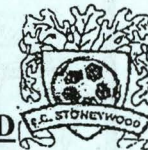

Arsenal vs Norwich

HIGHBURY, 4 NOVEMBER 1989

As offs go, this was a typical Arsenal affair. A gritty and solid team performance, plenty of huffing and puffing but no real end product.

With Arsenal players busy congratulating Dixon on his last minute goal, commentator Martin Tyler goes into overdrive, "What drama here, Arsenal have scored... AND NOW THERE'S MAYHEM AT THE OTHER END!"

As the camera pans downfield, 11 Norwich players are busy jostling Niall Quinn and Alan Smith in what looks like a playground squabble. Hopelessly outnumbered, the big Arsenal strikers don't have long to wait for the cavalry to arrive. Rocastle, O'Leary and Adams all dive into the mêlée. Adams, in particular, shows a remarkable turn of pace. Seconds before he was in the centre circle congratulating Dixon on his goal, now he's hurtling into the penalty area at break-neck speed, shoving Bryan Gunn through a posse of players. At the heart of the action, Rocastle aims a couple of weak jabs at Gunn. Martin Tyler, meanwhile, senses history in the making and vainly attempts 'a Wolstenholme': "There's police on the pitch...". Adams has already spotted the danger, though. Seeing two officers encroaching in the penalty area, he represses his natural instinct to raise an arm and appeal to the linesman, deciding to act as peacemaker and extending his arms to separate the throng of yellow and red shirts. A member of the Metropolitan Police appears to mouth, "F... off and get back up there" at several Arsenal players and the action dies out as quickly as it had begun, without a decent punch being thrown.

Italy vs Chile

SANTIAGO 2 JUNE 1962

The Battle Of Santiago. The blackest day in World Cup history, one of the most brutal games ever played and possibly the most entertaining ruck ever seen on a football pitch.

Right from the off there was an underlying air of menace which frequently bubbled to the surface in spectacular fashion. After only eight minutes, Ferrini of Italy retaliates after being kicked from behind and is sent off but refuses to

Arsenal vs Man Utd

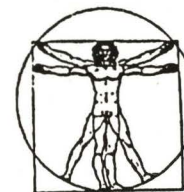
OLD TRAFFORD, 20 OCTOBER 1990

Another dust-up involving The Arse, proving that when push comes to shove, the Gunners are second to none.

On the near touchline, Mark Hughes finds himself in the middle of a crunching sandwich tackle between Winterburn and Limpar. In a thinly veiled attempt at going for the ball, McClair boots the now prone Winterburn in the back with Hughes going in from the front. A well-executed pincer movement, it nonetheless is the spark for a 21-man brawl and an unprecedented release of testosterone. Limpar is quick to react, following up his nasty tackle on Hughes with a rather tasty rabbit punch which catches McClair on the side of the face. Michael Thomas is first on the scene, grabbing McClair by the throat and with Irwin, Webb and Adams all making good early runs from deep positions the 'off' is well and truly underway. Adams, leading by example, shoves McClair over the touchline. McClair, who by now is coming in for a fair amount of stick, then finds himself on the receiving end of a good few weak shoves from Thomas and Davis. Ince, making a customary late run into the danger area, surges through a crowd of players in an attempt to get hold of Limpar. The little Swede is having none of it though, and shies away, turning his back on the mayhem around him. Only when George Graham and Alex Ferguson venture onto the pitch is order finally restored.

leave the pitch. After ten minutes of arguing, the police are brought on. Commentator David Coleman can hardly believe it: "This is one of the sorriest, stupidest spectacles I've ever seen!" And it was only just warming up. Five minutes before half-time the Chilean, Sanchez, twats an Italian in the face, breaking his nose. Coleman is astounded, if not a little impressed: "That was one of the neatest left hooks I've ever seen!" The best is yet to come. Mario David becomes the second Italian to receive his marching orders after executing a perfect flying drop-kick on Sanchez's neck. David Coleman implodes: "Oooh! That's one of the most cold-blooded and lethal tackles I've ever seen!" As referee Ken Aston blows the final whistle, the teams are escorted from the pitch by the police, yet still minor scuffles are breaking out all around. By now, Coleman is near to tears.

