.

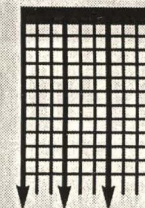

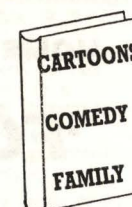
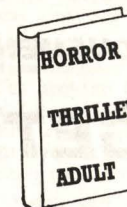

Today's Visitors

KILSYTH RANGERS come to Tayport with a Junior pedigree that would be the envy of most Junior clubs. Compared with many of the big guns of the game they were formed relatively recently in 1945. Within ten years they had annexed the game's ultimate prize - the Scottish Junior Cup, beating Duntocher Hibs 4-0 at Hampden after a replay. The two ties attracted 95,000 to Hampden. Two years later they were back only to lose by the only goal of the game to Banks o' Dee. Kilsyth hadn't lost the winning habit, however, in 1967 they were back at Hampden lifting the cup at the expense of Rutherglen Glencairn.

Several players that were to make their name in the Senior game cut their teeth at Kilsyth including George Mulhall, Drew Jarvie, Frank McGarvey, and Wille Wallace.

In goal today will be DANNY MOY now in his 6th season with the club and a firm favourite with the Kilsyth faithful. Formerly played with Petershill. The number two jersey will be worn by SCOTT JACKSON, a tall defender signed last season from Albion Rovers. Also had a spell with East Fife. At left back will be IAN CAMPBELL, a classy player noted for his upfield runs and pots at goal. Signed from Arbroath, Ian is now in his third season and is the club's current Player of the Year.

SIMON THOMSON has been holding down the Centre half position in recent weeks although he is also effective in midfield. A product of St Patrick's Juvs., he signed only late last season but has already attracted the Seniors and has had trials with East Stirling this season. Playing in the sweeper role will be GEORGE WEIR who doubles up as assistant manager. A very steady player, George organises things at the back for the team and rarely gets flustered. Team captain, he is in his second spell with the club, having signed from Blantyre Vics in 1989.

MARTIN DOOGAN is in his second season at Duncansfield Park following his transfer from local rivals Cumbernauld United. He has added much needed steel to the Rangers' midfield division but is likely to be an absentee today following a hamstring injury sustained against Port Glasgow last week. PETER WELSH will likely play on the right side of midfield. Peter is a close season acquisition from Neilston and has added experience and flair to the side since his introduction. The versatile ERNIE COLLUMBINE might have filled a midfield slot had he not been suspended for the next 3 games.

For goals Rangers will look to their frontline trio of GARY BURNS, SCOTT GILBERTSON and LIAM GREIG. Gary, another product of Campsie BW, is in his second season and is presently the club's second top scorer and a firm favourite with the Duncansfield faithful. Top scorer is Scott Gilbertson who was formerly with Kirkintilloch Rob Roy but was plucked from the amateurs by Kilsyth. A real harrier of a player. There are no lost causes with Gilby. Liam was with Brechin City and took a while to settle on his return to Kilsyth but is coming back to something like his best form and has made the No.9 jersey his own.

KENNY NEIL an experienced striker signed from Bo'ness last season, he has been in good form in recent weeks and will be looking for a jersey this afternoon. Takes a bit of stopping when in full flight. GRAHAM HUTCHIESON has missed a few games in recent weeks but his undoubted ability will see him claim a place on the left side of the Kilsyth attack when the opportunity arises. GARY BUCHANAN held down the centre half spot until injury

deprived him of his place. ROSS HUNTER, a 23 year old, formerly with St Mirren was fixed up from Vale of Clyde. KEVIN McCutcheon, 19 year old signed last season. Has yet to win a regular place in the team but anxious to establish himself in midfield before the season's out.

Central Challenge

Collapses

With only seven clubs featuring in today's fourth round of the OVD Cup the Reebok Central League has probably it's poorest ever representation at the last 32 stage.

What must be puzzling to Central League Officials is that only two Premier sides survive, **Arthurlie** and **Shotts Bon Accord**. Division One boasts three, **Kilsyth Rangers**, **Blantyre Vics** and **Ashfield** while two Division Two teams, **Kirkintilloch Rob Roy** and **Yoker Athletic** retain an interest in the competition.

