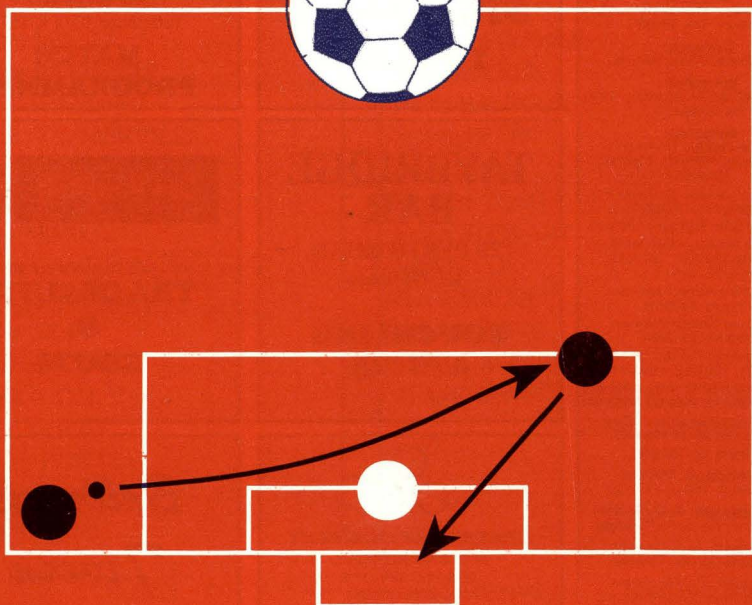

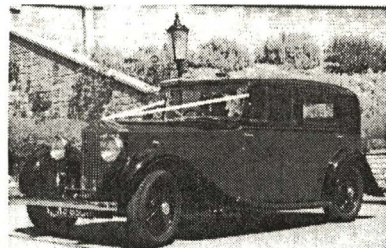

## Today's Game

A last minute goal from Steve Aitken gave Montrose both points at Jeanfield last week and, according to Roselea officials, probably secures their safety in the first division. Harp, Jeanfield and Kirrie officials might not agree but I don't think the Montrose lads will be far off the mark.

It's a fairly healthy situation for Roselea and will give their players every confidence for today's encounter, particularly following on from our draw at Forfar West End last week.

It should be remembered, however, that the Roselea win at Perth was only their second in 14 games while we were recording only our second share of the spoils in an otherwise unblemished run during the same period.

Dave Baikie will not be underestimating the threat posed by Montrose. He clearly respects today's opponents as his programme notes following the game at Broomfield Park the other week indicate.

Steven Eeles, who has missed both previous games against us, could again be missing. Mark Dorward who featured in the first game will still be missing. In fact Dorward's groin injury will likely keep him out until the end of the season and could even require an operation. Alan Riddell will also be out through injury but Mike Stephen will be in the line-up. Mike returned after injury last week against Jeanfield and turned in an encouraging display.

From a situation a couple of weeks ago when Tayport's entire pool was fit for action with the exception of Billy Coventry, things have deteriorated. Hamish Mackay will be missing after suffering a training injury. Also on Andy Bell's treatment table this week were Paul Reilly and Jackie Devine. Another cloud on the horizon is Mark Spalding's impending suspension following his ordering off against Kilsyth. On the plus side, however, is the welcome return of Andy Sommerville, suitably tanned after a holiday in the sun.

There are a lot of vital games scheduled for the next few months and today's is no exception with Montrose going for the points which would dispel any lingering relegation fears and ourselves striving to keep ahead of the field and looking for nothing less than a full return.

### BULK OF 'NATIONAL SQUAD FROM THE EAST

Scottish Junior International manager Denis Gray has selected ten of his fifteen man pool for the game against Clydebank FC at Bathgate on Wednesday from east based clubs.

## The Baker's Bit

I'd firstly like to welcome our visitors, Montrose Roselea, and the Port Support to the Canniepairt this afternoon.

Last week's 1-1 draw at Forfar West End was, for all of us, very disappointing but unfortunately, for me it was not all that unexpected. I know that I really shouldn't be saying this, but, history seemsto have a habit of repeating itself. For some peculiar reason Forfar West End v Tayport league games have followed the same pattern. For three seasons now we have gone there and created enough chances to win ten games, only to have come home with three draws.

But let's not get too despondent. Let's keep things in perspective. We've dropped a point away from home and, although the pendulum has swung a bit towards our rivals, experience tells me so many things can happen between now and the last game of the season.

We are in exactly the same position, points-wise, as we were at this stage last season, although we have scored four fewer goals and conceded two fewer goals.. These past three seasons which have included three draws at Forfar West End, the title has come to the Canniepairt on each occasion. Last term we won it with a record 45 points. We can still better that total and, hopefully, then, we will see history repeat itself.

I feel that missing out on a game the previous Saturday didn't help our cause at Forfar. I tried desperately to get an alternative fixture but no team was prepared to play us, home or away. We asked other clubs to take us on at their grounds if they were playable and one such team agreed only to renege at the last minute.

From a personal point of view I feel that it's high time our Regional match secretary was given the power to inform clubs that, if their grounds are unplayable, an alternative fixture would go ahead elsewhere on a playable surface. It really saddens me that a Saturday went by without one fixture being played when there were grounds sitting perfectly playable.

