

NEW FACES AT THE CANNIEPAIRT

Tayport brought in four new faces for this season's campaign. Manager Dave Baikie had been tracking the players for some time; aware that he was allowing several trusty servants the opportunity to move to pastures new.

Here are the career details of the newcomers.

BARRIE GRAY. (Winger).

Transferred from St Josephs.

Played with Dundee United S.C. from Under 10's to Under 16's.. Signed for Arbroath and spent four seasons at Gayfield. Moved on to Forfar Athletic and then Brechin City, each for six months, before signing for St Joseph's where he spent one season.

GRANT BUIST (Defender)

Transferred from Broughty Athletic.

Spent schooldays with Fairmuir Boys Club from Under 13's to Under 17's.. Moved on to Ninewells Juveniles then to Logie Harp in the Midlands Amateurs. Stepped up to the Junior ranks with Broughty Athletic where he spent 5 seasons.

ALLAN RAMSAY (Midfield)

Transferred from Carnoustie Panmure.

Dundee S.C. Under 9's - Under 15's, then moving on to Lincraig Under 16's - 18's. Still in under age football, moved to Dundee United SC Under 18's for a season before being snapped up by Forfar Athletic where he spent 3 years. From Station Park, Allan moved on to Carnoustie Panmure where he had a further 3 years.

STEPHEN ROSS (Forward)

Transferred from Dundee North End.

Played with Vale of Tay Under 10's, then emigrated to Toronto, Canada before returning to these shores to play with St James Under 18's. Moved on to Kirrie Thistle but hopped off abroad again, this time to New Zealand for seven months to play semi professional with Telecom Southland. Back to Kirrie then off again to Canada where he turned out in the colours of Emerald FC. Home again in 1991 to play with Broughty Athletic from 1991 to 1993 before moving across the city for a season with Dundee North End.

THIS AFTERNOON'S VISITORS SCONE THISTLE

Although originally formed as long ago as 1882, Scone Thistle, our visitors this afternoon, are fairly recent additions to the Tayside Junior FA, previously playing in the Perthshire Juvenile League. Until this season, 'the Jaggy Nettles' had never sampled First Division football.

All that was to change, however, when they won the Division Two title last season, by three points from Forfar Albion. Prior to the start of the season Scone met us here on the Canniepairt in the Albert Herschell Trophy, the annual charity competition between the respective Division champions. Tayport won 5-0 that evening and a tough term looked in prospect for Dutch boss Tom

Van Der Ham. 'It'll be all right on the night' might have been Tom's thoughts because they opened their league campaign with a 2-2 draw with Arbroath SC and shook the Joeys by holding them to the same score at Fairfield four days later. A draw at Montrose and a crushing 4-1 win over Kinnoull and Scone had served notice that they had arrived - even getting a headline in The Courier!

A heavy home defeat (0-4) from Downfield followed and, although Thistle have failed to add to their solitary win over Kinnoull, they have recorded a couple of creditable draws in the interim, at Broughty and at home to Carnoustie. Last week it took a last minute penalty at Thomson Park to deprive them of a point.

Although last season's ace marksman Rab Nicoll has resolved his differences with the club , don't look for too much attacking flair from Scone today. They will be happy to return west with a share of the points , always hoping of course to catch Tayport on the counterattack.

Keeper Neil Ferguson , with experience at all the Perth Junior clubs, is a sound last line of defence. Gavin Buist has also been with most of the Perth clubs and has turned out here for Jeanfield. Most of the Scone squad have done the rounds of the Perthshire Junior clubs and experienced defender Russell Cosgrove is no exception. Midfielder Andy Gordon is team skipper and hit one of the goals which caused the upset at Joeys. Dean Laing, another versatile type who was with Kinnoull and had Senior experience with Arbroath.

Ian Cameron is in his second season at Scone and normally turns out at right back. Knows the road to goal however, notching the team's pointwinning goal at Montrose earlier this season. Ex-Kinnoull Gary Christie is an attacking midfielder with an influential role in the side. The acquisition of striker Jimmy Fotheringham from Carnoustie saw Scone push the boat out as far as transfers are concerned and his Senior experience with Montrose and Arbroath is a decided asset. Alan Keddie is in his second spell at Scone having sampled soccer Australian style in the interim. Steven Wilson, a winger signed this season from Aerodrome Amateurs, known to his teammates as 'Speedy'. Frank Fair is another in his first season with the club having signed from under age football. Striker Gerry Donnelly has been with Scone for four seasons. Previously tasted Fife Junior football with Newburgh. Jimmy Fenton, a striker who has had his fair share of goals in the Juniors, many of which were for Jeanfield Swifts. Ian Flaherty is now in his third season at Scone and is normally given a man marking role in midfield.







BERT COLVILLE


