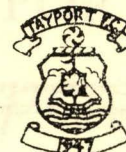

TODAY'S VISITORS CARNOUSTIE PANMURE

Carnoustie Panmure pay their first visit to The Canniepairt this season - but not their last. We've still two league matches to fit in yet against The Gowfers.

Over the past three or four seasons Panmure have probably had more false dawns than any other Tayside club. Since being promoted as champions in 1992, there's no questioning the ability of many of the players in the Newfield Park squad but the team's inconsistencies during this period have meant that they've finished no better in the league than midtable. They've fared no better in cup football although last season's Intersport success is perhaps a taste of things to come.

Certainly, on their day, Panmure are more than a match for the best and only last week inflicted upon Downfield the Spiders heaviest defeat for many a day. Indeed the Gowfers have the distinction of being the only team to date to put more than four goals in a Tayport net - a 2-5 defeat in a Cream of the Barley tie here on the Canniepairt a couple of years ago.

In an effort to find the elusive consistency for which he seeks, club president D.J. Laing replaced manager Mark Bennett with Lex Richardson. Lex has gathered around him an experienced pool of players, several of whom have made their mark at Senior level. As well as Lex himself, defenders Stewart Forsyth and Jim Smith wore the dark blue of Dundee. Veteran Danny Powell, Mark Kelly and Gary Christie were with Montrose. Gary, of course was with Tayport for a short spell during our first season in the Juniors. Bobby Skelligan, signed from St Josephs, was with East Fife.

Young midfield player Graeme Lundberg was snapped up from Forfar Athletic and full back Roddy Black is farmed out from Brechin City. Keeper Brian Anderson was at Tayport for a few months a couple of years ago and like midfielder Peter Irvine, signed for Carnoustie from North End.

Scoring goals has never been a problem for Carnoustie and already this season they have three players who have hit the twenty goal mark - Mark Kelly, Bobby Skelligan and Danny Powell. Add Marc Hutton and Brian Craik with ten goals apiece, then its apparent that our visitors today carry a potent goal threat.

SNIFFING ABOUT WITH *THE SNOOT*

IF Tayport beat Luncarty in the Whyte & Mackay Cup 2nd Round a week today, then they'll meet either Bankfoot or Kirrie Thistle in the quarter final at Tayport on a date yet to be decided. The other three ties are Lochee United v Carnoustie; Violet 'or St Josephs v Jeanfield Swifts and Harp or Blairgowrie v North End. After today, Tayport have a minimum of 11 games and a maximum of 16 games to play before the 14th of June.

CAMELON striker David Flynn, the top scorer in the OVD Cup with 11 goals, has topped the *Edinburgh Evening News* Poll to find the *Most Admired Player* in the East Region. As well as Flynn, Camelon also had Christie McKenzie and Sean Bonnar in the Region's *Dream Team*. OUR best wishes go to Tayport Thistle Boys FC who contest the Sunday Boys' Under 12's S. Angus Cup v. Tayside Boys at Fairfield Park tomorrow. If the boys do as well as the last Tayport to play at Fairfield Park, then they will be bringing the cup back across the Tay.

TAYPORT FC's Committee went down by 15 points to 14 in the annual darts, dominoes and pool challenge against the Rotary Club of North Fife at the pavilion last night.

LEGENDARY former Auchinleck manager Willie Knox has resigned as manager of Irvine Meadow. Knox left Meadow looking for their eighth manager in as many years after reportedly refusing to be pushed sideways into a scouting and spying role.

SCOTT & FYFE's name will be prominent at the OVD Cup Final on 12th May - and justly so, being the club's main sponsors. The Tayport based industrial textile manufacturers, the mainstay of the town's economy, is truly a phoenix from the flames. Exactly 40 years ago on Cup Final day, 12 May 1956, the firm's Scotsraig Works was destroyed by the biggest fire in the town's history. The 'windbreak', which surrounds the caravan site on the East Common, was constructed of demolition material following the fire. Will May 12 1996 see the Scott & Fyfe name blaze its way into the headlines again forty years on?