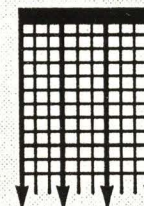

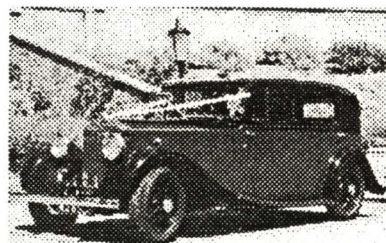

CUMNOCK v POLLOK THE PICK OF THE BUNCH

The fourth round of the national trophy has thrown up some cracking ties. A four figure crowd is assured at Townhead Park where the rejuvenated Cumnock take on a Pollok side starved of OVD success in the 1990's. 1995 winners Camelon are at home to 1994 winners Largs Thistle. New Largs manager Phil Bonnyman has tightened things up but Camelon on their on pitch looks too big a hurdle. Whitburn, last season's defeated finalists, will also attract a four figure crowd for the visit of Arthurlie but look to have a struggle on their hands. The third remaining East club, Livingston United, could find it hot at Sunnybank and also up north St Andrews United have a game on their hands against an Inverurie Loco team marshalled by ex Manchester City defender Bobby McDonald. Of the local sides, Carnoustie should dispose of Kirkintilloch Rob Roy without too much ado. A few weeks ago Scone might have looked like cannon fodder for Glenrothes but a four game unbeaten run including a win at Carnoustie last week will give the Jags confidence against a side which tumbled 0-4 at home to Hill O' Beath in their last outing. St Josephs are high in the Lanarkshire hills to meet Forth, formidable opponents on their own ground as ourselves and Lochee United have experienced. Not the easiest of places from which to return a victory in the middle of January.

THIS AFTERNOON'S VISITORS

FC STONEYWOOD

The Aberdeenshire champions pay their first visit to The Canniepairt, and with their reputation for being a clever footballing side, the spectators should get their money's worth.

FC Stoneywood play at Polo Park, an attractive location at Dyce on the outskirts of Aberdeen. Tayport have played there just the once, a friendly on 11th January 1992 when we won by 4-1. Only Paterson and Spalding from our line-up that day are likely to be in contention for a Tayport jersey this afternoon. FC Stoneywood have several of their squad who were with the club at that time in today's pool - Ally Moir, Billy Munro, Gary Johnston, Graham Laird, Gary Collie and Phil Leslie.

Unlike ourselves, who won the title in nailbiting fashion, Stoneywood finished a comfortable eight points ahead of their nearest rivals to lift the Premier title for the third time in five years.

This season started well and they made the semi final of the League Cup only to go down to Bon Accord by 2-0. The league campaign got off to a sticky start with odd goal defeats in the opening two fixtures against Inverurie Loco Works and Longside. Since then, though, apart from a blip in losing 3-0 at Sunnybank in mid-November, the Polo Park side have been ticking over quite nicely on a wee roll of six games unbeaten.

With six new players this season in their squad it's perhaps not surprising that they took a little time to settle, but with games in hand and three points for a win, Stoneywood are still very much in contention for the championship.

Their most impressive form has been reserved for the OVD Cup. After a bye in round one, they ended the hopes of fellow North sides Longside and Hall Russell United, both of which would have fancied themselves for an extended run in the competition. Longside were beaten by 2-0 at Polo Park and Hall Russell were dumped 4-0 in their own back yard.

Keeper Andy McIntosh is in his first season with the club, having signed from Glentanar Amateurs. Defender Billy Munro is in his eighth season at Polo Park having previously been with Cove Rangers. Billy's a Scottish cap and a regular in the Region Select sides. Davie Lyon is in his first season following his move from Banks O'Dee.

One of the longest serving member of the squad is Gavin Laird who arrived from Sunnybank nine seasons ago. Brian Murray is a product of the FC Stoneywood Under 18 side as is Kevin Crombie who is likely to start on the bench today.

