SNIFFING ABOUT WITH THE SNOUT

TAYPORT met OVD Scottish Cup opponents Banchory St Ternan as recently as last August at Milton Park, Crathes when we won by 5-0 in a pre-season friendly The sides were scheduled to play a return game here at the Canniepairt this August but an early start to their league season meant that Banchory had to call off.

THE Courier and Evening Tele were at their parochial best this week when they published only the local ties in the OVD Cup. Lack of space can't be an excuse. The Daily Mail, for example, managed to get the entire draw into less space than the Tele used for their coverage of local ties. The Sports Desk surely can't imagine that the Junior punters on Tayside and Fife are interested in only their own ties!

WHAT an unlucky debut Allan Ramsay had for the club last Saturday. Negotiations which opened in midsummer finally bore fruit last Friday evening and Allan put pen to paper for Tayport Not that Allan was the stumbling block. His club ,Carnoustie Panmure,weren't giving him up readily but, in face of opposition from St Joseph's and Lochee United, the transfer finally went through. A clash of heads only 25 minutes into his debut against Harp saw Allan carried off to hospital. Fortunately, he wasn't detained and managed the trip to Pollok on Sunday.

THERE was one lucky winner of the Club's $SUPER\ SIX$ jackpot last weekend. Linda Fox from Dunkeld Plae in Dundee scooped the pool and, as a result, is £1,200 richer.

THE OVD Cup draw didn't throw up many first round crackers. One which does catch the eye, however, is the meeting of Maryhill and Pollok who finished 4th and 1st respectively in last season's Reebok Central League Premier Division. It was also announced that OVD are to sponsor the tournament for a further three years to the tune of £175,000.

WHAT'S happened to the Junior League tables in the Sporting Post? Coverage in The Post has definately improved in recent times but they've let themselves down again by not including the league tables. One would think that, with the competition from Teletext in respect of the results on a Saturday night (page 177 on Grampian, by the way), The Sporting Post would be anxious to provide something which the TV doesn't.

AMALGAMATION surely has got to come between the Fife and Tayside Leagues. Some farcical scorelines this season in the Fife League, which has only one division, has exposed the gulf which exists between the likes of Hill O' Beath and St Andrews United at the top and the bottom clubs. Steelend Vics have been losing games by something like 8 or 9 goals every week while the other week St Andrews put 11 past Lochore. A combined League of, say, three divisions of perhaps, 12, 14 and 15 teams would allow the clubs in each Association an opportunity of finding their own level.

THANKS to the generosity of a local businessman, the club is set to receive a new league championship flag. Watch this space.

THIS AFTERNOON'S VISITORS ST IOSEPH'S

St Joseph's, arch rivals in the quest for local and national honours, pay their first visit of the season to the Canniepairt. A quick glance at their pool of players listed for today's game (the actual teams will be announced on the p.a. system prior to the kick-off) reveals that a number are very familiar with the Canniepairt faithful. None moreso than new manager Willie Brown. Willie, fulltime at St Joseph's, is the latest of a long line in the Fairfield Park hot seat to be charged with the task of bringing success to the club. The Canniepairt and Tayport Amateurs, was the launch pad for Willie's lengthy and chequered Senior career.

Assistant to Willie is Andy Sommerville. No introductions required here either. Andy moved from the Canniepairt in the close season after helping us collect numerous honours in his 4½ years here. Although billed as assistant manager, Andy has featured in several of Joey's games this season, mainly coming on as susbstitute, and has already found the road to goal on three occasions. It will be interesting to see if Andy selects himself today.

Jackie Devine, like Andy, moved to Joey's in the close season and will be long remembered here for some spectacular performances during his four seasons here. Last season wasn't one of his best, being plagued by injury, but despite being in his 34th year has, according to reports, been in good form of late. Rumour has it that he might miss today's game through holidays.

There have been three other close season signings. Eddie McAuley, the experienced defender signed from North End and there were two recruits from the amateur ranks, young fullback Steven Gibson, who was pulled off at half-time last week, and striker Greg McGill who has already got a foursome to his credit this season, albeit against Luncarty.

Other ex-Tayport men in the visitors' squad are Gus Malone (with the Amateurs prior to going Senior), Grant Cushnie, Gary Lamont and Andy Heggie. Gary , for whom the Port Support have always held a soft spot, hasn't been a regular and Heggie is out of favour and been put on the transfer list. Young defender Paul Bruce stays in Tayport and he is another who is familiar with dugout benches.

Recently injured and doubtful for today is former Scotland youth cap Jimmy Byrne a major signing from Forfar Athletic. Elsewhere the Saints' pool is packed out with experience. Keeper Steve O'Hanlon (Cowdenbeath), Charlie Adam (Arbroath, Forfar, Dundee Utd), Gary Ogilvie(Dundee, Sunderland, Airdrie), John Young(Elgin City), Hugh McLaughlin (Elgin City), Gordon Lees (Brechin City & Forfar Ath.), Scott Kopel(Forfar Ath.) and reserve 'keeper Brian Brown (Aberdeen) have all plied their trade in the Senior game. Brown, you may recall, played for us on one occasion last season.