Three weeks ago saw us advance to the next round of the Scottish Cup with a 1-0 victory over Kilsyth Rangers. Although the day didn't go exactly to plan, I felt that we earned the right to progress to the next round with a battling performance, with our goalkeeper Fraser Mann not being asked to do too much on the day against a side which I had described prior to the game as 'dangerous opposition'.

We don't really have to be told much about this afternoon's opposition. Although the two previous meetings have gone our way, our players know that they will have a game on their hands. Total commitment is what we must demand from each other. I want to see more hunger for success from all our players. Success is the drug that keeps me going and there's no way anybody's going to persuade me to kick the habit. A victory this afternoon will satisfy my needs!

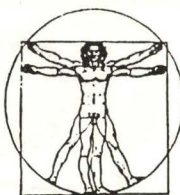

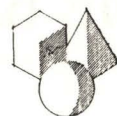

## Sniffing About With The Snout

IF, in 1990, having just witnessed St Joseph's being thumped 9-0 here on the Canniepairt, you were to imagine that, in barely four years time, not only would they not be bottom of the second division but would be playing in front of a bigger crowd than Dundee FC in a First Division game, you'd likely be wheeled away by the men in the white coats. But that's exactly what happened three weeks ago. St Joseph's v Kilwinning Rangers OVD tie attracted a bigger audience than the Clydebank v Dundee game played the same afternoon. In 1999, might we see, say, Elmwood playing in front of a bigger crowd than Dundee United? You just never know. It's a funny game, football. Ask St Johnstone. Ask a Stenhousemuir fan.

THE Scottish Junior F.A. are to take part in an International Tournament on March 31st and April 1st involving Northern Ireland, Republic of Ireland and the Isle of Man.

SHETTLESTON featured in what was probably Junior Football's first ever transfer Tribunal. The Central League side couldn't agree on a fee with Queen of the South for experienced forward Paddy Kelly, so the Tribunal settled on a fee of £1,000.

Survey shows pitch violence is turning soccer referees away from the game

## Attacks force refs to quit

ALMOST half the referees in amateur football have considered hanging up their boots because of a rising tide of violence on the pitch.

Attacks on officials – including an assault that nearly killed a man, an incident in which a car was driven at a referee, and another in which a player produced a gun and a machete to settle an argument – are the biggest single factor in driving referees out of the game, according to a survey published today.

The survey, conducted by the Sir Norman Chester Centre for Football Research in Leicester, paints a picture of worsening behaviour on the football field and of a culture of abuse and dissent aimed at match officials.

It shows that 48.9 per cent of referees from a sample of 463 have considered giving up the game, mainly because of "harassment by players/fans". When asked what was the worst thing about being a referee, 69.5 per cent cited abuse from players and spectators, and, when asked about standards of behaviour among players, 63.2 per cent said they were deteriorating.

The research, thought to be the first of its kind, was carried out by Jon Williams, senior researcher at the Sir Norman Chester Centre among referees in the Birmingham County FA district after the 1993/94 season.

"Most of the referees felt that what was happening on the pitch reflected the violence and lack of respect for authority in society," said Mr Williams. "There is a very low level of morale indeed. The survey showed that the central issues concerning referees revolve around the threat of physical violence, abuse, lack of discipline and dissent."

The Football Association in London said the number of assaults on amateur referees – ranging from light shoves to incidences of serious injury – is static, although it rose slightly last year from 339 in 1992/93 to 356. But at county level, officials say threats and abuse aimed at referees are on the increase.

Last year, Brian Kelly, then aged 28, was punched after sending off a player who hit an opponent during a game in Bexley, Kent. His skull was fractured and he was in a coma for 10 days after having a blood clot removed from his brain. His assailant, Timothy Farnham, 31, was jailed for nine months.

In Scotland last October, a referee who sent off a player was subsequently chased across the pitch by the player in his car. The match was abandoned. A similar incident, involving a van, happened in Nottingham last March. In the same month, a referee officiating in Dulwich, south-east London, was called upon to calm down a player who had walked off the pitch, gone home and returned with a .22 revolver and a machete.

The FA says more referees are registered than ever before, although they do not know how many are active; but some counties say they are recruiting fewer referees than those that have left. The London Football Association, which has about 2,100 teams under its umbrella, has 913 referees on its books, compared with 934 last year.

Alan Nathan, the London region's representative on the divisional committee of the Referees' Association, said violence against its members was increasing inexorably. "There is no question that it is increasing," he said. "The lack of respect for authority manifests itself when people follow supposedly recreational pursuits which they use as an outlet for all the violence and aggression they feel."

"Referees are far more likely to be thumped these days than ever before. It can be very frightening for an official when players round on him. We're just about holding our own at the moment, but I think we could be seeing a shortage of referees in the future."

Jon Williams believes a new image would help referees to appear more like "one of us" and less like "one of them".

He said: "In our Birmingham survey, we found very few working-class, black, Asian or female referees. Instead, we found men who did their best but often felt isolated and alone. They felt that no one talked to them before or after the game; at half-time no one offered them a cup of tea. Basically, they felt threatened and unloved."

"If they were to appear less austere and stuffy, if they reflected the players' social status more, then I think they might find that they are accepted more as part of the overall team and less as the outsider there to be abused."

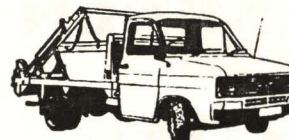
