TODAY'S VISITORS

From going something like five years without meeting a Fife Region club, this afternoon we find ourselves meeting our second Fife opponents inside three weeks. In common with our visitors of three weeks ago, Lochgelly Albert, Newburgh Juniors are steeped in Junior tradition with a host of memories from their 85 years existence. In those 85 years they've experienced the peaks and troughs of Junior football.

The peaks have been two Scottish Junior Cup semi final appearances, in 1962 against Renfrew at Firhill and in 1973 against Cambuslang Rangers at Brockville, and four successive Perthshire Junior League titles in the mid fifties.

The nadir for the club was only a few short years ago in 1989 when, finding themselves acutely short of players, they were forced into abeyance for a season. Unlike Lochgelly Violet who went into a period of abeyance in 1949 - a period which has lasted 45 years - Newburgh have survived and come good again.

Under the guidance of manager Norrie McArthur and his coach, ex-Scotland goalkeeper Ernie McGarr, Newburgh are once again one of the most respected sides in the Region. Despite a limited budget McArthur and McGarr took 'Burgh to sixth place in the league last season and won the Kingdom Cup after eliminating Hill O'Beath in the first round. They further showed their mettle in the Fife & Lothians Whyte & Mackay Cup by taking OVD Scottish Cup winners Camelon to a replay before going down to the odd goal in three. A couple of faces in the Newburgh ranks will be familiar to Port fans from their time in the Tayside Juniors. Defender Craig Healy and midfielders Ian Duff and Derek Simpson were both with Jeanfield Swifts.

Two of the top performers in the Newburgh squad are Jimmy Nairn and Billy Martin. Centre half Martin returned for a second tour of duty at East Shore after a spell at St Andrews United. Midfielder Jimmy Nairn, a reinstatement from Dunfermline Athletic two seasons ago, hit 24 gdals from midfield last season and was the club's Player of the Year.

Football in Newburgh has always had an affinity with Perthshire and for many years the town's football teams played their football in the Perthshire Leagues. Things have now swung towards Fife with both the town's Amateurs and Juniors playing in the Fife Leagues.

The most weel kent face at East Shore Park is not a player but the club's director of operations Drew Campbell with an amazing 46 years involvement with the club. The 'Burgh patriarch has experienced the whole gamut of football emotions hundreds of times over in his near half century at the club.

Drew has never been entirely comfortable with the idea of a Tayport teamn playing in the Tayside Region Juniors. He is firmly of the opinion that, if you are based in Fife then you should play in Fife. "It wouldn't have been allowed in Blaney's day", said Drew. With respect to Drew, we think that the case we put forward in 1990 to play in Tayside has been fully vindicated.

TODAY'S GAME

The advent of sudden death in cup-ties these days has given a new edge to matches such as today's first round tie in the new Taycars Trophy. It's a new competition which, after a preliminary round, brings together the clubs of the Tayside and Fife Regions.

A quick glance at the ties scheduled for today suggests that this is the tie of the round. Tournament secretary Jock Myles must think so anyway because it's the only tie to have been allocated linesmen.

With the tie to be decided on the day, extra time and penalties being brought into play in event of a draw after 90 or 120 minutes, it's an exciting format.

Newburgh's track record suggests—That they can compete with the best on their day. Only two weeks ago they took unbeaten Hill O'Beath right to the wire in an OVD Cup-tie before going down 2-1. Until that defeat Newburgh had tasted defeat only once in ten matches.

The 'Burgh have had the benefit of a visit to the Canniepairt already this year when they went down by 1-3 in a pre-season friendly. Prior to that friendly manager Norrie McArthur had faced Tayport as manager of St Andrews United. He was in charge of the United team which went down to the 'Port in an OVD Cuptle in season 1990/91. Saints were noted for the quality of their play in that era and, if Newburgh's play is of a similar quality, then the fans are in for a treat.

After tumbling out of the OVD Cup two weeks ago 'Burgh made their exit from a second 'major' last Saturday, losing 4-1 at home to Bonnyrigg Rose in the Fife & Lothians' Whyte & Mackay Cup. Clearly they will be pulling out all the stops to avoid an inglorious hat-trick of 'major' exits in as many weeks.

Selection problems meant that Ernie McGarr had to step in between the sticks. Mind you, Ernie's got a fair pedigree, having won Scottish caps v Austria and Eire whilst an Aberdeen player a quarter of a century ago! That was a long time ago and Ernie was no doubt glad to hear Saturday's final whistle.

