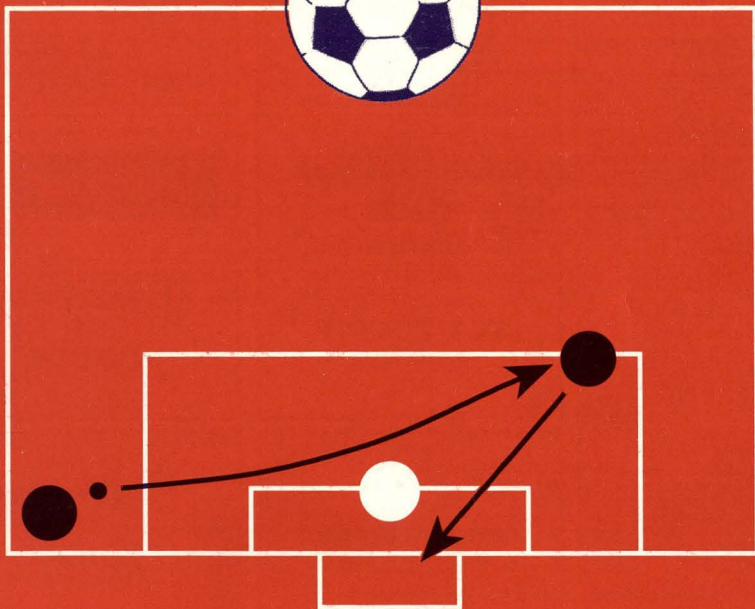

Today's Game

The Canniepairt is the venue this afternoon for what should be its game of the season. It's sure to attract its biggest crowd of the season for the meeting of two of the top sides in the east of Scotland, indeed two of the best teams in Scotland. Often big games such as today's do not live up to the pre-match hype with the occasion perhaps getting to the players.

However, with no shortage of experience in either team, hopefully we'll see a match today that will live up to the billing. For Tayport it's a third quarter final in four years and for Whitburn it's an opportunity to reach their fourth semi-final in eight years.

Although founded in 1934, it's only in relatively recent times that the Claret & Ambers have been consistently successful with four East Region Championships and two Fife & Lothian cups inside the last ten years.

The nearest The Burnies have come to Scottish Junior Cup success was in 1966 when, after a 1-1 draw, they crashed 1-6 to local rivals Bonnyrigg Rose at Hampden Park. In 1988 a 2-1 replay defeat from Auchinleck cost them a Final appearance. In 1990 Lesmahagow ended the Whitburn dreams with a 3-2 semi final win and in 1994 Auchinleck again did the damage, winning 1-0.

Tayport's first tilt at a semi-final place saw Glenafton win a controversial tie by 3-1 in 1993. The following year there was joy for the Port Support when a marathon three game quarter final tie was ended by Dave Reilly's goal against Downfield which set up that never-to-be-forgotten night at Firhill against Auchinleck.

With such memories still fresh in the minds of both supports, there will be great anticipation and no little anxiety amongst the punters. Let's hope that they get a classic match to cheer.

Although Tayport and Whitburn boast the two best defensive records in the Junior Football Leagues, there is no shortage of skill elsewhere in the respective line-ups. Tayport's main strike force of Reilly, Mackay and Cameron have hit exactly 300 goals between them for the club, some crackers amongst them.

Whitburn, as well as possessing rock solid defenders such as Prior and Belcher, have players with an abundance of skill and the confidence to display this skill. Main striker David Scott is one example as are ex-East Fife men Paul Taylor and Carlo Crolla.

Whitburn have no injury or suspension problems apart from player/manager Brian McNaughton who has been troubled with a knee injury of late.

Tayport will not have the services of Mark Spalding (suspended) while Jackie Devine is struggling with injury but Andy Sommerville could be in line for a place following an exploratory knee operation.

Should this afternoon's tie end in a draw then the replay will go ahead at Whitburn next Saturday with a 2.30pm kick-off to allow for extra-time and penalties if necessary.

The Baker's Bit

I'd like to begin by welcoming our Scottish cup opponents Whitburn to the Canniepairt today and a good afternoon to the Port support.

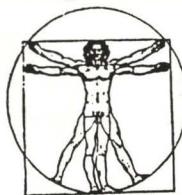

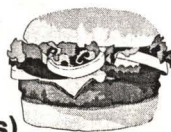

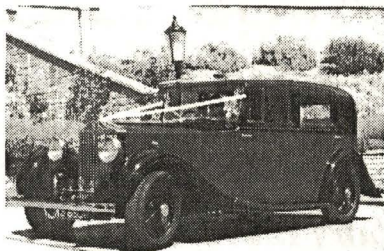

O.V.D. HIGH STAKES TODAY CUP

Last Saturday's comprehensive replay wins for ARTHURLIE and GLENAFTON ATHLETIC paved the way for this afternoon's four OVD Scottish Junior Cup ties. Glenafton have dominated the competition since 1990/91. After being trounced 4-1 at Whitburn in the 3rd round the previous season, Glens reached the semi final in 1991 and the final itself for each of the next three seasons. To boost their attempts to make it to the final for a fourth successive year they swooped to sign Stephen Quigg from Largs Thistle. Quigg, who appeared in the Ibrox final against Glens last season, quickly repaid some of his transfer fee with one of the goals against Tranent. McKenzie and Walker netted the others.

Dunterlie Park held a 1,500 crowd for Arthurlie's 4-0 win over Kelty Hearts. 3-0 up by half-time, the Barrhead side were never in trouble and scored through Wilson(2), Anderson and McDonald.

Glenafton v Arthurlie today is a repeat of last year's semi final which Glenafton won by 4-0. Despite having home advantage, the Loch Park side will have to pull out all the stops to prevent the Central League champions ending their magnificent OVD Cup record.

KILWINNING RANGERS, tipped by many to lift the cup for the first time since 1909, are at CAMELON. Camelon are unbeaten in the East Region Division One this season and with seven games left to play are seven points ahead of the pack. Rangers, currently carrying the biggest support of the eight cup survivors, lead the Ayrshire League so the stage is set for a titanic clash at Carmuir's Park.

HILL O' BEATH are runaway leaders of the Fife League, eight points ahead of the pack, and will be formidable opposition for LOCHEE UNITED at Keirs Park. United, though, will travel with a healthy support confident of causing an upset and extending their winning run to six games.

The bookies certainly don't think that Lochee are going to go any further. At 20/1 they're rank outsiders to win the cup while Hill O' Beath, their opponents on Saturday, are the shortest priced of all

the teams in the last eight.
