

The prize for this evening's victors is a place in the final of the Cream of the Barley Trophy against Downfield or Blairgowrie on Saturday week.

Fans of both sides will need no reminding of the last time the clubs met in this Tournament. It was just over a year ago at the quarter final stage when Panmure stuffed us by a record 5-2. Such was the surprise that folk were phoning the newspaper next day to confirm the scoreline.

How did the record books record that one? "What can you say! 2-0 up and cruising, Tayport were stunned by the Gowfers who hit five goals in the last thirty minutes to give us our heaviest ever defeat - more goals lost in that half hour than in our last 10 games!"

Inconsistency has been Panmure's problem this season and that has been reflected in their mid table placing in the league. The fact that they are in two cup semi-finals suggests that cup football is more to their liking. This was shown as recently as last Saturday when they returned a 3-1 victory at Forfar West End in the Intersport Shield thanks to a Brian Craik hat-trick.

Carnoustie have shown in their two previous meetings to the Canniepairt that they are stuffy opposition. A late Steven Stewart goal was all that separated the teams in the OVD tie while in the league in April it was two second half goals from Kevin Vannet which kept us on track for the title.

A keen contest is anticipated with extra-time and penalty kicks to be used if necessary to determine the outcome.

PORT PROG IS BEST IN SCOTLAND-OFFICIAL

It has just been announced that the Port Prog has been voted the Best Non-League Programme in Scotland. Tayport's Matchday Programme topped the Scottish poll with 115 points, 3 points ahead of last season's winner Largs Thistle and ten ahead of third placed Ardeer, both of the Ayrshire Juniors. Included in the poll were the three Non League Senior Leagues, the Highland League, East of Scotland and the South of Scotland League. Nearest Tayside rivals were St Joseph's who trailed 23 points behind.

UK-wide, Tayport didn't fare so well, finishing 124th=, not bad I suppose, from a total entry of 1133.



'FORGET THE REST GET THE BEST'

The Baker's Bit

I don't know how many times negative people have tried to bring us down this season. "It's the end of an era", one said to me. "Baker, you must concede that the Joeys are going to win the league", said another. Of course, I've had doubts, but, throughout this season I've honestly believed we could win the title and, make no mistake about it, Tayport won the Tayside 1st Division title for the fourth consecutive time. Why? Because, quite simply, we're the best!

A fortnight ago we sat three points adrift and we had two very difficult games ahead. So did they. I knew in my soul that we could win ours and I've said all along that they would falter as, of course they did. I likened their position, prior to their last 2 games to the climbing of Mount Everest. They did magnificently to reach final base camp but the hardest part of the climb was still in front of them. As they looked out from their tents, a storm was brewing in the form of Tayport FC. They had a go for the summit and took a severe beating, were mentally shattered and hoped like hell that the weather would relent. Running out of oxygen and willpower they had their one and only go at reaching the summit. They failed. Why? Quite simply – the best team wins the league –not the second best!

I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone connected with the club for their continued support. No matter how little you think you did, at least you did it and should be proud that you were part of our success.

Carnoustie Panmure provide the opposition for tonight's Cream of the Barley Trophy semi-final and I'd like to take this opportunity to welcome their players and officials to the Canniepairt.

I saw a number of incidents in last Saturday's game with St Joseph's that filled me with so many emotions. One of admiration, two of repulsion and a third one of sadness.

Mental tiredness lost us the match in extra time but, for something like 140 minutes, the scoreline read Tayport 7 St Joseph's 0. George Malone, who stood beside me for most of the 3hrs.30mins, told me later that, once the first St Joseph's goal went in, he knew Tayport were going to lose. And I think a number of our players felt the same way.

But I saw an incident late on in the game which everyone should take on board. The ball was played long over Sean Wilkie's head, down the left hand side of the park to a former Tayport winger who really must have been bursting with energy and hoping to prove his boss wrong. I saw Sean strain every part of his body, not only to make up a five yard start but to win a tackle and take possession. This incident proved an important point to me – where the mind goes, everything follows – you're only as tired as you want to be. That's why Sean is captain of Tayport FC.

The two incidents of repulsion, I can't really comment upon but everyone who was at last Saturday's game wii know exactly what I'm talking about. The word 'cowards' would probably cover both incidents.

On my last emotion, I'm the first to agree that referees have a difficult job to do. Abraham Lincoln once said 'You can please some of the people some of the time, but you can't please all of the people all of the time. The official's job, as I see it, is to enforce the rules of the game in the best possible way. If he achieves that, then he'll gain respect. Let's face it — without respect you're struggling. Guess who's struggling in my book.

I said before the Sunnybank semi-final that we had an opportunity to reach our 15th cup final in 5 seasons and we're there! So tonight, the 16th cup final beckons but, make no mistake about it, it doesn't get any easier. We must be mentally strong and produce the goods. if we approach this game as we should, I'm confident we can reach another cup final.

Rab Downie replaced Colin Gray and he, in turn, was replaced by Kenny Smith(now of the Grampian Hotel and one of our current sponsors). Subs who weren't used were Neil Downie and Bruce Burnett.

Kevin Murphy (now a bus driver for Tayside Buses, I think) hit a hat-trick in the final with Allan Harte getting the other. Phil Smith's performance earned him the award of 'Young Player of the Tournament'.





United have surprised a few by getting to the final. There's no love lost between the two finalists and Haws will start as hot favourites.


