Today's Visitors

Tayport's success since they were promoted to division one in 1990/91 has coincided with Bankfoot's demise. The following season when Tayport were crowned champions, the Coronation Park outfit were relegated. The following season Bankfoot finished fourth bottom of division two. Last season, though, they showed much improved form and were only pipped for promotion in the run-in.

Goal difference denied Bankfoot a place in the semi finals of the Downfield SC League Cup when Broughty edged them out by beating Luncarty by 6-0 last Saturday. The previous week Bankfoot had shared two goals with Broughty at Whitton Park and last Saturday in the league they shocked East Craigie by winning the league encounter between the sides by the only goal of the game at Craigie Park. Travelling down to the coast for a third successive week, the Perthshire lads will be looking to maintain their good away form.

Bankfoot Mike Cormack was coaching in the U.S.A. during the summer and is considering an offer to return to the States soon to take up a longer coaching contract. Mike is supported at Coronation Park by coaches Robin Wood and Ally Gillies.

In goal will be RAB AITKEN, the team's captain and longest serving player. Plenty experience and as good a keeper as there is in the second division. CRAIG WILLIAMSON, full back in his second season with the club having signed from Kinnoull. IAIN MORRISON. Left back also in his second season. Signed from Comrie Amateurs. Talented left peg. Likes to attack. SCOTT DAVIDSON, 19 years old defender signed from Rosyth Under 18's. At 6'3" rated a good prospect. STEVEN McDUGALL, another youngster. Plays in midfield. Powerful tackler. 20 years old SANDY ROSS is the only local in the squad. Centre half who is strong in the air. Notched the Bankies' equaliser at Broughty the other week. BARRY MALCOLM, very experienced midfielder or sweeper. Signed from Jeanfield. SCOTT ADDISON, sweeper in his first season at Bankfoot after signing from Scone. Been out through injury but likely to be in action today.

MIKE SIMPSON, terrier like player who plays on the right hand side of midfield. 21 years old in his 3rd season at the club. Makes up in enthusiasm what he lacks in height. GLENN MILLER, in his first season after spending six months playing in Sweden. Formerly with Jeanfield, Kinnoull and Scone. Provides bite in midfield. BRIAN MARTIN, versatile player who reads the game well and possesses a powerful shot, Second season at Coronation Park. MARTIN MCGAFFNEY, 21 years old, has been a good servant to the club since signing from N.Muirton Under 18's. Strong in the air and in the tackle. Netted last Saturday's winner at East Craigie. IAIN KERR, another in his second year with the club. Creative midfielder who has the reputation as being the team's practical joker.

MARK ROBERTSON, big strong lad in his third season. Makes his height tell at set pieces. JOHN ROBERTSON, 18 years old who has not yet become established in the side. A useful prospect, though, who shows promise. ALAN SINCLAIR, striker signed this season from Scone. Was amongst the goals earlier this season when he hit four against Luncarty. ROSS SHEPHERD. Recent signing who hails from Ballinluig. Was with Vale of Atholl last season. Strikes a good ball and has quickly made his mark with two spectacular goals already this season. NEIL JOHNSTONE. Big striker noted for his selfless running. Also in Bankfoot's squad could be SHEIKH NYASS, a Gambian who has been on trial. A 28 year old, he plays up front or in central defence.

Good afternoon to the Port Support and a warm welcome to the players and officials of Bankfoot, our visitors to the Canniepairt today.

The last couple of Saturdays have seen us record two good victories and gain four league points. I felt that the 4-0 win at home to Kinnoull flattered us a bit. I know that we were never in any trouble but it's the standard of our play which we must use as a yardstick - and it wasn't near what I'm looking for. However the first 45 minutes in last week's encounter at Carnoustie did give me much more pleasure. The standard and commitment was very much better, especially in midfield. Games are won and lost in there and I've no doubt in my mind that that was the difference.

As you probably know by now, our first round Scottish Cup opponents are Forth Wanderers. They'll be happy to have home advantage and I know they'll be doing their homework which is something we'll also do.

In fact I know that they attended our game at Carnoustie last week and have also been in touch with our Regional secretary,

Today's opponents need no introduction to Tayport. We have always had a good relationship with Bankfoot and long may it continue. Although a second division side, they must be respected. Athletic are a very well organised side which is a tribute to their management and coaching staff. Our last two encounters will back that up. Our players know this only too well. They also know that the standards which we set. If we drop them we'll struggle. So let's keep them high and get ourselves into the next round of the Perthshire Advertiser Cup.

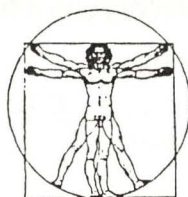
BEWARE! THE SPIDER RETURNS



ALMOST 18 years ago Tayport Amateurs' manager at the time, Bobby Waddell uttered the words that effectively ended the Tayport career of one of his players at that time - "he'll never play for this team again!". And so ended the Tayport career of one Graham 'Spider' McLaren - or so we all thought. And 18 years on we'd be entitled to think that. However last Saturday, McLaren's days in the wilderness were ended when, at the ripe old age of 44, he pulled on a Tayport Amateurs jersey again, helping the team to a 1-1 draw with Broughty United. In his absence Tayport have played 77 Scottish Amateur Cup ties but today in Aberdeen Spider is set to play his first tie for Tayport since that fateful day at Cambusbarron in 1977.

What happened at Cambusbarron? Well, Tayport had reached the 6th round of the Scottish Amateur Cup for the first time ever and, despite being drawn away to favourites Cambusbarron, were fancied to go all the way. Things didn't go to plan and Tayport found themselves 0-2 behind. A fighting finish saw Keith Ritchie pull back a goal with a wonder strike and Tayport were back in business. They were pressing for an equaliser which would have brought a replay when Spider committed the deed which saw Waddell tell him not to darken Tayport's doorstep again. With little danger apparent Spider leapt for a throw-in inside Tayport's penalty area and, in best basketball fashion, caught the ball! Cambusbarron scored from the spot, Tayport were out and Waddell went bananas.

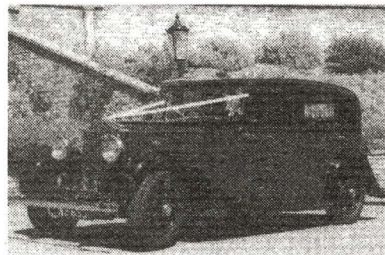

Bankfoot have a host of talented young players - remember this is the club which fielded Paul Sturrock as a 14 year old - and cannot be treated lightly.

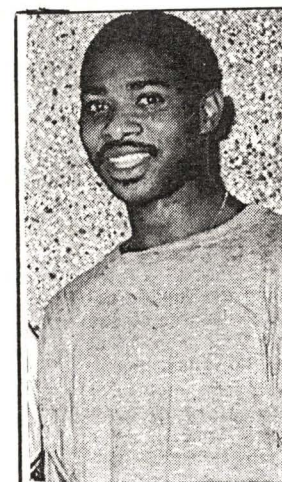
