BROUGHTY ATHLETIC pay their second visit of the season to The Canniepairt. The first was in August when they went down 7-0 in a league game but the Whitton Park outfit have got their act together since then. Under the astute stewardship of Gary Strachan, they've tightened things up and are gradually edging clear of the three dreaded basement places.

Unbeaten in their last six league fixtures, Broughty have suffered only one defeat since 6th January. But what a tanking that was, an uncharacteristic 2-8 from Oakley in the Tay Cars Trophy .

A semi-final place is at stake here today and then only one step away from the final of the Perthshire Advertiser Cup at McDiarmid Park on May Day. A victory would certainly bring some cheer to a Club which has not had its troubles to seek - off the park - in recent weeks. First, part of the perimeter fence at Whitton Park blew down, then vandals demolished the dugouts with a heavy roller and, to cap things, thieves have made off with a set of cast iron portable goals.

On the field, manager Gary Strachan, an SFA coach, who cut his managerial teeth at DCFE in the Midlands Amateurs, has brought together a solid squad of players. As well as sticking with a number of seasoned Juniors, Gary, with a limited, indeed probably non existent, budget, has recruited shrewdly from the Amateur ranks.

There could be a problem in goal. Regular custodian, Lyndon Parslow, an RAF serviceman who trained with Tayport Amateurs earlier this season, was in a car crash last week and could be doubtful. Defenders Gordon Jack, Davie Findlay, Jeff Conway and Jim Young are all seasoned Juniors. Glen Knox, a young defender or midfielder who had Senior experience with Arbroath, was fixed up from Carnoustie Panmure and another young defender, Lee Bertie, was fixed up from Arbroath.

Jimmy Jeffries and Ged Alexander are experienced front men along with Dale Martin who was signed from North End. Neil Morrison, a student at Edinburgh University, has returned to the club after some time away which included a spell at North End.

The balance of the Broughty pool was fixed up from the local amateur game. Top scorer Paul McGinlay came from Douglas Amateurs, Gary Hamilton (Carnoustie), Philip Coyne (SS Peter & Paul), Roger Shannon (Tayside Fire Brigade) and the scorer of last week's point winning goal at Forfar Albion, Mark McCord came from Gary's former club DCFE.

It will not have escaped Brought provide that Tayport have struggled once or twice in the last couple of years at home in cup-ties against teams which they were expected to account for comfortably. Bankfoot, Forfar Albion, St Joseph's and a draw against Newburgh are names which spring to mind. No doubt Dave Baikie will have his charges well briefed to prevent a repeat.







With Ayrshire being a Junior hotbed, the local Junior game gets excellent coverage with a good whack of the four hours long Saturday afternoon sports programme devoted to the Juniors. Saturday past was no exception.

SETTING THE SCENE

The Westsound studio at 5.45pm on Saturday afternoon. The OVD Cup draw is about to be made live on the Radio.

THE PLAYERS

Anchorman Ian somebody or other, SJFA Secretary Joe Black, SJFA Assistant Secretary Tom Johnstone, both of whom had just arrived in the studio from the Glenafton v Talbot replay, and Westsound radio journalists Hugh Drennan and Drew Cochrane.

And now, here's the exclusive bit, a transcript of the draw and the post draw comment.

 $\overline{\text{DJ Ian}}\colon \text{Hugh Drennan will draw the home team and Tom Johnstone}$ the away team so first of all over to Hugh Drennan.

Hugh Drennan: And the first number out is number one, Tayport.

DJ Ian: Tayport first team out will play

DJ Ian: Number two is Auchinleck Talbot. So, there we are, Dennis Gray's team is away to Tayport. That's the first tie out. Back to Hugh Drennan.

 $\underline{\text{Ian}}$: The semi final draw - Tayport v Auchinleck and Pollok v $\underline{\text{Camelon}}$, Hugh Drennan, possibly not a bad draw there for Dennis Gray's team?

Hugh Drennan - It's a good enough draw, Ian, I don't think in respect of who Talbot had been drawn against, it would have been a very difficult one for them, because I think if you had taken the Scottish Junior Cup at the start of the season and tried to pick four semi finalists, I think these teams would have certainly been in the reckoning to get there. It's two really good semi finals. Talbot certainly, although they are away to Tayport, it will be played at a neutral ground and I think Talbot have every bit as good a chance as any of the other clubs left in the competition.

<u>Ian</u>: Joe, if I could just get a reaction from you, Tayport v Auchinleck and Pollok against Came M.

Joe Black: Well Tayport were finalists in 1993 when they were beaten by Glenafton. I saw them play quite impressively against Baillieston in one of the earlier rounds, they are a workmanlike side, they have for instance David Reilly up front who is a very good striker, they've Grant Paterson who is also in the Scottish pool for the Isle of Man, another forward who I noticed and I think was very, very quick was a boy called Steve Ross and I was really quite impressed with what I have seen of Tayport, they are always there or thereabout. Auchinleck will not find it easy and I think it will be very competitive. Hard to call.

Ian: Tom Johnstone, a reaction from yourself, Pollok against Camelon, the cup holders, what do you think of that one?

Tom Johnstone: Well, there is very little between the teams, Ian. I have seen both of them recently and I think we are looking at an exciting semi final. Pollok got through today against who many considered the favourites, Arthurlie, so yes, it's looking like a good semi final.

 $\underline{\text{Ian}}$: OK, let's go and have a word with Drew Cochrane who we've $\underline{\text{man}}$ aged to locate, Drew we have just made the draw for the semi finals of the OVD Scottish Cup and it has come out as follows; Tayport v Auchinleck and Pollok v Camelon.

<u>Drew Cochrane</u>: Yes, I think Auchinleck are going to be very happy about that. I feel, and I think Dennis Gray would agree, that although Tayport tend to reach the latter stages of this tournament, when you put a team like Tayport up against an Ayrshire or indeed a Central League, side II always feel that our west coast teams, I don't know, they are a bit stronger, they are a bit more attuned to cup tie football and I think Talbot now have a wonderful chance of being in the cup final.

Ian: Now Drew you watched Pollok beat Arthurlie 1-0 this afternoon, Darren Stewart a penalty, Pollok have got the cup holders Camelon. Overall what did you think of the game this afternoon?

Obviously great disappointment up at Abbey Park this afternoon. It could in fact be their final Scottish Cup tie up at Abbey Park. Hugh Drennan: Well I would fancy a Talbot v Camelon final, that's my verdict. I think Talbot will be too strong for Tayport, although I have not seen Tayport this season, but I agree with Drew that the Ayrshire teams are the strongest in Scotland. And I think it's been said before that, if you are going to be fighting in the trenches, I would rather be with the Talbot supporters and the Talbot team than with Tayport in the semi, and they'll be in the trenches in the semi final.