'FORGET THE REST GET THE BEST'

FROM THE ARCHIVES 25 YEARS AGO - SEPTEMBER 1970

On SATURDAY 26th SEPTEMBER 1970 Tayport Amateurs came out on top in a nine goal thriller against Invergowrie in a Midlands Division One match on the East Common. The team that afternoon was DEREK WHITE; FRANK LESLIE, IAN PATERSON; RONNIE LAING, JIM MATHERS, IAN WHITE; GEORGE RITCHIE, DOUG HENDERSON, TONY BLOOMQUEST, LYNN KINNEAR, EDDIE GILMOUR. SUB. was ALEX KENNETH. George Ritchie hit a hat-trick with Tony Bloomquest getting the other two. Ritchie and Henderson are regulars at the Canniepairt while Eddie Gilmour is new signing Allan Ramsay's boss at UK Plant in Dundee.

The 'Stiffs' (The Alliance X1) were still looking for their first Alliance Div. One points of the season and they went down 1-5 at Timex. There are a few familiar faces in that line-up. The records show that 'Newman' was in goal which suggests that he was a ringer! The rest of the team was WALTER KEMP, RONNIE REDPATH; EDDIE STEWART, GRAEME WELSH, IAN MACKIE; DAVIE AYRE, ABBY OSWALD, CLARKE MITCHELL, JIMMY LINDSAY & GEORGE BRYSON. SUB. was KENNY GORHAM. (what a motley crew! - Ed.) The entire line-up except George Bryson still live locally.

In the Juniors, DOWNFIELD were second top of the first division and had just recorded a 5-2 win at ALYTH with goals from Buchanan (3) and Innes(2). ST JOSEPHS had made a good start in division two with three wins out of three. Their regular line-up 25 years ago this month was Fitchet; Grieve, Urquhart; McDonald, Kennedy, Meldrum; Steven, McKenzie, Muirhead, Gall & McCafferty. Also in contention for places were Lawson & Brewer.

In Senior Football Cowdenbeath, would you believe, were hob-nobbing with Rangers and Celtic in Division One.

Down at SCOTSCRAIG G.C. Ronnie Beatt, playing off scratch, went round in 74 in the Monthly Medal while the leading handicap score was Len Whalley with 65 off 16.

Emerson, Lake & Palmer were coming shortly to the Caird Hall (tickets 10/- and 17/-) and Freda Payne was midway through a 6 week run at the top of the charts with 'Band of Gold'. Radio One had Tony Blackburn at 7am, Johnny Walker at 9am and Jimmy Young at 10am. On TV, Z Cars was peak evening viewing on BBC1 while Grampian showed 'Magpie' at 5.15 then 'Crossroads' followed the News at 6.35pm.

A new Mini 1000 would have cost you £702 while a brand new 'H' Reg. Ford Escort came in at £817.13/8d. A Hoover De Luxe washing machine was £86 and you could rent a TV for 8/6d per week.

On the local scene a Miss P.Kirk of St Andrews married a Mr J.Cooper of Tayport this week but the big happening in the town in September 1970 was the 'POLEX 70 Exercise' when Tayport was virtually taken over by the Army for a giant exercise. The tanker 'Green Rover' was moored in the river to pump 2,000 tons of fuel ashore for the exercise. This huge influx of army personnel to Tayport meant an unprecedented boom for the town. Pubs were rocking, shops were raking it in and the Amateurs managed to recruit a few 'guests'. Some of the Army lads were up to no good however. Lance Cpl. Raymond McAuley, who gave his address as 'Royal Engineers, Tayport Camp' was fined £20 for breach of the peace at the United v Rangers game at Tannadice!

Dave Reilly headed the only goal of the first half in 43 minutes and, after a reshuffle caused by a face injury to new signing Ramsay, 'Port added further counters after the break through Reilly and Hamish Mackay, with Miller supplying the crosses for both goals."
- The Sunday Post (24/9/95) Tayport 3 Lochee Harp 0.
- " In the first division's match of the day, Lochee United and St Joseph's drew 1-1 at Thomson Park. A share of the points would not please either club as they bid to end Tayport's monopoly of the championship. "
- The Courier (25/9/95)
- In the top league game Lochee United and St Joseph's shared the points at Thomson Park.....it was never a game for the purist, with bookings galore, but it did make for end to end excitement "
- Evening Telegraph (27/9/95) Lochee United 1 St Joseph's 1.
- " Lethal weapon David Flynn will turn full circle next month, after a 12 goal OVD Cup scoring spree which has made him the most feared striker in Scotland. The Camelon hitman began his love affair with the Scottish Cup when he scored for Linlithgow Rose against Glasgow Perthshire two years ago. Now, after firing Camelon to glory last year and picking up the competition's top scorer prize- Flynn is to face Perthshire again.
- Glasgow Evening Times reporting the fact that OVD holders Camelon have been drawn at home to Perthshire in their first tie in defence of the Scottish Cup.


