FROM THE ARCHIVES 25 YEARS AGO -APRIL 1971

Season 1970/71 wasn't a vintage year for Tayport Amateurs although the team did finish 6th in the Midlands 1st Division, their highest placing since 1953.

In cup-ties, the Scottish Cup run lasted one game - a $1_{ec}2$ defeat at St Monance Swallows - and the Fife Amateur Cup run wasn't much better. After a 6-1 win at Springfield in the first round, Tayport crashed by the same score on the East Common against Leven Hibs in Round 2.

With early dismissals from the Gray and Bremner competitions, the league season finished early, indeed the team played only one match in the entire month of April - on the 3rd away to Lawside FP in the League.

The team that day - and it wasn't the strongest ever fielded! - was Derek White; Ian Mathers and Alan Davie; Eddie Stewart, Freddie Janssen and Maurice Flynn; Abby Oswald, Jimmy Lindsay, Ronnie Redpath, Ian Paterson and Dougie Henderson. Substitute was Stan Cowe.

All these lads are still knocking about these parts. Mathers, Flynn, Redpath and Henderson attend most of the Juniors' games while Oswald and Stewart are office bearers. White and Paterson are now resident in Newport, Janssen in Dundee, Lindsay in St Andrews and Davie is a Chief Inspector with Tayside Police. For those who doubted that Jimmy Lindsay ever played football - this is the proof that not only did he play but he turned out for the first team! Is it the same Jim Lindsay that phoned Radio Tay last Sunday morning and put the DJ right about the OVD semi-final score?

Stan Cowe features in other sports these days. Not only is he a keen member of Scotscraig &C but Me's one of the leading Ten Pin Bowlers in the area, regularly topping the league table which appears each week in the Tele. Stan's other claim to fame is that he was the first ever paying customer for a Tayport Juniors match - v Forfar Albion in August 1990. Not a lot of people know that!

The club committee meeting held 25 years ago in April 1971 was held at 10.30 am on Sunday morning in the club's hut on the Promenade. The only five members in attendance were Ron Redpath, Freddie Bremner, Andy Boitz, Davie Hughes and Abby Oswald. Nothing earth shattering ever seemed to be discussed in those days.


It was decided to buy some crockery for the forthcoming coffee morning which was to be held in the Town Hall the following month (a check of the following month's minute showed that it had raised £51 - a fortune in those days). It was also decided to have a Summer Prize Draw. 6,000 tickets were to be printed and priced at 1½ p. in books of four. Prizes were to be £10, £5, £3 and £2.
