



TONIGHT'S MATCH

Tonight's league game against runners-up Downfield will be our 53rd competitive game of the season – more than any other Junior club in the country certainly, and more too than most, if not all, our Senior clubs. It's asking a lot of the players to turn on the style 53 games on and the fans to turn out when folk's minds are more tuned in to Euro '96 , summer holidays and the like.

For Downfield, tonight is the end of an era . After illustrious careers with the Spiders, the club's management team, the Grier brothers, Willie & George, have handed in their notice. This is their last game in charge. What the future holds, only George and Willie know. But if they are to stay in the game, then there is unlikely to be a shortage of offers.

The Grier brothers have played a big part in raising the profile of the Tayside Junior game and, whatever they may decide, everybody at Tayport wishes them the very best of luck.

Until Tayport came along at the turn of the decade, the Spiders were Tayside's leading lights but to a certain extent since then, they've had to play second fiddle. Three times in five seasons Downfield have been runners-up in the championship.

One thing is certain. Downfield will be out to get a result tonight. As well as being the swan song for Willie & George, it'll likely be the last game in a Spiders' jersey for several of their players. Kenny Jones, for example, has been placed on the transfer list.

Since our Scottish Cup success our form has been up and down. There have been some excellent performances and some pretty mediocre ones. Only to be expected, of course, but let's hope that we can finish what has been a magnificent campaign with a display to match. The tactically astute Griers will have other ideas, however, so we could be in for an intriguing match.

'Who's this Hamish?' was the cry when the Evening Telegraph printed a less than complimentary letter about Tayport FC and the club's achievements. There were several replies published which ripped into Hamish and then there was a further letter, this time from 'Hamish's wee brother' which was in a similar vein to the original. Hamish seems to have a chip on his shoulder about the fact that Tayport, a Fife based club, play – and clean up – in the Tayside League. Is there a clue from this piece which appeared in the match programme of another Tayside club earlier this season? ".....maybe this is the start of a campaign to get Tayport into their local Fife league and out of the Tayside Leagues!!??..."

Unfortunately tonight I desperately want them to go out on a losing note and, if our players can produce the form of last weekend, then I'm confident we can achieve a victory.