Alan Moffat, in his first season, and striker Dennis Wyness enjoying his third season at Polo Park, were both recruited direct from Pittodrie. Ian Rankin, another in his inaugural season with the club, was plucked from Beacon Rangers in the Amateurs. Sunnybank, perennial rivals of FC Stoneywood, have supplied no fewer than six members of the pool. Phil Leslie joined up with Laird nine seasons ago and the others are Gary Johnston (7th season), Neil England (1st), Martin Low (1st) and Ivor Stewart (3rd).

Ray Collins is in his second season with the club having come from Keith in the Highland League. Completing the pool are Ally Moir, a signing six seasons ago from Welfare football, Gary Collie, a product of Echt Amateurs 5 years ago and the veteran Craig Westland who arrived from Parkvale Juniors, well, a long time ago!

THE BAKER'S BIT

Good afternoon to the Port Support and a warm welcome to the players and officials of our Scottish Cup opponents FC Stoneywood.

Well, it turned out to be a good weekend for Tayport FC with our nearest rivals both losing ground in the form of a 3-1 home defeat at the hands of Lochee United for St Josephs and Downfield's match being postponed due to flooding.

In conversation with Downfield's co-manager Willie Grier, he explained that, in their efforts to regain some lost ground in terms of fixtures, they managed to arrange a cup-tie under lights a week past Wednesday but it backfired after they decided to roll the playing surface the morning after. A bad move. The rolling restricted the drainage of the rainwater later in the week. So our 4-0 home league victory over Forfar West End keeps us firmly on course.

I feel that we played well in patches but it wasn't one of our best performances by any means. I know people will say 'He's never happy and is always expecting more'. But I say to them 'Why not?'. In training we are constantly striving to improve all aspects of our game, whether it be passing or movement or the more technical side of the game. So I'm afraid it's a never ending road for me to continually demand and expect higher standards.

Someone said to me during the week "Well, Baker, it's looking like another title in the bag for Tayport" I don't believe it. How can people say this with eleven league games to be played. I can assure you that there will be no talk of titles at this club until there is something in the bag.

Our biggest enemy is ourselves. Complacency can't, and won't be allowed to happen. We must look to our last game as history and our next game as the most important of the season. Which leads me aptly into today's 4th round Scottish Cup-tie against FC Stoneywood:

Our players should need little motivation from me this afternoon. They know from experience that this competition requires a certain player and a certain commitment and discipline. We know we have the ability, that's not in question, but ability alone does not guarantee success. So, I say to our players this afternoon. If you want to take a step further in this competition, you'll have to earn that right. Let's do the business.

FROM THE ARCHIVES

25 YEARS AGO - JANUARY 1971

Quarter of a century ago Tayport Amateurs were at a fairly low ebb, struggling to get a foothold in the Midlands 1st division after just avoiding the drop the previous season. The weather hadn't been too good because the 1st XI managed only two games between 21st November and 30th January.

On 9th January 1971 the team picked up a vital home point in a goalless draw at home to high flying Broughty United. The team was:-Derek White; Ian Mathers, Eddie Stewart; Ronnie Laing, Jim Scott, Ian White; Abby Oswald, Dougie Henderson, Ian Dempster, Richard Redpath and Ian Paterson. Sub. was George Ritchie.

If the 1st XI form was poor, the 2nd XI was diabolical. On 16th January 1971 they crashed 10-0 in a Lunan Trophy game at Timex. The line-up was Ian Mackie; Walter Kemp, Ronnie Redpath; Graeme Welsh, Tony Gillespie, Morris Flynn; Jimmy Lindsay, George Ritchie, Davie Mitten, Billy Dowie and Eddie Gilmour. Davie Ayre managed to miss that match, having played the week before and returning the week after when the side only lost by 3-0.

What else was happening on the local football front 25 years ago. Things haven't changed much at Dens. That month the Dark Blues crashed 8-1 at home to Celtic. Blairgowrie were the kingpins of Tayside Junior football and led the league, eight points ahead of Downfield with only 13 games played. Forfar East End languished at the foot of the table with only 2 points while Luncarty topped division two.

