TODAY'S GAME

Well, today's game almost wasn't today's game!. At lunchtime yesterday a game on the Canniepairt looked a forlorn hope but nature did it's bit and by 11pm (yes, some of the committee did manage to get out of the pub to have a look!) things were looking very much more hopeful. An inspection this morning by the match referee gave the tie the thumbs up.

With both today's participants involved in OVD Scottish Cup-ties next Saturday it's a welcome opportunity to get some action.

The fact that our opponents today are in the last sixteen of the Junior Cup tells it's own story and clearly we have a game on our hands. Particularly so when you realise that it's Inverurie's away record which has ensured that they've achieved that status.

Our performance last week was a great boost to our supporters who outnumbered the locals at Polo Park last week by about 10 to 1. I'm sure that I speak for all the Port Support when I say that the team did the support proud. It wasn't just the result but the performance which saw the away support leave the ground with smiles on their faces.

The 2-0 OVD win at St Andrews United a few weeks ago gave some of our support an opportunity to get a preview of Loco and they will have earmarked striker Jim Findlay as one of the men to be watched. Findlay notched both goals against Saints, and with 30 goals to his credit this season, is the top marksman in the North Region.

The best known of our opponents today, however, is sweeper Bobby McDonald. Not so many years ago Bobby was a familiar figure on the telly when playing for Manchester City and Oxford United. With that sort of experience under his belt it's no surprise that McDonald is an key player for Loco.

There are others with Senior experience in the Inverurie squad. The aforementioned Jim Findlay was with Buckie Thistle, midfielder Frank McLennan was with Deveronvale, striker Colin Yule is ex-Elgin City and two months ago Loco swooped to buy midfielder Michael Smart from Peterhead.

Tayport will again be without Keith Nicolson who is recovering from a cartilage operation but otherwise the rest of the pool are available. Gary Maher missed the Stoneywood game but his determination to get a jersey was underlined by the fact that, despite the bad weather this week, he travelled on both Monday and Wednesday from his home in Auchterarder to the Canniepairt for training. Not bad when you consider that all the Fife schools were closed for three days this week because of travel problems.

This afternoon's game will be played to a finish with extra time and penalties if necessary.



THE BAKER'S BIT

Inverurie Loco provide our third round Centenary Cup opposition this afternoon, so I'd like to begin by welcoming their players and officials and, of course, the Port Support to the Canniepairt.

Last Saturday's OVD Scottish Cup win at Stoneywood turned out to be a happy end to a frustrating three weeks for me. I'm sure that I could give you umpteen plausible reasons as to why we struggled to a 1-1 draw at the Canniepairt against FC Stoneywood but it was basically that we never created enough good scoring chances on the day.

I also thought that there was a point in the proceedings when both sides' attitudes went in opposite directions. Theirs for the better, ours for the worse. I'm positive the incident just prior to half-time when their young centre half lay injured for some time before we managed to get the stretcher for him. As he lay on their dressing room floor at half-time with the rest of his teammates sitting around him, I know how I would have reacted and used that scene to charge my players up for the second half. Meanwhile next door, our players sat quite confident with the prospect of a very strong wind at their backs, coupled with the fact that they were 1-0 up without playing anywhere near the standards we expect. But unfortunately these thoughts only seemed to fuel a complacency which resulted in our poor second half display.

The following week we had more frustration with the replay being postponed up north and only three grounds on Tayside surviving the weather, at Arbroath, Carnoustie and our own. Disappointingly for us three of the five league teams due to visit Tayport played that afternoon. This left only Montrose and Kinnoull but neither was prepared to come to the Canniepairt. So once again we were forced to forego an official game when sitting with a perfectly playable park. This is a ridiculous situation but it's outwith our hands. Unfortunately our success seems to have gone before us with clubs unwilling to take the risk. By all accounts, the Region secretary does not have the power to force them to play.

But I felt that it was vital to get some sort of practice in before the rearranged OVD tie. So, after seemingly endless efforts, finally Jeanfield Swifts agreed to come to Tayport. I'm grateful for that. And, although the game ended in a draw, there's no doubt in my mind that it gave us an advantage in last week's tie at Stoneywood.

I felt last week, that, on the day, our attitude and overall play was much improved and, of course the 3-1 win sees us in the fifth round. As I said, a satisfying end to a very frustrating three weeks. Mind you we made life difficult for ourselves, especially in that second period. I'm sure that if we'd taken the numerous scoring chances we could have been in easy street. Our visitors this afternoon, like ourselves scored an away victory to stake a place in the last 16 of the OVD Scottish Cup. I'm under no illusions and neither should our players be, that we've got a game on our hands. But I've also no doubt that we're perfectly capable of a victory this afternoon if our approach to the game can match that of last week.





No apologies for a blatant piece of plagiarism. With an extremely late deadline for the game, we were short of copy for today's programme so we thought those who hadn't read the *Daily Mail* this week might be interested in this article. (well, it fills up some space, doesn't it)

RUNNING the line at an amateur football match is an elderly man, a shabby, portly figure with unruly, receding, grey hair flapping in the winter wind.