This is in stark contrast to past seasons. Take the last three for example. In 1992 14 Central clubs reached the last 32, thirteen in 1993 and ten last season. The dwindling numbers of clubs mounting a challenge for the Junior game's greatest prize will undoubtedly be causing some concern to your average Central League punter.

Just for interest, Tayside's representation at this stage in 1992 was one (Tayport), 1993 six and two last season.

Glasgow and Lanarkshire clubs traditionally dominated the competition and the present state of affairs might be looked upon as a hiccup but it is perhaps a bit more significant than that.

In the six seasons from 1980 to 1985, the Central League supplied **ten** of the **twelve** Scottish Junior Cup Finalists (6 winners, 4 runners-up). In the five seasons 1990-94 the same league provided only **one** of the **ten** finalists - **Lesmahagow** who went down to Hill O' Beath in 1990 - and the pattern looks like continuing this season.

Yes, the 1990's so far have been very disappointing for the Central League sides, particularly those which have made considerable financial investments in an effort to achieve OVD Scottish Junior Cup success.

The Baker's Bit

For the third time in this Scottish Cup campaign we entertain a Central League side. I'd like to welcome Kilsyth Rangers' players and officials to Tayport and a good afternoon to the Port Support.

Last Saturday we continued where we left off at Montrose with a resounding 8-1 victory over Lochee Harp. I suppose that it would have been a major upset had we recorded anything other than a victory but the pleasing aspect for me is the way we played for most of the game. We continually played the game in a professional manner, because it can all too easily turn sour. I spoke at length recently with a first division manager who went to great lengths praising his side's performances against the better clubs but, as I said to him, there's no point doing it against us then the following week losing to a side which they'd expect to beat.

The difference between both performances is obvious - 'mental attitude' prior and during the match. There's an old saying, 'a job well started is a job well done'. Really what it means is if you prepare and begin properly, there's a good chance of carrying it through to the end. Start a game with the wrong attitude and it's very, very hard to change midstream.

Today we play Kilsyth Rangers. This is one of those games where, as far as I'm concerned, our players' preparation and attitude shouldn't be in question. We know what's at stake. A place in the last sixteen, leaving Tayport three wins away from a second Scottish Cup Final appearance and four wins away from bringing the cup to Tayport. There can be no bigger and better incentive than that. So I say to our support - give your players the backing and they'll return the favour with a victory.

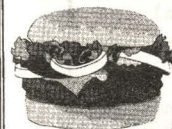

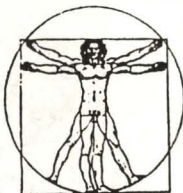

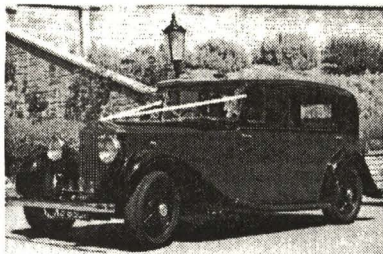

HOW WILL THE LOCALS FARE?



The only team on the road is Lochee United who are enjoying something of a resurgence since promotion to the first division this season and have suffered only one defeat in five months. United boss Davie Martin will have his charges well drilled for the trip to Glasgow to meet Yoker. Yoker defeated fellow division two side Johnstone Burgh on penalties after a replay in the last round but they will hold no fears for the Dundee team.

North End will be meeting Fauldhouse for the third time in sixteen years. It's one tie each, North End winning most recently, 3-1 at Fauldhouse in 1992/93 after drawing in Dundee. North End to win again.

St Joseph's may have designs on the Cup but the bookies think that their optimism is unwarranted. You can get 20/1 on them. The reason is that they are meeting Kilwinning Rangers. Joey's officials are aware that their fans will be outnumbered by those of the 'wee' Rangers, but I have a suspicion that they might just squeeze a result here - a draw would see them struggle in a replay however.

