

#### TODAY'S GAME

This will be Tayport's 10th OVD Cup-tie against Central League opposition. In each of the ten ties the opposition have had to visit the Canniepairt, either in the first game or in a replay. Consequently the players and off call of Baillieston won't be short on advice from their fellow Reebok League teams.

Baillieton's manager Ian Currie made himself familiar with the ground and the Tayport side when he took in last week's Taycars Trophy match against Newburgh. What he witnessed there, it would be fair to say, would hardly have filled him with trepidation. It wasn't exactly the most inspiring of games. I'm told that some of the spectators found more interest in the comings and goings at the nearby bus stop!

One thing is certain and that is that today's game will provide more spirited fare. Baillieston are up for the cup. Make no mistake about that. They have an experienced squad and, in common with all Reebok Premier Division teams, see the OVD Cup as a realistic objective.

They've lost narrowly in their last two games, both in the league, to defending champions Pollok and current league leaders Arthurlie but they will see these games as secondary in importance to this afternoon's game.

Tayport failed to find their opponents' net for the first time this season last week against Newburgh but fortune shone on them in the penalty shoot-out. Today's game just lasts the ninety minutes with a replay in Glasgow next week if things finish all square.

Baillieston have had no difficulty finding the road to goal this season, failing to find their opponents' net on only three occasions. Only one of those occasions was in their past ten gamec and it was in the bizarre game mentioned in a previous Port Prog when Baillieston went down TO-0 to Benburb in the West of Scotland Cup. The fact that they finished the tie with only seven men may just have had some bearing on the outcome.

Injuries to a number of Tayport players was a legacy of their outings with the Tayside Under 23 Select earlier in the week and limited Dave Baikie's choice of team against Newburgh, several players not 100% fit having to be fielded. Andy Bell has been kept busy this week treating those players and hopes are high that he's had some success.

Today's official observers are Tayside Region president Paddy Winton and assistant match secretary Angus Adam.

#### TODAY'S VISITORS

Baillieston Juniors are one of the big names in Junior Football. The team from the east end of Glasgow dominated the Scottish Junior Cup in the early 1980's. Although they only lifted the cup on one occasion, 1980, they had final appearances in 1982 and 1984. On these occasions, as in 1924 and 1965, they had to settle for runners-up badges.

The 1990's haven't been as rewarding for the Station Park team. Relegation from the Premier League was followed by a further drop in 1992 into the Central League's bottom division. However their stay there was brief and they were promoted the following season and continued that climb with a further promotion back into the Premier Division in 1994. Their top league status was consolidated last term when they finished in eighth place.

In possession of the No.1 jersey at Station Park is Junior Scotland goalkeeper Willie Devine who was signed from fellow Central League side Arthurlie.

At right-back will be Andrew Galt. The combatative defender is the longest serving player at Station Park with seven seasons under his belt.

At the heart of the Glasgow team's defence is ex-Clydebank, St Johnstone and, more recently, Stranraer defender MARK TREANOR. Now 32, Treanor joined up at Kilbowie Park back in 1979 from Eastercraigs. Injury curtailed his Senior career latterly and, although an absentee last week, Treanor was likely being kept back for today where he will team up in central defence with big 'Spider' Wallace.

Gerry Kelly , a defender or midfielder, was signed by Manager Currie from League of Ireland side Sligo Rovers. Kelly has the distinction of having played in the European Cup as recently as last season when he turned out for Sligo against Steaua Bucharest.

Several others in the Baillieston squad have sampled Senior Football. Midfield man Tom Corrie was with Partick Thistle while fellow midfielder Ian McColl , who with both Baillieston goals at Arthurlie last Saturday, saw service at Notts County.

Top scorer is Tom Woods whom Manager Currie brought back from Ayr United having transferred him there only last season. The hardworking Woods is likely to be partnered up front by one of the two Kirkpatrick brothers in the pool

## FROM THE ARCHIVES 18 YEARS AGO

Saturday 28th January 1978 was a cold, wet and truly miserable day. At least it was in deepest Lanarkshire where Tayport Amateurs were playing Uddingston team Parkside in a Scottish Amateur Cup 5th Round replay.

The teams had drawn 1-1 three weeks previously on The Canniepairt but bad weather had prevented the replay taking place as scheduled. Eventually the go-ahead was given and Tayport arrived at a pitch which was a sea of mud with a good imitation of a burn running down one side of the park - inside the touchline!

Anyway the referee put the game on, probably because it had been postponed twice and Tayport had travelled through. Despite the conditions Tayport put on a great display, drawing 4-4 after extra time. You can imagine the reaction when Parkside won the toss to host the third game the following week which Tayport subsequently lost 1-2.

#### THE BAKER'S BIT

Baillieston provide our Scottish Cup 3rd Round opposition this afternoon, so I'd like to welcome their players and officials to Tayport.

I happened to mention in the Port Prog prior to our last Scottish tie something to the effect of "A should stay away more often' after our 10-0 win over Elmwood. I suppose we got part of the scoreline the same last week against Newburgh - no goals against. But, by all accounts, although we never looked like losing a goal, the same could be said at the other end. We never really created enough scoring opportunities so, for the first time this season, we failed to score in a game.

I should mention that, in conversation with some Newburgh people, they admitted that their game plan was quite simple. Eleven players behind the ball at all times. I must say that I find that a sad attitude. O.K., it almost worked. Unfortunately almost is not enough and, to be honest, I'm glad. Not only because we've moved into the next round of the Taycar Trophy despite playing well below par but because negative tactics didn't work. The day I find myself preaching 'let's get everyone behind the ball' will be the day I take up fishing. When people pay their money as they come through that gate they expect to be entertained.

I can assure our fans that we'IT\*\*\* Elways endeavour to provide entertainment which is why I'm personally so much in favour of some sort of Junior Super Cup. My own preference would be 'the Glenafton initiative' of a UEFA format this season leading to a Champions League style next season. This would consist of two sections of four with teams playing home and away and eventually leading to the formation , hopefully in the not too distant future, of a National Junior League.

It's now over four years since our secretary Albert Oswald, coach Graeme Irons and myself discussed, planned and drafted a pyramid system for Scottish football with a Junior Super League forming an important part of that structure. When we mooted this to the Press, both here and in the west, the reaction at that time wasn't too supportive to say the least. In fact Tayport were branded as 'rebels'. Perhaps Junior Football wasn't quite ready for change four years ago. And, of course, it wasn't their idea!

Today Baillieston Juniors will, I'm sure, provide us with our stiffest test of the season so far. With the Central Premier League out of their reach and eliminated from the West of Scotland Cup, they realise that the Scottish Cup is their only hope of glory this season.

So I don't really have to remind our players that, if we don't match our opponents' commitment, we're going to struggle this afternoon. But our players have known and tasted many successes in the past and are aware that, at this club, we have the quality to proceed in this competition. Last week's result must act as a reminder that success can only be achieved by complete commitment. If we provide that this afternoon, then I'm confident we will be in the draw for the next round of the competition.
