

TODAY S GAME

This afternoon's tie will be our 33rd Scottish tie since joining the Junior Association in 1990 and it's a competition which has brought fame and glory to the town and the club. There's definately something about the Scottish Cup which brings a buzz to the place.

Whilst we consider ourselves but sproggers in the 100 odd year history of Junior Football, our opponents today are, by comparison, mere infants. This will be St Ternan's third venture into the OVD Cup and their furthest trip south.

In 1993 a 4-2 home win over Crombie was followed by a 2-2 draw at Montrose before losing by the only goal in the replay. Last season a 1-1 draw at home to Lossiemouth was followed by a 1-2 defeat after extra time in the replay away from home.

A glance at Banchory's player pool suggests that manager Bob Scott and his assistant Colin Burnett have brought together a useful pool of players with a blend of youth and experience. The side has travelled well this season, never yet failing to find their opponents' net away from home.

Twelve of their twenty one goals have come from the duo of Shiner Burnett and Jocky Lawrence and it is this pair whom Tayport will have to watch.

Injuries and illness amongst his squad have caused manager Baikie some concern this week and, as a result, there could well be enforced changes in the home line-up. Despite two good wins in the past fortnight Tayport will be under no illusions as to the task before them this afternoon in what should be an entertaining contest.

TAYPORT FC AND BANCHORY - PREVIOUS MEETINGS

There have only been two previous meetings between teams representing the respective communities. as recently as last year, August 1994, we met St Ternan in a pre-season-friendly in Banchory. It was a gloriously (for the spectators) hot afternoon at St Ternan's picturesque Milton Park, Crathes. Banchory were well understrength that Saturday afternoon and Tayport ran out 5-0 winners. Of the five Tayport scorers that day only Dave Reilly is still on the staff. Mike Gray moved to England, Ewan Cameron is at Lochee United and Graeme Irons has retired.

The other occasion was September 1986 when Tayport Amateurs went north to play Banchory Amateurs in the 1st Round of the Scottish Amateur Cup. It was Tayport's first game in the competition since their semi final at Dens Park the previous April. It was a 4-1 win for Tayport that day with goals from Alan Gray (2), Graeme Cox and Alan Digby.

SNIFFING ABOUT WITH THE SNOUT

TAYPORT tennis professional NICOLA PAYNE (18) who is sponsored by Tayport FC recently received a grant of £1,000 from the Scottish Sports Aid Foundation.

KILWINNING Rangers have been sounding out selected clubs with a view to entering a Scottish Super Cup or something along those lines. Kilwinning are sponsoring the competition and putting up the prize money. A meeting is to be organised with the SJFA and invited clubs to progress the matter.

Clubs which have been invited are Ayrshire - Auchinleck Talbot, Irvine Meadow, Cumnock, Kilwinning; Central - Shettleston, Arthurlie, Pollok, Maryhill; Tayside - St Josephs, Lochee United, Downfield, Tayport; Fife - Hill O' Beath, St Andrews; East - Armadale, Camelon.

It's certainly an impressive field. No further details are available at present.

TIEING in nicely with the last item is the news that the Tayside clubs have been sounded out be the SJFA on their thoughts of a National Junior League. The move has been prompted by rumours that the Ayrshire and Central Leagues are considering amalgamation or , at least forming some sort of west coast league. Clubs have been asked to take the issue back to their clubs for further discussion. It is hoped to enlarge on this dramatic development in a future issue.

DOUGIE Pitcaithly organised a whip round amongst the support at Downfield last Saturday and gave the proceeds to Paul Reilly whose leg was broken in two places against St Josephs. In plaster from thigh to waist, Paul will be off work for at least three months. We all wish him a speedy and successful recovery.

NOT many people will know this! On Saturday May 2nd 1987 St Johnstone tied up their second division season at Muirton Park with a 1-1 draw against Raith Rovers to finish 5th in the table. Appearing for Saints that day were three players now connected with the St Josephs team which turned out against us on the Canniepairt last home game - Charlie Adam, Gordon Winter and Willie Brown. Bet they never though that Saints' 16 years old debutant that day would come back to haunt them someday. Well, he did. That debutant for Saints was none other than Gary Maher, scorer of the goal which sunk the Joeys down here two weks ago.

A recent Dundee FC match programme's 'Junior Dark Blues' page featured a factfile on their mascot that day, nine years old Stuart Smith. I bet it raised a few eyebrows when he named his favourite ground as *The Canniepaint*. Stuart's dad is Kenny Smith of the Grampian Hotel, Dundee, a former player here at The Canniepairt and sponsor os Hamish Mackay. That might explain his choice.

MAIN talking point at the Midlands Amateurs monthly meeting last week was the £50 fine slapped on St Josephs Amateurs and the warning of a deduction of six points from their league total if the club committee appeared before the Executive Committee again this season.

