

FROM THE ARCHIVES

This week's Archive spot is from the Evening Telegraph of 64 YEARS AGO and it reports a quite remarkable occurrence which caused an amateur match in Dundee to be abandoned. Talk about taking the huff!

The article on the left is the original report from the *Tele* of 6th April 1931 and the following day the letter on the right appeared.

SCENE AT MORGAN ACADEMY GROUNDS

Football Match That Was Stopped

A remarkable situation arose at the Morgan Grounds on Saturday where Forfar Academicals were down to meet Morgan F.P.'s in a Midlands Amateur League game.

Both teams had lined up and the referee was about to start the game when the Morgan groundsman walked on to the field and stated that the game could not proceed until one of the Forfar players left the field.

The captain of the Forfar team approached the groundsman who refused to give any reason for his action.

The Forfarians refused to play with ten men and the referee had no option but to declare the match abandoned, the ball never being touched.

It transpired later that the groundsman and player had been involved in a heated discussion on the occasion of a previous game and the foregoing is the result.

Both teams have agreed to take the matter up with the Midir is socia in in the first place.

Morgan Park Incident

To the Editor of the Telegraph and Post. Sir,—As groundsman of Morgan Academy Recreation Grounds, I wish to state the exact facts regarding the incident which occurred on Saturday in connection with the match, Morgan F.P.s v. Forfar Academicals.

The matter originated about two months ago when, owing to the condition of the ground the match could not be played.

One of the Forfar team came to me and complained of the match being put off, asserting that the ground was quite playable.

He added that I, as groundsman, had no authority to postpone the match. In the end I was compelled to inform him that unless he apologised he would not be allowed to play on the Morgan grounds again.

When the Forfar team appeared on Saturday I informed three of them of the position.

Notwithstanding this the player objected to persisted in taking the field and I had no alternative but to declare the match off.



Arbroath SC provide our opposition this afternoon and I'd like to welcome their players and officials to the Canniepairt.

Deja-vu is probably the word to describe the events of last weekend. Cast your mind back to exactly one year ago last Saturday and you will recall an almost identical turn of events.

Both encounters saw us reduced to ten men early on but both saw us produce two dramatic 3-2 victories. Last Saturday, as was the case one year ago, our players responded tremendously. That word 'deja-vu' did cross my mind more than once. The results this week last year kept flashing up - Tayport 3 Lochee United 2 and Violet 1 Tayport 1. Surely not!

I'm glad to say that all my fears were for nothing although we didn't achieve the breakthrough in the first half. Once the first goal went in, the frustrations disappeared and I felt we went on to produce some good football for a deserved 3-2 victory.

This afternoon's visitors, like Tayport, are undefeated as yet and, like every side that comes here, they know they'll have to produce their best and I don't need to remind our players of that fact. The players know the standard we set here and what we have to produce for a victory. This is another day and another challenge. We've got to be up to



LEAGUE REVIEW

Lochee United's 0-1 defeat at Downfield probably ends any hopes the Thomson Park club might have cherished of lifting this season's A.T.& T. title. History certainly isn't on their side. No team has dropped as many as five points in their first four games and gone on to lift the flag. Downfield, though, must be delighted with their start which compares very favourably with starts of recent years. Full points from four games with only one goal lost is certainly championship form.

St Joseph's and Arbroath S.C., our opponents today, are a point adrift of Downfield and ourselves and, although the point which Joeys dropped against Scone was seen as something of a shock,that result has been put into perspective by last season's second division champions' other results. Unbeaten in four league games, last Wednesday's 4-1 demolition of Kinnoull was a real eye opener.

Unbeaten too are Arbroath SC whose win at home to Montrose on Wednesday gave them a solid start and sets the scene for an enthralling contest on the Canniepairt today.

Entrenched at the foot of the table are Forfar West End and Dundee Violet with nary a point between them. It's a situation that must be giving some cause for concern in the committee rooms at Strathmore Park and Glenesk Park. Violet have been badly hit by injury and officials are confident that matters will improve soon.

The committee at Forfar West End will be less confident of their team's prospects of climbing to a position of respectability. West End have been slipping in recent seasons and an already poor start to the '95/96 campaign culminated in an embarrassing 3-0 defeat by arch rivals Forfar Albion in midweek.

Broughty Athletic , with RAF keeper Lyndon Parslow between the sticks, recorded their first win of the season at home to Carnoustie Panmure, a win which will give Gary Strachan's team a welcome confidence after their 7-0 defeat down here a week past Wednesday. Carnoustie, after their win 5-2 win at North End on Saturday past would hardly be expected to surrender both points to Broughty.

North End and Kinnoull both made wholesale changes to their playing staff during the close season. North End got off to a great start with two wins out of two but are now back to square one after back to back defeats.

Kinnoull will still be reeling from their heavy defeat by Scone in Wednesday's Perth derby - a result which had the Fair City buzzing. Kinnoull haven't exactly set the heather on fire in recent seasons and, with Jeanfield relegated last season, Perth can ill do with clubs of that calibre out of the top echelon.