Trousers tucked into socks and grubby trainers, Douglas Smith looks typical of the breed of uncompromising committee-men, oblivious to airs and graces, who invest every spare minute organising clubs for the sheer love of the game. Such men are ablaze with passion for a good result on a Saturday afternoon to make the rest of the week's chores bearable.

They dream that someday their team might produce a future star, but are realistic enough to know that the grim blood and thunder approach at this level usually precludes that. But appearances can be deceptive and any attempt to stereotype Smith would be a mistake of gargantuan proportions.

For this 68-year-old has had more dreams realised in the amateur game than anyone could ever hope for.

He started Drumchapel Amateurs in the 1950s from a Boys Brigade team and guided it to legendary status as a school of football.

At the last count, over 300 of his players had graduated to the professional ranks — 29 of them Scottish internationals. His roll call of old boys reads like a Who's Who of Scottish football over the last three decades.

Archie Gemmill, Andy Gray, Asa Hartford, Eddie McCreadie, Tony Green, John O'Hare, John Robertson, Mo Johnston, John Wark are among them. Three are current managers — Ian Murray, Alex Miller and Alex Ferguson.

A fresh-faced 14-year-old called Kenny Dalglish was desperate to play for the club, but Smith had to tell him he wasn't good enough. 'It was a big mistake losing Dalglish, one of the great audiences of my life,' he admits. 'But not entirely my fault.'

'I watched him play for Pussall YM and immediately realised he was the best player in Scotland of that age. I visited him at his home — a huge one, but overlooking the sea. His bedroom walls were covered in Rangers posters — he was a big fan and I asked him if he wanted to join for Drumchapel Amateurs.'

'I was a hard boss of judgement, for I could have put him in the under-16 team and kept everyone happy. Instead he went to Glasgow and then Glasgow United and over the next two years he gave us a roaring every time he played against him. I suppose it was far wiser of letting us know what we had missed.'

Smith continued: 'There were occasions when I sat at Haggerty's at full international games and counted five out of six of our boys in the team. The first was against Belgium in 1971 when we had Jim Christie, Archie Gemmill, John O'Hare, Tony Green and Jim Kerrall in the team.'

There are the famous names, but there are hundreds more who had good, solid professional careers in the game who should not be forgotten. Also, too many to mention, Smith's background for a football, lifetime involvement in football is hardly orthodox. From a wealthy family, he was privately educated at Glasgow Academy, took a degree at Cambridge and trained as an army officer before being pensioned off with a serious leg injury.

He retired as chairman from the family business — ship-breakers Arnott Young in 1980. He is a quiet spoken, articulate man who has always remained low profile. A bachelor, he lives in a large, secluded house outside Hibernian with his brother, Donald. He dismisses speculation that he is a millionaire. 'I am not a poor man, but all my wealth is tied up in assets and running the club for so long has been a big financial drain. At one point, when we played in tournaments all over Europe, it cost me a lot and I was close to bankruptcy.'

Tommy Docherty, when he was managing Chelsea in the Sixties, sent his side up to play us at Firhill in a fund-raiser for this club. All had to do was meet their expenses but, at the after-match banquet in the Central Hotel, his party suddenly grew from 18 to 45. 'It seemed he had paid all over Glasgow and the bloke made sure they all had a good time at the bar in Firhill and at the banquet. We ended up with a loss which I had to make up. Next time he offered to help, I politely declined.'

15s to under 18s — all consistently winning every honour in the youth game. Each side had a manager, coach and physio, but Smith still picked all the teams.

'I had a rule that a player should be given an extended run in the team to prove himself, at least five or six games. That way he had the security of knowing one bad game didn't mean being automatically dropped.'

He measures his words carefully when asked for his views on the modern game. 'I don't wish to crow, but the recent moves to ban youngsters playing on full size pitches was taken by me two decades ago. And I would not work with under-12s, because a full size pitch and the pressures of winning cups and leagues is not the way to fulfil their potential.'

'I am delighted to see that the SFA is now taking the message on board and have refused to endorse full size matches for kids. The introduction of the YTS scheme for young players at senior clubs led to the demise of his young teams. Faced with the prospect of running just one side, he decided the amateur game needed an elite league and created the Caledonian League, buying the Duntocher Hibs ground in 1987.'

His club now has a thriving social offshoot, the players still have their lounge, there is a sauna in the dressing rooms and he plans to install an all-weather stand and floodlights. 'Doesn't he miss the thrill of not working with the finest young talent? Yes, of course,' he admits. 'But I get great satisfaction from knowing the Drumchapel Amateurs influence is still in the game.'

'Even the Old Firm are benefitting from the Drumchapel experience. At Rangers, David Moyes and John Chalmers are involved in their youth work and Brian McEwan is doing likewise at Celtic — all our old boys.'




