



TAYPORT TAKE RUNNERS-UP SPOT IN OVD QUIZ

Scottish Junior F.A. officials Joe Black and Ronnie Orr were in Dundee on Monday evening in company with representatives of OVD Rum to run the first ever OVD Rum Scottish Junior Football Quiz. The event took place at the Downfield Social Club and was the first of six regional quizzes which the sponsors are running.

All the questions were on Scottish Junior Football, the first part being restricted to Tayside Junior Football

The Jeanfield Swifts team won the competition with 43 points. Tayport and North End tied for second place with 36 points. We then went into a tie break with North End. The teams still couldn't be separated but a second tie break saw Tayport edge out their opponents.

The other scores were: Referees 1V 35; Downfield'A' 32; Forfar Albion 30; Violet 31; Downfield 'B' 28; East Craigie 25; Forfar West End 24; Lochee United 23.

The Baker's Bit

Good afternoon and a warm welcome to the players and officials of Forth Wanderers and, of course, to the Port Support.

I was hoping that we'd be playing in a league game this afternoon and not having to entertain another Scottish Cup tie, but really, we've only got ourselves to blame for that. You can't play for 45 minutes and then decide to go missing for the following 45. To be perfectly honest, I was extremely disappointed with our performance in that second half.

The majority of our players have been over this course so many times before. In fact today will be our 27th Scottish Cup tie in the past four years. Some players badly let themselves down last Saturday. I said before last week that I felt that the playing surface at Forth could be a big factor in the outcome a great leveller - if we tried to play a passing game on it.

To be fair, the first half went mainly to plan and I felt that we deserved more than our 1-0 interval lead but, as we all know, a game lasts 90 minutes and for the latter half we quite literally lost the place and, may I say, the pace.

The half-time instructions seemed to have gone in one ear and out the other. Certain players began to pass the buck and, in turn, put added pressure on our defence. Not good enough and, if we are to progress in this tournament, the standard must improve. Our players really don't need telling (although I may just remind them!). They know that they let themselves and the fans down. But they are determined to make amends.

We can't turn the clock back now. It's in the past. But we can have a say in the future, so that's where we must concentrate our efforts.

We've been a bit inconsistent so far this season by our standards, but I really put that down mainly to the horrendous injury list which we've had this season. Some players have been unable to play or train this season and others are nursing injuries from Saturday to Saturday and not getting much training in between times.

In fact no less than six players took the field last week carrying some sort of injury. And, of the five substitutes which we listed , only one was completely free of injury. As you might imagine the busiest man at the club has been our physio Andy Bell. Andy has worked above the call of duty and must be commended for his efforts.

I'm not using this as a cop-out for last Saturday - far from it - but I must say that it would be bliss to have 16 or 17 players fully fit and competing for places. And I'm sure that Andy Bell wouldn't mind that situation either!

So, we start all over again today. Our players have been, and will be again instructed in what's required for victory and a place in tomorrow's draw. If our players play with the attitude which they've shown in midweek, then I'm confident that we'll be in that draw.



They went down to Pollok by 2-1 in that one and, before last Saturday, kind of came off the rails a bit, taking only one point from a possible nine and crashing out of the Whyte & Mackay Cup 4-0 to Shettleston.

In goal today for Wanderers will be 21 years old ALAN COLQUHOUN signed this season from Shotts YM Amateurs. Received some stick in the local press for some recent performances but showed his capabilities in last week's game. 


TAYSIDE'S Disciplinary committee dealt with 45 cases at this week's sitting. This is understood to be a record high for this committee at one sitting.
