TODAY'S GAME

The relative demise of Forfar West End from being champions in 1991 and a Tayside force to be reckoned with, is a big disappointment to the Strathmore Park side's followers.

West End is a club which can boast the best of facilities, a neat ground and dressing rooms and a tidy social club adjacent.

After flirting with relegation last season, West End were expected to do better this season. A poor start including a 4-0 home defeat by ourselves, prompted the committee to dispense with the services of manager Davie Reid. Long serving player Arthur Walker took over in a caretaker capacity and was then given the nod by the committee to take over on a permanent basis.

Tayport can take warning from the fact that West End's best results have come on the road. Indeed of their eight points, seven have been won away from home including wins at North End and Arbroath SC.

The Forfar West End pool is peppered with quality players. Bruce Glen, signed from Broughty Athletic last season, is a big, experienced keeper with few peers in the Tayside game. Bobby Anderson and Paul Blair are solid performers while the effervescent Paul Yule is capable of scoring vital goals as he showed last week at Scone. Up front Hamish Soutar, always a danger when with Kirrie, and Montrose FC signing, the lanky Stephen Kydd, provide West End's goal threat. West End, like ourselves, were one of the few teams to get some early new year action when they drew 3-3 at Scone, being denied a potentially vital second point by a late Thistle equaliser.

Conditions might have been bad at Scone but they could have been no worse than at Montrose Roselea's Broomfield Park. Neat, tidy and pleasant the situation of the Roselea ground might be on a pleasant summer's day, but in January with a howling gale blowing off the North Sea, it is nothing short of a hell hole! (Thank goodness for the warming dram in the committee room at half-time!)

The weather and distance from civilisation was probably the reason why we played before our lowest crowd for a number of years. Spectating conditions were so bad that some spectators viewed the action from the upper deck of the club's coach and others never left their cars parked behind a goal. All credit to those members of the Port Support who travelled to Montrose and outnumbered the locals by about ten to one. Your efforts are appreciated and were rewarded by three fine goals from a Tayport team, the selection of which was restricted by the holidaying Henry, Wilkie and Gray.

Back to today and a tough game in prospect against a West End team pulling out all the stops to climb clear of the relegation zone. For Tayport two points would be a timely boost in view of next Saturday's cup-tie.

THE BAKER'S BIT

Happy New Year to all our supporters and a warm welcome to the players and officials of our league opponents today, Forfar West End.

Let's hope we've now seen off the worst of the winter. I suppose that we were more fortunate than most of the Tayside Region clubs, managing to play two league games over a bad period of weather. The two victories not only put us back at the helm but also draws us in on league games played by our nearest rivals, having lost ground during December, taking three Saturdays to overcome Baillieston.

I must say that I've had numerous Tayport fans and others approach me this week asking for my opinion as to the Region allowing a cup-tie to go ahead on Wednesday past under lights. I personally have no real complaints about it. I'm sure that if we had floodlights and were in a similar situation we'd chance our mitt as well. I can understand the Downfield management's frustration, having to sit by and watch a 1 point lead slipping to a potential 5 point deficit through no fault of their own. But, what I would say is that clubs should not be allowed to gain an advantage because they have floodlights. If that was seen to be the case, then my opinion would most certainly change and I'm sure that that would be the opinion of most of the Region's clubs.

The first of our two victories over the festive period was our 3-1 home win over Dundee Violet. For me it must rate as one of my most frustrating afternoons ever as a manager. Somebody famous once said 'It's a funny old game'. The first twenty minutes should have sealed the points for Tayport with 5 or 6 good chances missed. We must have had ten corners during that opening spell only to find ourselves 0-1 down at half-time and they should have scored again just before half-time. Then we get an equaliser and I say to myself "We'll win now". Just minutes later Violet hit the bar twice in quick succession. I say to myself "Maybe not". Then bang! bang!, we go right down the park and score two goals. Of course at the end of the day we've got to be happy with two points. Our day was complete with the Downfield game being called off and St Joseph's dropping a point to Carnoustie. And let's not forget, Violet were the only side to take two points off us last season. It's something which they've failed to do this time round but, make no mistake, they'll do us a favour. I'm sure that they will take points off others.

Although struggling a bit with 'flu, I was a much happier person at Montrose last Saturday. I felt that we played well, a thoroughly professional performance. We adapted extremely well in very difficult conditions. Not only was the weather very bad, the playing surface was pretty poor also, but we continued to play the ball to feet. Our movement and workrate was excellent and really, the 3-0 scoreline didn't reflect our domination.