In those days the papers listed the Junior line-ups for the Saturday games. Lochee United's team for their game against North End was - Robertson; K.Stewart, Sutherland; D.Bruce, Caswell, D.Stewart; P.Brown, E.Bruce, Watson, Rooney and Gowans. Sub was Fox. North End's prospective line-up was Milinski; Falconer, Shepherd; Mann, McCabe, Taylor; Glen, Elder, Newman, Kerr and Hackney. Sub was Gowans. What was the score? Thomson Park turned out to be unplayable and the match was postponed.

What else was happening 25 years ago? On 20th January *The Tele* reported on its front page 'Tayport Jewel Robbery'. A 25 year old Glasgow man, Norman Maxwell appeared in court in connection with a £25,000 jewel robbery. (note: the robbery in question took place less than 100 yards from the Canniepairt). A wedding photo in *The Courier* was of Tayport man Walter Gourlay and Craigiebank lass Irene Coupar. Also in the photo was best man and Bellrock regular Ewen Gourlay. You could buy a 'superior, detached, stone built villa in Tayport in its own grounds with six rooms, a very private driveway, garage, double glazing and central heating, beautiful garden' for a mere £7,500. A flat at No.23 Clepington Street in Dundee was on offer for £100. Jings, some lads spend that now on a Saturday night out!

We were in the midst of a postal strike but building trade workers were being urged to escape the hassle of life in Scotland and start a new life in South Africa. Interviews were being held in the YMCA on the Conshy. In the shops a can of McEwan's was 2/-, haggis 3/- per lb, 2lb of sugar was 1/4d and a bottle of whisky 49/11d.

For entertainment you had the choice of no less than 10 cinemas in Dundee. Skating at the Ice Rink was 3/6d for 8pm to 10.30pm. Alex Rice and the Melody Makers were appearing at the Tayside Bar in the Seagate while in the Newport Hotel they were dancing to the Bluebird Duo.

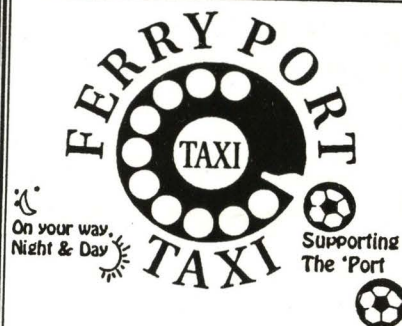

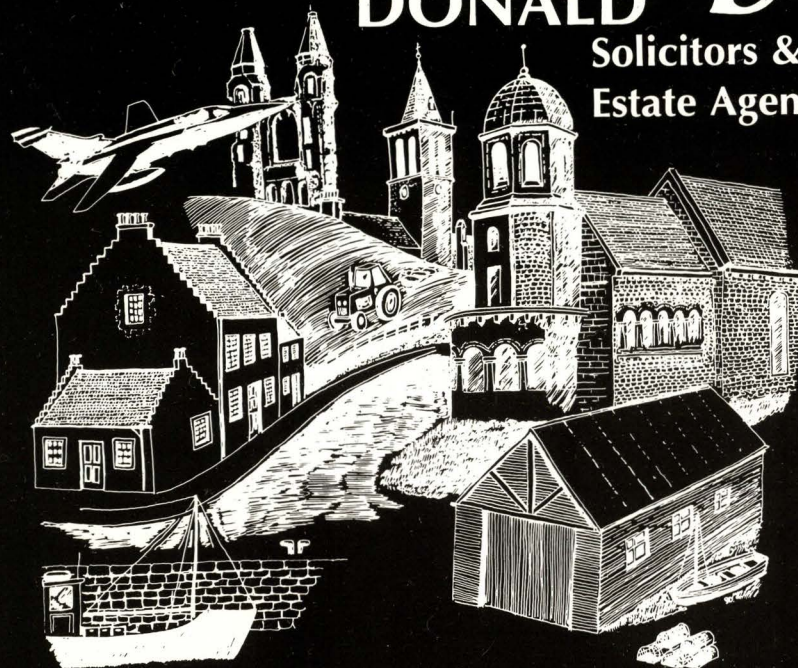