Scoring goals hasn't been a problem for our visitors. In netting 41 times in their last dozen games, Newburgh haven't failed to find their opponents' net. Included in those 41 strikes have been two 7 hits, a siz and a five. With Tayport also having tucked away 41 goals in their last dozen outings, the spectators today should be well entertained.



DON'T MISS THE OPPORTUNITY, GENTLEMEN

Forty years ago Hibs, then Scottish champions, were invited to take part in a new competition involving teams from all over Europe. The SFA frowned on this wave competition and advised Hibs not to take part. However the forward thinking Hibs chairman at the time ignored the advice and entered the tournament. That tournament was the European Cup.

Forty years on, we have in Scottish Junior Football, two invitations on the table to be part of an exciting new development in the Junior game. We also have regional officials saying - "Kilwinning have called a meeting of all Regional Secretaries....but I'll not be attending" Interested parties have been invited to attend meetings to further the initiatives put forward by Kilwinning and Glenafton but the advice from Tayside Region is that "clubs should not attend.."

We are told that the proposals are "completely illegal". This is difficult to comprehend as the first item on the meeting's agenda is "(1) SFA and SJFA approval." It's also difficult to come to terms with the fact that merely $\underline{\text{meeting}}$ to discuss proposals can be illegal.

The proposals are gaining momentum and, in light of the current 'Think-Tank' set up to point the way forward for Scottish Football, there's probably no better time to investigate new initiatives.

There were several clubs which turned down invitations to be part of the Glenafton plan with the result that Tayside now has two clubs in the picture, St Josephs having been asked to join the other seven teams.

The Kilwinning proposal is a 16 club affair and other Tayside invitees here are Downfield and Lochee United. There would appear to be something of a comfletch here between the two clubs' proposals but the important thing is that the leading clubs in the country sense that change is in the air.

Such proposals should be welcomed by member clubs - at least the opportunity to discuss proposals should be welcomed - and regional officials should be taking part in these discussions to look after the interests of their member clubs as well as to contribute their experience.

It's worth remembering that the European Cup idea wasn't exactly a bad idea.

THE Italian FA has come in for widespread criticism for deliberately imposing a period of suspension on a dead player.

Luigi Coluccio, ordered off in an amateur game playing for Gioiosa Jonica against Bocale, was later shot outside a pub in what is believed was a Mafia execution.

Several days later his family protested about the insensitivity when a letter was received saying that Coluccio had been suspended.

But Nino Cosentino, chairman of the disciplinary commission, replied: "We had to suspend him even though he was dead. We regret it, but this is how our system operates. Promotion and relegation can be decided on discipline."

We've heard of medals being awarded posthumously but suspensions ?!

Another who has been in both camps is Bobby Waddell. Deedle had a brief spell as player/manager at East Shore Park after leaving the Senior game but things didn't work out and he eventually ended up being reinstated amateur with Tayport Amateurs' Fife X1.





SNIFFING ABOUT WITH THE SNOUT

A cracker from last Saturday's Courier, "Forfar Albion are doing well" was the comment. Hardly. They had just lost four and drawn one of their previous five games!

STILL on Albion. Their officials weren't happy that Downfield had put their lights on during their league game a couple of weeks ago when it became real gloomy. The comment in *The Forfar Dispatch* is worth relating - "Playing conditions in the second half did not help Albion with falling leaves on the park making play difficult and the lack of natural lighting resulting in poor lighting being used" - Don't think that The Spiders will be too chuffed about their lights being described as 'poor'. If the daylight was as poor as it was on The Canniepairt that afternoon, a Davy lamp would have been an improvement never mind £15,000's worth of floodlights! The Downfield players must have managed to skip around the leaves - enough to score five goals anyway.

NCR AMATEURS fielded a who's who of Tayside Junior and Senior veterans for a recent North of Tay Cup-tie. Included in their line-up were Alex Brash (just back from a year's suspension), Billy Gallagher, Gavin Howey, Kenny Fraser and recently sacked Forfar West End manager Dave Reid. In goal for NCR was ex-Tayport Amateur and Junior PC Brian Smith.

STILL on the Amateur game. Tayport Amateurs found themselves at the centre of a bizzare situation last Saturday. In Ballinluig to play a North of Tay Cup-tie against the local teuchters, the Tayport lads were just about to run out for the game when the opposition players tumbled out of their dressing room. Not on to the park, though, into their cars and away into the distance. Enquiries by the bemused Tayport players revealed that the home side had discovered who was to referee the game (a Perthshire Ref., incidentally,) and, having previously crossed swords with the same gentleman, decided they 'weren't going to play with him refereeing'. 