We must now carry that attitude and professionalism into this afternoon's game. Do so and I'm confident we can gain the two points on offer.

FROM THE ARCHIVES

Described in a Sunday paper as 'the young striker', Andy Heggie was the toast of Banff the other week after shooting Deveronvale into the second round of the Tennent's Scottish Cup. Heggie, signed earlier this season from St Joseph's for a reported £4,000 fee, also set up the Highland League side's first goal in their 2-1 win at Albion Rovers.

To describe Heggie as 'young' might be stretching things just a wee bit considering he made his debut for Tayport Amateurs 3rd or Alliance XI almost 11 years ago. Andy's first appearance for Tayport was as a fifteen year old on 2nd March 1985 when he came on as substitute in an 11-2 win over St James in an Midlands Alliance League match. He didn't take long to make his mark, notching a hat-trick in that debut appearance when he replaced Neil McLeod.

The line-up that day was Johnny Clark; Neil McLeod (Andy Heggie), Frank Feechan, Calum Webster, Andy McRobbie; Roddy Davie, Lyall Clark, Mark Whiteside; Graeme Dempster (Graeme McBeth), Roy Lessels and Alan Paterson. The other goals came from Paterson(2), Webster(2), L.Clark(2) J.Clark and Feechan.

Heggie then moved to St Johnstone and was farmed out to Jeanfield Swifts before returning to Tayport Amateurs for a lengthy spell, playing for the club's Midlands XI and Fife XI's. His travels then brought him back to Tayport as one of the Juniors' first signings in 1990. His impatience at not securing a regular berth in the side saw him released to go back Amateur with Riverside Athletic.

More travels took him to Brechin City and Arbroath before landing at St Joseph's but he wasn't in favour this season with the management duo of his Uncle Willie (Brown) and Andy Sommerville. 'Vale boss Alan Scott was actually on Tayside looking to sign Bobby Glennie to strengthen his team's defence when it came to his attention that Heggie was available. It looked a good deal for the Joey's at the time but it could yet prove to be a bigger deal for Andy.

Incidentally Steve Dolan who trains with Tayport, and about whom we, not so long ago made tentative enquiries, was named Man of the Match against Albion Rovers. He was described in one report as 'a wonderful left wing talent in the old winger mould'.

After being held to a goalless draw at home last Saturday, Deveronvale play fellow Highland League side Keith in the third round replay this afternoon with any non-Leaguer's ultimate prize at stake - a tie against Rangers. Not just the cash bonanza that the game will bring but a media event that will be forever etched in the history of Banff and its team.

A great change of fortune for Heggie who, only a few months ago, was out in the cold at Fairfield Park. Will the fairytale continue?

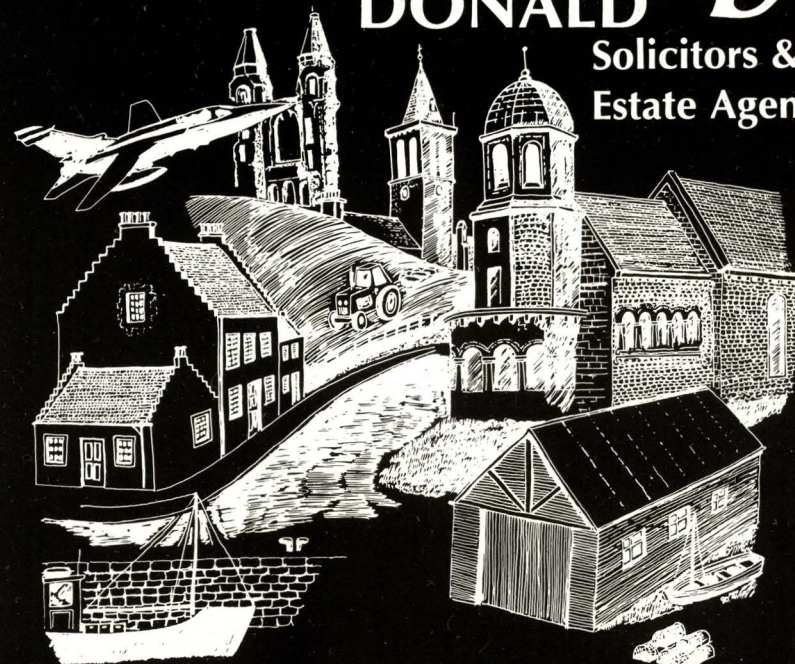