Downfield will have to draw on all their cup experience to dent the hopes of visitors Camelon who showed in their two games against us last season that they are a fair side. Their haul of silverware last season confirmed that and, with a couple of breaks, they could go all the way.

Carnoustie aren't quoted by the bookies (but then again, neither were Largs at this stage last season) but this is their best run since 1977/78 when they went on to reach the semi final. It's exactly twenty years since their opponents Glenrothes lifted the cup but things haven't been so special in the interim and they will find things tricky at Westfield Park. A healthy home support should help Panmure secure a victory.

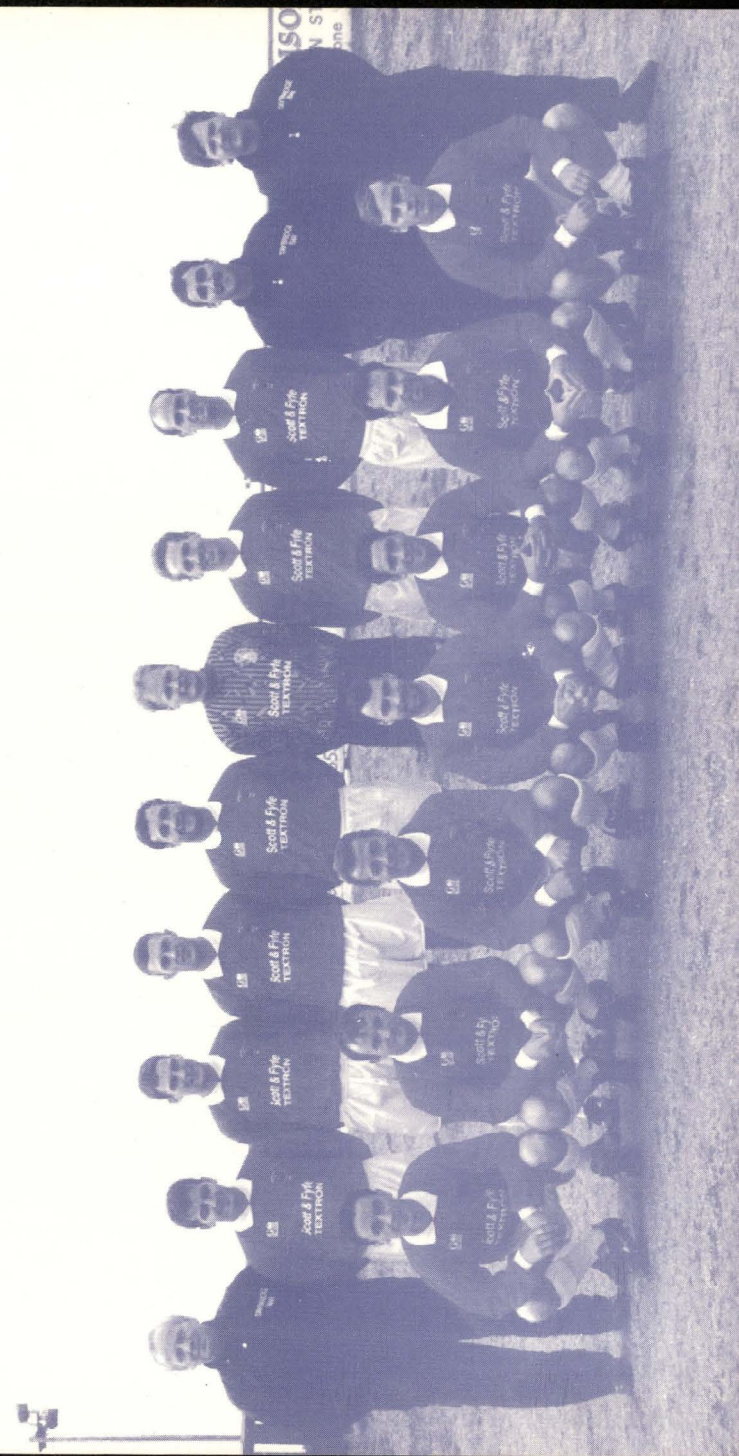
