

The Baker's Bit

Jeanfield Swifts provide our league opposition this afternoon. I'd like to welcome their players and officials to the Canniepairt. It's been a wee while since I last penned a column. If you cast your mind back it was before our league victory over Montrose. My recollection of the game was how well we started but failed to capitalise on our outfield supremacy. But, with a bit of help from our opponents, managing to reduce themselves to ten men, things began to work in our favour and we ran out 6-0 winners.

My feelings are of disappointment with the following week's 1-1 draw at Thomson Park. On chances we should have been sitting 4-1 ahead at half-time instead of having to settle for a 1-0 lead. With the elements in our favour in the second half, we really should have proved too strong for Lochee. Instead of rubbing salt into the wound we allowed them back into the game and got what we deserved. Although I must add that a dreadful offside decision stopped us going two up. Only time will tell whether it was a point gained or lost. Two different away cup ties followed and, on both occasions, we were forced into extra time. 1-0 at Downfield and 3-0 at Arbroath has seen us advance in both competitions. It was disappointing that we didn't finish them off in the 90 minutes. We had umpteen chances to do so.

At least we managed to seal a victory within the 90 minutes on Wednesday past. Two goals from Kevin Vannet did the damage over Carnoustie giving us two more valuable points. Once again we never looked like losing a goal. There is no doubt that, like myself,

our supporters are becoming a bit frustrated at us not turning our outfield supremacy into more goals. I can assure you that it's not something that has gone unnoticed by the coaching staff. We've worked hard lately in training to rectify the problems. And we'll keep on doing so until it comes good. We've got, without doubt, three of the best strikers in the Region and, really, it's down to them to put in the hard work in training and in matches. I'm sure the confidence will return. I've been there myself. There's no magic wand. You simply have to put the bad behind you and, with hard graft, the good will return. As a club we need these players back to their best if we're to continue our phenomenal success over the past 5 seasons. A victory today will put us on 40 points with three games to play. We hold the record with 45 points.

Above the pavilion flies a flag, on it the dates 1990/91/92/93/94. I want to see 95 going on it also. That can be achieved as can four cup wins. Every game from here on in must be treated, in terms of attitude as a cup final. Do so, then I'm sure we'll not be far away.

REVEREND FRANCIS COUGAN

With the introduction of the Juniors to the town in 1990 Mr Cougan quickly had his interest in the game rekindled, and was a season ticket holder in each of our five seasons. He didn't get to as many matches as he might have liked but he followed the fortunes of the team through the press and the *Port Prog*

SCOTTISH AMATEURS GET TOUGH!

The following is an extract from the Minute of the Meeting of the Executive & Finance Committee of the Scottish Amateur Football Association

Guidelines to Associations/Leagues on suspensions regarding serious matters

Referee Assault

SINE DIE with recommendation of a minimum suspension of 10 years before consideration can be given to raising the suspension.

Physically Threatening Referee - depending on degree of assault Minimum suspension of 5 years

Verbally Threatening Referee Minimum suspension of 3 years

Physical Assault on Club Officials Minimum suspension of 1 year

Serious Violent Conduct - e.g. Deliberately Kicking Opponent on Head Minimum suspension of 3 years

Headbutting Minimum suspension of 1 year

Spitting
Minimum suspension of 1 year

Deliberately and Knowingly Playing A Suspended Player Under An Assumed Name Minimum suspension of 5 years

Deliberately Playing While Under Suspension, Using An Assumed Name Minimum suspension of 5 years

Deliberately And Knowingly Playing a Suspended Player Minimum suspension of 5 years

Deliberately Playing While Under Suspension Minimum suspension of 3 years

Nobody condones indiscipline but the above punishments do not seem to compare very favourably with those meted out in the Senior game. Nevertheless, it is a warning to players in the Amateur game not to step out of line.



JEANFIELD SWIFTS

Since we joined the Juniors, Jeanfield Swifts have been a permanent fixture in the first division. No longer, however, as, next season they will be playing their football in Division Two.

Whilst Swifts have invariably given us a tough game, they have failed to show that spirit in too many of their other games it appears and have failed to arrest the slump which set in during last season. With, probably the Region's best Social Club adjacent to one of the Region's best grounds, Simpson Park, it should be unthinkable that Swifts will not be playing their football at the top level next season.

Manager Drew Hay has had a troubled time since he took over a team already on the slippery slope. Injury problems and a failure to attract new faces has meant that he has had to struggle on with often a bare minimum of players.

Youngster Mark Murray has been holding down the No.1 spot, being preferred to the more experienced Alan Morris, an ex-Newport Amateurs goalie. Chris Martin, another ex-Newport lad is the lynchpin of the Swifts back four and always puts in spirited dispay against Tayport.

Left back Stewart Cassidy formerly played his football in Dundee, latterly with Downfield, and could hardly have expected to be relegated when he moved up river to play with Swifts.

Defender Scott McIntyre arrived at Simpson Park from Forfar Athletic via the Highland League and previously played with Newburgh in the Fife League. Helped his father-in-law, Forfar Athletic manager Tommy Campbell, crack open the champagne last weekend.

Despite their team's poor showing this season both fullback Steven Robertson and midfielder Clayton Robertson have impressed sufficiently to be included in the Tayside Select to meet the North Region for the Chapman Cup at Swifts' Simpson Park tomorrow.

Up front Swifts have the goalpower of Graeme Mackay. The ex-Fair City man netted five last week against Luncarty and, along with Willie Hutchison , provides Swifts with a fairly potent strike force. Hutchie is not long back from injury but has proved he has not lost his goal touch with a double in the win against Harp two weeks ago and a treble v Luncarty last Saturday.



AMONG THE ARCHIVES 23 years ago today

Exactly 23 years ago this weekend Tayport FC took their first tentative steps on foreign soil when the Amateurs made their debut in the Bergmans-Collignon International Challenge Tournament in Ougree, a suburb of Liege in Belgium.

It was to be the beginning of a wonderful friendship, a friendship which lasts to this day. Next month a team from Newport Amateurs, including a sprinkling of 'veterans' of such trips from Tayport travels to Belgium to participate in this year's Tournament.

Twenty four were in the party that made that first trip including the present club chairman, vice-chairman ,secretary and Groundsman Davie Hughes who was seeking to renew acquaintances made during the Second World War!

Also in the party was Councillor Walter Goodwin. Councillor Goodwin had been sent along by the Tayport Town Council to look after their interests - they had, after all, subsidised the trip to the tune of £200. Not much, you may think, but it must have been worth a bit more in those days because the total cost per head for travel, accommodation, food and everything else totalled a mere £16 for the five days.

The team which beat the German side S.C.Fuchtorf by 2-1 on 22nd April 1973 was Gordon Brankin; Walter Kemp,Ronnie Fleming; Ian Mathers, Jim Mathers and Eddie Gilmour; Abby Oswald, Doug Henderson,Raymond White, Ian White and Frank Leslie. Subs were George Caldow and Lindsay Ancell. The goals were scored by Oswald and Gilmour.


Others in the party were Andy Johnstone, Murray Anderson, Andrew 'Bunt' Robertson (no show without Punch, even in those days), cheerleader Bobby Jackson, Ian Rae, Alex Houston and the late Bruce Ross and Jimmy Herd. Doug Henderson, who was teaching in France, joined the party over there. He was, incidentally, playing for Paris St Germain at the time.


