





THE BAKER'S BIT

Elmwood provide our Centenary Cup opposition this afternoon, so I'd like to take this opportunity to welcome their players and officials to the Canniepairt.

Last weekend saw us pick up another two valuable points at home to Scone Thistle. I must admit to being a little bit wary going into the game with us having a number of players unavailable through injury and suspension. Last Saturday morning there was a time when I was about to send out an 'all points bulletin' to start the search for a pair of boots with 'DB' on the back. However I thought better of it and phoned Mel Irons instead.

On Tuesday past, all five of our Tayside Select players did the club proud. I thought everyone played well in the 1-0 victory over the East Region at Perth.
