

#### ANOTHER HOME DRAW

The draw for the sixth round of the OVD Scottish Junior Cup has paired us with West Lothian giants Whitburn. The tie goes on next Saturday with a 3 o' clock kick-off. A healthy attendance is expected and home fans are asked to come early. Fans are reminded that season tickets are not valid for this game and that admission is £2 and £1.

For Whitburn it's another away tie, their fifth in this season's competition. The Burnie are going well on the domestic front also, with a cup final appearance under their belts already this season. The East Region championship has just escaped their grasp these last three seasons, two third places and a runners-up spot, but they are well placed to take the flag this season.

At least six coach loads of fans are expected to follow Whitburn north for their first game on Tayside for a very long time. Whitburn, of course were involved in that infamous game at Dalry a fortnight ago but both their fans and players received nothing but praise for the way they conducted themselves.

Whitburn's Social Club was packed for last Sunday's draw which was later relayed on Scotsport and, although the draw wasn't clearcut the concensus of opinion was that it was an interesting draw.

Snow caused the postponement of two of the three replays due last Saturday. Unfortunately in the replay that did go ahead, North End went out , beaten 4-1 by a more than capable Camelon team. However, by all accounts, it was the team which took its chances which progressed to the next stage, North End creating as many if not more than their opponents.

This afternoon Tranent visit Loch Park, New Cumnock bidding to become the team to end Glenafton's domination of the competition in recent seasons. What bet a surprise result?

The other replay takes Kelty Hearts to Barrhead to meet the fancied Arthurlie. There were two inspections before last Saturday's game was finally called off. The second inspection was so late that the Kelty team bus was parked outside the club secretary's house with its engine ticking over waiting for the phone to ring with the referee's decision.

The draw has brought the winners of this afternoon's replays together in the quarter finals. There is therefore, the possibility of a repeat of last season's semi final tie between Glenafton and Arthurlie. The Glens won 4-0 on that occasion after surviving a first half siege by the Central League champions.

Camelon's Carmuirs Park will be packed to the gunwales for the Mariners' meeting with Kilwinning Rangers in the third of the quarter final ties. The present Ayrshire League leaders attracted 2,500 to Abbey Park for their tie with Lewis United and a sizeable proportion of that crowd are sure to follow the Gers to Falkirk.

A healthy support is also expected to follow our Tayside colleagues Lochee United to Hill o' Beath. These are exciting times for a Lochee team which has tasted defeat only once in something like 26 games this season. Lochee ended the hopes of Ashfield in Glasgow so won't be intimidated by the tight confines of Keir's Park.



# Today's Visitors

Longside have a pool of 20 players but today's selection will come from 15. Injuries and the third of a three match suspension for skipper Gavin Fraser rule out five members of the pool.

In goal will be GARY MUTCH. Gary signed for the club from Maud Juniors whilst Longside were still in the amateurs and has been the last line of defence since.

IAIN FRASER. Vastly experienced full back who spent ten years withh Peterhead in the Highland League where he won a championship medal. Signed last year, Iain adds class to the Longside back division.

COLIN ROBERTSON. A reliable and rugged defender signed from Highland League Fraserburgh.

GRAHAM CATTO. Joined up this season from Fraserburgh United Juniors and was in outstanding form until injured some five weeks ago. Restarted training recently and could be in line for a comeback.

ZANDER WHYTE. Doubles up as manager, the defender or midfielder has worn the Longside colours for almost 20 years. Has deputised for the injured Catto in recent weeks.

MICHAEL McCAFFERTY. Midfielder Mike will be familiar with the Canniepairt, having turned out for Arbroath SC when his work brought him south. In his second spell at the club, a spell at Fraserburgh FC sandwiched in between.

RUSSELL ROBERTSON. Midfield. Was out of favour for a while but has fought his way back into the side and has produced some solid performances.

NEIL NIVEN. Midfield. Neil is in his second season at Davidson Park, having joined up from Summer League side Longside Thistle.

MARK FINNIE . Midfield. Enjoying his second spell with the club having rejoined from Turriff United. Has been struggling to shake off illness recently.

SCOTT SHAW. Forward. Yet to establish himself in the team, Scott has displayed a lack of consistency which has kept him on the fringe of the team.

JIM GUYAN. Very experienced forward with a number of Senior clubs on his C.V. Won every honour in the Highland League. Man who makes the side tick, Jim is in his second season at Longside where he has recently been appointed co-manager with Zander Whyte.

