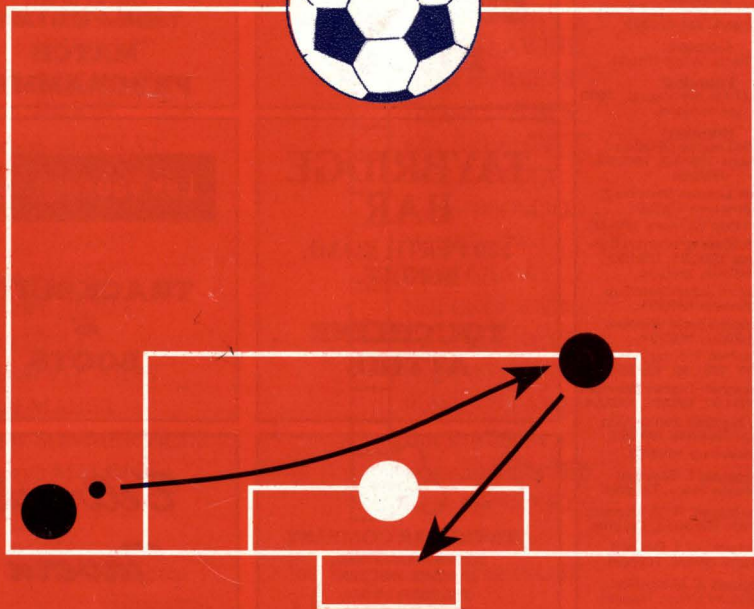

The Baker's Bit

Good afternoon to the Port Support and a warm welcome to our visitors from Aberdeen for this Centenary Cup semi-final.

It's that time of year again with midweek games, hard grounds, aches, pains and blisters. But it's also the most critical period of the season - the time when honours, titles and silverware are won and lost.

The past couple of weeks since our last Port Prog have been kind to us with seven wins out of seven games. A comfortable 3-0 win over Jeanfield was promptly followed by a 3-2 away victory over Kinnoull. I've no doubt that most who read the result in the morning paper would have thought that Tayport had just scraped a win but, for me, that certainly wasn't the case. In fact I was very pleased with our performance on the night. Okay, I know that we lost two goals, but the way we approached the game, our attitude and general play was as good as I've seen this season.

We then went from that good display in Perth to arguably our worst performance of the season. It serves me right for praising our players prior to the match but we still managed a 2-1 win at Forfar WE. Normally we go there, create chance after chance and come home with very little so I suppose a bit of good fortune there was well overdue.

A good first half performance was enough to seal our 2-0 Whyte & Mackay midweek win over St Joseph's. My only regret was having to stop for the half-time break and the fact that we didn't capitalise when they managed to reduce themselves to nine men but I suppose I would have settled for that result going in to the match.

Yet another good first-half performance put us firmly in the driving seat at Scone last Saturday but, once again, we switched off after the interval. Still, we mustn't grumble, the 4-1 win puts us into the quarter final.

Broughty Athletic provided the opposition on Wednesday past in the Cream of the Barley Trophy and four goals in the opening quarter of an hour put us on the road to an 8-0 win, our biggest winning margin of the season.

Today we have the chance to reach another cup final, our 15th in 5 seasons! Not a bad record. But it can only happen if our players approach this afternoon's encounter with the proper attitude. Do so and I'm confident we'll be at North End Park on Saturday 3rd June for the final against Dundee Violet.

TODAY'S GAME

This will be the second occasion on which Sunnybank have visited The Canniepairt. The first visit was in the quarter final of the same competition, then sponsored by Zamoyski, on 18th April 1992.

It was a good afternoon for Tayport and the Port Support with the Aberdonians going down by 4-0 thanks to goals from Dave Reilly, Mark Spalding, Kevin Thoms and Gary Lamont. Seven of Tayport's line-up that day are likely to be in the team today - Fraser Mann, Paul Reilly, Grant Paterson, Hamish Mackay, Jimmy Hunter, Dave Reilly and Mark Spalding. Of the other four, Lamont and Cushnie are at St Joseph's, Thoms has retired through injury and Devine is currently injured.

