Finally, after 224 competitive games at Junior level, we meet Montrose Roselea. The season we were promoted saw Roselea relegated and, 'til now we've never been drawn together in a cup tie. One of the other sides relegated after that 1990/1 season, Coupar Angus, is the only other Tayside Junior side which we've still to meet in a competitive game (we did play them in a friendly).


Our previous defeats in this competition, if not quite in the 'shock' category, have come as something of a mild surprise. Montrose are a side perfectly capable of causing such a surprise if their results this season are anything to go by.

They've failed to score only once away from home this season and in one of the eyebrow raising games of the season to date, crushed Violet by 6-1 at Glenesk - only ten days after we had dropped one of only two points dropped to date at the same venue.

Clearly a team which can rise to the occasion, Roselea have two prolific strikers in Steve Gove and Steve Aitken. Fraser Mann's shutout against Forth last week means that he has only conceded one goal in his last five appearances on the Canniepairt. The spectators should be the winners, then, as the Region's best defence faces Roselea's goal hungry forwards.

Another treat for the fans today would be a repeat of the goalscoring achievements of Hamish Mackay in his last two games here on the Canniepairt. Three against Arbroath and another two against Forth has seen him increase his lead at the top of the Tayside Scorers' list. Hamish was irrepressible last Saturday and might well have doubled his final tally.






Although founded in 1930, it was as recently as 1991 that things started happening at Montrose Roselea with the decision to move away from Links Park to a custom built facility at Broomfield which was opened in August 1994 by Dave Robertson, the club president for 25 years and a club member for fifteen years before that.

The past three decades rarely saw Roselea in the headlines but success came to the club last season in the shape of the Downfield S.C. League Cup and runners-up spot in the league.

After achieving promotion the Broomfield side's stated ambition for this season is to stay in Division One and the signs are that they will do so with a bit to spare.

Manager MIKE SIMPSON and his assistant WILLIE NICOL have both been in the Junior game for some time and, although happy to retain their first division status, they will be anxious to make a splash in the cup competitions, especially the majors.

Goalkeeping duties are shared between 18 years old RONNIE MASSIE who is on the books of Montrose F.C. and ALAN COULL.

KENNY TOSH, a defender signed from Arbroath Vics although he was previously on the books of Arbroath F.C.. Dangerous at set pieces with two goals to his credit already this season. Last season's Player of the Year.DAVID BALFOUR will likely be at left back from where he likes to get forward to have a crack at goal.

BRIAN AITKEN plays a steady role as sweeper and has a good eye in the tackle. DEAN MILNE, favours central defence but can play anywhere in the back four as well as in midfield.

In midfield Roselea will look to JIMMY STEWART for inspiration. Normally good for a goal or two but has yet to find the net this season. JOHN NICOL, another midfielder, has had his share of injury problems these last few seasons but is now back to full fitness and relishing the challenge of the first division.

KEVIN SMITH, a hard tackling midfielder, is in his third season with the Broomfield club and although he can normally be relied upon to notch a few goals during a season, has yet to make his mark this term.

STEVEN AITKEN has been a prolific scorer for the 'Lea during his 9 years with the club. Looking to hit his 250th goal for the club during this current season. Found the net last season on 30 occasions despite not holding down a regular place.

Top marksman this season is STEPHEN GOVE with more than half his side's total to date. Signed from Forfar West End. 25 goals last season. Yet another Steven is STEVEN EELES, signed from the Amateurs during last season in time to score the winning goal in the 4-3 Downfield S.C. Cup win over Blairgowrie last season.

ALAN RIDDELL, another of the Montrose striker who found the net in excess of 20 times last year. Finding the road to goal a trifle harder in the top division.

The team's playmaker is MALCOLM DORWARD who is equally comfortable in defence as midfield. MICHAEL STEPHEN is in his second spell with the club having been at Luthermuir Amateurs in between. His height makes him an awkward player for the opposition to handle.



The Baker's Bit

Good afternoon to the Port Support and also to the players and officials of our opponents today, Montrose Roselea.

Obviously I was pleased with the outcome of last week's Scottish Cup tie but disappointed that it took two games to dispose of a side we should really have seen off first time over.

With most sides in our division getting byes, and us having to replay, it means that we have fallen two games behind most. That's always been something I've felt strongly about. I've constantly tried in the past to gain every advantage that we could. 'Points in the Bag' is a saying that's often used and it's a position I'd prefer to be in. But that's not the case at this time, however, things can change.

Last week's 4-0 victory was something I expected but we did make heavy weather of that first half. So, let's go into today's game clearly focused for victory.





D.B. You must be joking! Try the Joey's, they're always on the lookout for has beens.

W.S. But I'm getting worried - these buggers in green & white look like catching up.

D.B. No problem, Walter. The Joey's will never last the pace!

During the period culminating in the cup final appearance, it seemed that the team kept surprising themselves as well as the fans. No one knew quite how good the side was and a momentum was built on a wave of pleasant surprise and unexpected elation. Last year, however, everyone knew how good we were but, perhaps the thought of proving it all over again presented a challenge for which we were not prepared.

The Cup is special and our expectations are based on knowing how good this side can be. So, with a bit of luck, some self-belief and the help of everyone who supports the team, Dave Baikie may meet up with his pal Walter at Ibrox next May and this time the boys will get the job done in style!



This is quite categoric because the previous sponsors, Zamoyski, have pulled out of the competition after six years. The new sponsor is the Dundee North End Social Club.

This competition is second only to the OVD Scottish Cup in terms of prestige and is the equivalent of the Fife & Lothians Cup and Whyte & Mackay Cup played for by Fife/East and Ayrshire/Central clubs respectively.

The first two rounds are played on a regional basis to get the competition down to sixteen clubs. Thereafter the competition is seeded for the third round with a North club being pitched in with a Tayside club.