CUP Final week will also be a big week for the club's amateur side. On the previous Tuesday Tayport meet Riverside Athletic in the semi final of the North of Tay Cup. By which time, of course, Riverside could have a date at Hampden. Next Tuesday evening at Tannadice, Athletic meet Bannockburn in the semi final of the Scottish Amateur Cup.

ALTERATIONS CONTINUE AT THE CANNIEPAIRT

We apologise again this week for the upheaval at the Canniepairt. Work is currently underway to construct a new enclosure and to provide a permanent barrier and handstanding all the way round the pitch. Work should be finished in about five weeks.

THIS AFTERNOON'S GAME

This will be the second meeting of the sides at the semi-final stage of the Perthshire Advertiser Cup. The teams previously met in 1993 when we ran out comfortable 4-0 winners at Westfield Park. The goals that day were scored by Andy Sommerville, Dave Reilly, Mark Spalding and Hamish Mackay.

It was the furthest Panmure had progressed in the Tournament at that time but have emulated their semi-final appearance on two occasions since - today and in 1994 when they went down 5-3 to St Josephs.

Tayport won the cup in 1991, beating Jeanfield Swifts to record their first ever Tayside Juniors success, and were beaten finalists in 1993 when North End won by the only goal of the game.

Winner of today's game goes in against the winners of the North End v Forfar Albion tie at McDiarmid Park, Perth next Wednesday, May 1st.

With Tayport having hit 16 goals in their last three matches and Carnoustie also amongst the goals - five in their last outing against Downfield - the fans should get their money's worth.

The recent signing of experienced centre half Jim Smith from Lochee United has stiffened a porous Panmure defence. The goal threat will come from a number of sources including Bobby Skelligan who had a purple patch earlier this year and whose goal last week against Downfield was described by a Gowfers regular as the best goal seen at Westfield this season.

No Tayport fan has been able to predict Dave Baikie's line-up in recent games. The Tayport boss's shuffling of the pack hasn't affected the team's performances, however, and there are certain to be changes again today from the side which ran out at Scone on Wednesday.

Ewan Cameron, scorer of two goals at Scone, is cup-tied but Hamish Mackay, unavailable on Wednesday, is back in contention. Steven Stewart, out through illness since the OVD Semi, returned as substitute on Wednesday. Alan Ramsay, no doubt itching to taste some action against his former club, Stephen Ross, Grant Miller and Paul Reilly could all feature today after being rested at Scone. All told, five of the OVD Cup Semi-final line-up were missing from Wednesday's XI.

Today's game will be refereed by Mike McGregor, a Trading Standards Officer with Dundee City Council's ECPD. Mike was a linesman at the OVD Cup Semi-Final between Pollok and Camelon at Love Street.

If the tie is level after 90 minutes play then there will be 30 minutes extra time and then, if necessary, a penalty shoot-out to determine which team goes to Perth on Wednesday.

THE BAKER'S BIT

Once again it's turned out to be a very good week for our club with two resounding victories over Montrose Roselea and Scone Thistle and all our nearest rivals dropping points which gives us a lot more leeway in the race for the title.

You're probably all aware that in recent games we have been making a number of personnel changes. I feel that, at this stage of the season, it's important to rest as many players as possible.

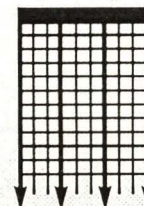

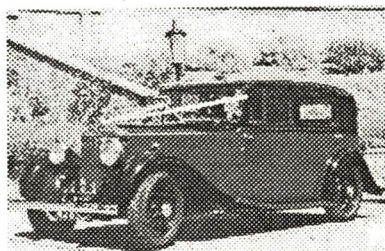

Quite remarkable

Goals from the sublime to the ridiculous

Clive Allen (Crystal Palace) v Coventry, September 6, 1980

Clive Allen smacks the ball into the Coventry net so hard that it hits the stanchion at the back of the goal and rebounds out. "No goal," says the referee, despite the fact that the net is visibly quivering. So, too, is the distraught Clive's bottom lip.