GILBERT STEPHEN. In his first season at Davidson Park but such has been his form that several Highland Laegue sides are sniffing around.

JIM BAIN. Forward. Jim was at Longside as a youngster, moving into the Highland League with Peterhead and Keith. Rejoined Longside when they moved into the Junior ranks.

JOHN FRASER . Long serving player who was, for many seasons, the club's top scorer but injury and illness have restricted his appearances these last two seasons.

KENNY MACDONALD. Defender from Stornaway who once had a spell on the books at Dundee United. P.E. teacher by profession, Kenny joined up at Longside last season when his work took him to the area.

# The Baker's Bit

Good afternoon to our supporters and a warm welcome also to the players and officials of Longside.

With Mel away on club business and myself laid low with a flu bug, Jimmy Hunter ran the show last week with the assistance of Andy Sommerville who is recovering from an exploratory operation on his knee. And a great job they did, recording a good 4-0 victory over Kirrie Thistle. It's great to see a few goals starting to go in again. Let's now hope that we can build on this win and carry it into today's encounter.

As I'm sure that you all know, we've been drawn at home next week to Whitburn. At this stage in the competition, a home draw is about the best that you could ask for. Whitburn are the top Junior side in the East Region. They have already contested a cup final this season and, if they win their games in hand, they would overtake Camelon at the top of their league.

I know that they don't seem to be getting the rave reviews which their main rivals seem to enjoy but, nevertheless they are a top drawer side and are on a run of victories.

We, on the other hand, have got to start to being realistic. No disrespect to our previous opponents in this Scottish Cup campaign but we've not really played a side of any real quality - and struggled into the bargain (or at the least just done enough)

I'm afraid what we've done in the past isn't going to be good enough if we're going to proceed in the tournament. It's going to require a top class performance from Tayport.

The quality is definitely here. It's the commitment that I sometimes question. Well, from now on in there can be no hiding place. It's time for everyone to stand up and be counted. I pose the question - Are we good enough? Have we got what it takes? I await the answer with great anticipation.

This afternoon's visitors are the rising stars of the North Region, winning the first division championship last term and they have carried that form into this season in the Premier Division.

We know only too well about teams from the North. Remember Banks O' Dee only last season ? A poor performance on the day allowed a team which Longside passed on the way up to the top division, to steal a victory. Why? Because we didn't give them the respect which they were due. When you do that you walk a very thin line.

We cannot allow that to happen this afternoon. Longside are a bigger, stronger and better team than the side that we met this time last season. If we show them the respect that they're due, then I'm confident that we'll progress in this Cup.





# Today's Game

Longside, like Tayport are fairly recent additions to the Junior ranks, having affiliated a year earlier than ourselves, making their debut in the 1989/90 season.

The present club was formed in 1948, playing Summer League football until joining the Aberdeenshire Amateur League in 1974. It was success all the way in the Amateurs with the decision to turn Junior made in time for the start of the 1989/90 season.

They were promoted to the Premier Division as runners-up in 1991-92 but failed to establish themselves and were relegated immediately. It was only a temporary dip in form, however, as they came up again last season as champions.

Longside itself is situated six miles intand from Peterhead and boasts an excellent ground at Davidson Park. The ground was developed throughout the 1960's and 70's and gradual improvements have been made up to the present day. As well as having floodlights on their main pitch, there are two floodlit training areas and a grandstand.

The final piece of the Davidson Park jigsaw is their Social Club which was opened at the end of last year.

A measure of Longside's ambition and commitment to the future wellbeing of the club can be seen in the appointment of a full time Commercial Manager, Rill Wallace, just over a year ago and the appointment of a full time Groundsman, Eric McRitchie in June last year.

All this doesn't come cheap, however, and the main funding is through the club's successful Red & Black Private Executive Culb and the sale of monthly "Cracker" tickets.

Longside F.C. are sponsored by LOVIE Ltd. from charmingly named Cowbog, New Pitsligo in a three year arrangement.

Longside haven't had many away trips out of their Region in their six years in the Juniors. In previous seasons they have visited Kilbirnie and East Kilbirde. Indeed they have equalled all their previous awaydays together this season with a second trip to Fife in the past three months. Their last visit to the Kingdom saw their OVD hopes disappear at Hill of Beath.