THIS AFTERNOON'S VISITORS

Banchory St Ternan are only in their third season in the Junior ranks, having made the step up from the Amateur grade in season 1993/94, and presently play in Division One of the North Region (East Section) Juniors.

The club is a product of the merger of the two local amateur teams, Banchory St Ternan and Banchory Amateurs, which, back in season 1991/92, were both playing in Division One. The two sets of officials eventually decided that the time was right for the clubs to merge that year with a view to applying for Junior status within the next three years. After one further season in the amateurs and the construction of a new pavilion, the new committee decided to make application to the SJFA for membership of the North Region (East Section). That application was successful and the new club's first game in the Junior grade was against Insch on August 8th 1993 (which Banchory won).

Banchory Amateurs, like Tayport Amateurs, was founded in 1947. Banchory Ams. could count a Division One title and a North of Scotland Cup success (1976) amongst their honours. St Ternan were founded in 1974 and, although moving up from division six to division one, never won a title and their most notable achievement was reaching the final of the North of Scotland Cup in 1991, only to lose out on penalty kicks.

The club's tidy ground, Milton Park, is situated almost three miles outside the town of Banchory on the main road to Aberdeen beside a small village called Crathes. The ground is so called as it is set in the grounds of Milton Farm on the Crathes Estate from whom the club rent the land. The facilities at Milton Park are continually being upgraded with the current project being the creation of a second pitch and training area which should be ready for use by the start of next season. Floodlights are also in the forward planning

Banchory St Ternan also run an Under 18 Juvenile side in the Aberdeen & District Juvenile League and there are close ties with Banchory Boys' Club which runs teams from under 10 to under 15 level.



TEN YEARS AGO - OCTOBER 1985

In October 1995 Tayport FC was running three amateur sides. On Saturday 12th October the 1st XI was playing Lawside FP in a Scottish Amateur Cup 1st Round replay on the Canniepairt, the teams having drawn 2-2 at Drumgeith in the first game.

The tie finished 2-2 after extra time with Graeme Cox and Ian Howe scoring for Tayport.

The line-ups that afternoon were: <u>Tayport</u> - Angus. Charity, Ronnie Stewart, Alan Gray, Neil Downie, Alan Paterson, Jimmy Bissett, John Walsh, Kenny Cameron, Graeme Cox, Ian Howe and Bruce Burnett (Stuart Davie).

<u>Lawside FP</u> - Angus Boland, Bobby Dorian, George Jackson, Brian Robbie, Gary Abbott, Alex Williamson, Jimmy Buchan, Willie Webster, Frankie Brown, Jackie Butchart and Eric Murphy. Subswere Sammy Hamilton and Jim Fyffe.

Two weeks previously Tayport had transferred Willie Brown (now Joeys manager) to St Johnstone and Lawside's Dave Reilly (yes, the same DR who will be wearing Tayport's No 10 shirt today) had recently joined Forfar Athletic.

Tayport won 4-1 in the third game and went on to reach the penultimate stage of the competition that season . Kenny Cameron, who was a regular for Tayport that season is the same Cameron that was playing for Downfield against us last Saturday.

The club's 2nd XI played in the East Fife League 10 years ago and on 12th October were losing 1-2 to Eastvale at Coaltown of Balgonie or some of those places.

The line-up was Brian Smith, Doug Henderson, Paul Thackery, Brian Cree, Colin Robertson, Alan Hart, Jimmy Anderson, Kirk Jack, Bryan Fitchet, Andy Heggie, Ian Ness. Subs were Alan Paterson and Stevie Moyes.

Fitchet got the goal. Of that team, most have retired from regular football, although Heggie is on the Joeys transfer list and a couple of others, Fitchet and Robertson, are still playing. Team boss of the Fife XI in those days was present club treasurer and Andy Bell- stand-in Ross Macmillan. Even in those days Ross had more than one job. As well as picking the team, Ross was spongeman and bus driver. Come to think of it, Mr McCauley, this afternoon's referee, probably refereed in the East Fife Amateurs at that time so we'd better not dwell on what else Ross got up to!

The 3rd XI or Alliance XI won 3-1 away to YM Anchorage that afternoon 10 years ago. Goals from John Squire, Lindsay Clark and an own goal did the damage in an Alliance League game.

The line-up was Andy Don, Roddy Davie, Frank Feechan, Andy McRobbie, Bruce McGavin, John Squire, Lindsay Clark, Neil Robertson, Kenny Smith, Roddy McCafferty and Mark Whiteside. Subs were Jimmy Shields and Grant Letham.

Looking at that line-up there are hardly any still playing. Indeed, looking at a couple of the names, I doubt if they could still get into a strip!