Tommy Youlden (Reading) v Rochdale, August 16, 1975

In the opening game of the season, Reading centre-half Tommy Youlden fires a shot wide. As the players line up for the resulting goal-kick, Mr Walter Harvey of Redditch refereeing his first league game, mysteriously awards a goal. Despite vociferous protests, the strike stands. Five years later, Clive Allen tries to tempt Mr Harvey out of retirement.

Gary Sprake (Leeds) v Liverpool, December 9, 1967

"The most astounding goal ever seen at Anfield," was how *The Sun* described Gary Sprake's almighty clanger. The Leeds keeper attempts to throw the ball 'discus style' to Terry Cooper, decides against it, pulls it back into the safety of his shoulder only, impelled by some unseen force, to inexplicably hurl the thing into his own net. "He couldn't do that again if he played for another 50 years," says manager Don Revie, gravely underestimating Sprake's ability to shoot himself in the foot.

Peter Schmeichel (Man Utd) v Rotor Volgograd, September 26, 1995

In a UEFA Cup tie at Old Trafford, the United keeper lumbers upfield for a last gasp corner. Resisting the overwhelming urge to flap at the cross, the surly green giant rises to nonchalantly head in an equaliser.

Damian Mori (Adelaide City) v Sydney United, December 6, 1995

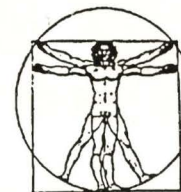
In this Australian National League match, Adelaide striker and Aussie international Damian Mori sends a long-distance lob soaring over the keeper. Bizarre? Well only that this was 3.69 seconds into the game – and the fastest goal in history. Making San Marino's first-minute effort against England look distinctly tardy.

George Best (Northern Ireland) v England, May 15, 1971

England keeper Gordon Banks attempts to kick the ball upfield despite the close attentions of George Best. As he releases the ball from his hands, Bestie raises a foot, flicks it off his toe and taps it into the empty net. Sadly the ref disallows it as the cheeky effort directly contravenes some obscure rule concerning the ritual humiliation of English goalkeeping legends.

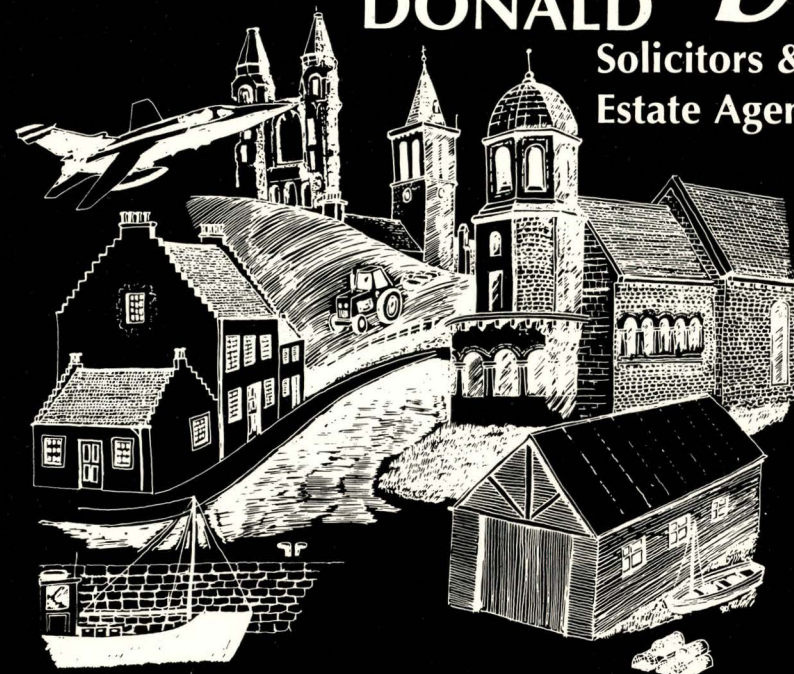