The match comment that day was- "...good crowd, good performance, good goals. Always in control. Spalding's goal just before half-time finished off a devastating passing movement. 2nd half highlight was Lamont's 15 yard headed goal..."

We can't expect such an easy passage on this occasion. Sunnybank will be here expecting to get a result, especially following their stunning 9-0 quarter final win over Inverurie Locos. This is Sunnybank's best run in the competition and they carry the hopes of the North Region in what is both their own and Tayside's Premier cup competition, second only to in importance to the OVD Scottish Junior Cup.

Tayport's recent good form will be put to the test in a game which has to be played to a finish, with extra time and penalty kicks if necessary. The reward for the winner is a cup final spot at North End Park. North End Social Club officials will be in attendance today to select and present the 'Man of the Match' Award. Can Grant Paterson make it three in a row? Today's 'gate' and half-time draw will be administered by North/Tayside Association officials.

Tayport hit goal No. 300

TAYPORT recorded a hard-earned 3-2 win at Kinnoull

and, in doing so, netted their 300th goal since they entered the Tayside Juniors' First Division four seasons ago.

Since setting foot in the First, Tayport have played 102 league games, won 78, drawn 20 and lost only four.

Only 60 goals have been conceded, with 302 being scored.

Sniffing About With The Snout

TAYPORT Amateurs made a bit of history recently when they were awarded a replay against Fintry Thistle. During the course of the Midlands League game, Fintry had a player given a yellow card. Tayport took the resultant free kick only for the ball to be cleared down the field for Fintry to score what turned out to be the winning goal. Before the game could be restarted from the centre, Tayport officials drew the ref's attention to the fact that this player's yellow card was the player's second yellow card of the game. The referee consulted his notebook, realised his error and duly sent the player off but allowed the goal to stand. Tayport felt a bit aggrieved but a subsequent check of the rule book did not reveal anything which would cover such an occurrence. Nevertheless the matter was reported to the authorities.

It turned out to be a unique situation and was taken to the highest football authority which suggested to the Midlands that a replay of the fixture should be the decision. This the Midlands Executive decided to do thus setting a soccer precedent.

SCOTLAND Junior team boss Dennis Gray has decided to combine his running of the Scotland team with the day to day running of Beith Juniors. Gray was tipped to leave Beith for the Scotland job but a 400 name petition from the Beith fans helped him change his mind. Apparently SJFA Council members are fizzing - not about Dennis's decision, but about the fact that they first learned of the decision from an Ayrshire provisional newspaper! Snout can reveal that the paper quoted Gray as saying "I have spoken to the SJFA and the Beith committee and everyone is happy with this arrangement" Somebody, somewhere has slipped up.

AUCHINLECK Talbot boss John Minford has resigned. Talbot are currently top of the Ayrshire league but a defeat from Kilwinning in the Whyte & Mackay Cup (that's the West of Scotland Cup) prompted his resignation. One of the names being bandied about for the job is that of the aforementioned Dennis Gray, a former player at Talbot in their halcyon days and the man who led Cumnock to their Junior Cup triumph in 1989.

SCONE Thistle produced an excellent programme for our Intersport Shield match there last week. Not surprisingly the production was the work of Scott Farquharson. Scott seems to do everything at Scone. Runs the pie shop, sells the programmes, does the gate, looks after the half-time drinks, reports the game for the Sporting Post, erects and dismantles the advertising banners. His efforts have been rewarded this season, however, with the second division championship already in the bag under the management of Dutch Perth Travel Agent Tom Van Der Ham.

STILL on Scone. Last Saturday the Division two champs conceded only 3 free kick in the entire 90 minutes. They conceded none at all in the first half, apart from a penalty, and the the first of the three didn't come along until the hour mark. Compare that with the previous Wednesday when our opposition, St Joseph's, conceded six free kicks inside the opening five minutes.

WE mentioned the other week that Kilwinning Rangers were looking to raise £500,000 to fund the building of a new stadium. Well, they are off to a good start with donations rolling in. £50,000 has already been raised. Included amongst the donations is £25,000 from one of their sponsors and £500 from the local Masonic Lodge.
