





BAKER'S BIT

Good afternoon to the Port Support and a warm welcome to Lochee United, our visitors this afternoon. This is really my first opportunity to thank our fans for their tremendous support throughout last season.

I have only one thing to ask of you this afternoon - have a look around your neck just to make sure you don't have a blue and white scarf on. I believe Abby Oswald managed to sell quite a few prior to the last Tayside League gamme of last season! This was quite a game by all accounts and of course the result had a tiny bearing on what turned out to be a highly successful season for Tayport Football Club. To go through a league season undefeated and win a fourth Division One title was a tremendous achievement. Add to that three other trophies, the Herschell, Cream of the Barley and Centenary Cups. We could even take comfort from the fact that our exits from the PA Cup and the Whyte & Mackay Cup were really defeats snatched from the jaws of victory! Both games saw us dominate proceedings throughout the 120 minutes only to lose on the lottery of penalty kicks.

For some clubs, reaching the quarter finals of the Scottish Cup is, in itself, an achievement. I don't. Our exit was of our own doing and I must shoulder most of the blame. But sometimes you can't see the wood for the trees. I know now we were too loyal to certain players and didn't show enough faith in players who have proved by their performances since, that I got it wrong. No disrespect intended but my opinion of Whitburn was that they were a workmanlike but well disciplined side. If you recall we lost Sommerville at 0-1 down through the lack of that important ingredient. At that point I knew our Scottish Cup campaign was at an end for another season. But the Scottish must still remain our aim for 1995/96 together with the first division title.

Our pre-season preparation has gone according to plan as has the training. The new players in the squad have fitted in well. We played six friendlies with six victories. That was followed by a 5-0 Herschell trophy victory a week past Wednesday. Our first league encounter at Forfar West End was, for me, a worrying fixture. Strathmore Park has never been a particularly happy hunting ground for Tayport but a good all round performance saw us come home with a convincing 4-0 win.

Broughty Athletic were our visitors on Wednesday past. Once again we performed to a good all round standard. I've got to be pleased with a 7-0 result.

This afternoon we entertain the most improved side in the Region. They did us proud last season. I, for one, have every respect for what they are trying to achieve on and off the park. I know and our players must realise, we've got a game on our hands today. But, if our attitude and discipline is correct, then there is no reason why we can't gain a further two points.

Anyway it's water under the bridge or money down the drain, whatever way you look at it and we'll just have to get on with it.




